b. Intelligence:

- (1) Primary so roes of intelligence information for Hqs Battery during the reporting period was the G-2 Section, XXIV Corps artillery. Batteries A, B and G/65 received intelligence information from the S-2 Section, 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mechanized). Battery C received intelligence information from the S-2 Section, 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mechanized) and the G-2 Section, Americal Division. Battery D received intelligence information from the G-2 Section, 101st Airborne Division (Airmobile). Battery G, 29th Artillery received intelligence information from the S-2 Section, 11th USMC Regiment, 1st USMC Division. Supplementary information was received from XXIV Corps in the form of intelligence summaries and periodic intelligence information and estimates from field commanders of supported units.
- (2) Temperatures during the reporting period ranged from a low of 73° to a high of 105°. Winds were mild during the period, averaging 3 knots, but gusting up to 30 knots at times.
 - (3) Enemy activity:
 - (a) Mining incidents remained high turing the reporting period.
- (b) Stand off attacks with rockets and mortars remained high curing the reporting period, peaking in mid to late July when stand off fire attacks forced the closing of FSE Ripcord.
 - (c) knowy ground activity remained light through the reporting period.
 - c. Operations:
- (1) General: The mission of the 1st Bn (AW) (SP) 44th Arty and Dattery G, 55th Arty, continues to be general support of XXIV Corps. Eattery G, 25th Arty continues the mission of providing battlefield illumination to XXIV Corps.

(3) Significant Events:

⁽a) On 6 May 1970 at 0100 hours, B-1 came under ground attack and at 0140 hours, A-1 reported NVA outside their perimeter. Dusters at A-1 fired a total of 1300 rounds. Advisors at B-1 sent out a recon patrol which made a sweep of the area and reported 14 NVA KIA; 1 ARVN KIA and 5 ARVN WIA; 8 AK-47's and 2 B-40 rockets confiscated.

- (b) On 7 May 1970, the 3rd Flatoon, G Battery (SET) 29th Artillery was detached from the 23rd Infantry Division (Americal) and returned to the control of G Battery (SET) 29th Artillery.
- (c) On 3 May 1970 at 0645 hours, a minesweep from i-4 to C-2 discovered 14 M-50 antitank mines in grid Yu131579. The mines, which were found in the middle of the road, were blown in place. Also, 2 booby-trapped mines were found 500 meters north of C-2 bridge in grid YD135655.
- (d) On 9 May 1970, the 2,000,000 40mm Duster round was fired by the 1st Battalion (AW) (SP) 44th Artillery.
- (e) On 17 Lay 1970 at 0610 hours, Dusters located at A-4 fired 25 rounds at a visually spotted light. The light was extanguished.
- (f) On 17 May 1970, the 1st Battalion (AN) (SP) 44th Artillery held a change of command deromony at Dong Ha Combat Base. LTC Michael S. SLIKIS took command of the battalion replacing LTC Richard L. INTES.
- (g) During the period 10-20 May 1970, Readquarters and Readquarters Battery relocated from Dong Ha Combat Base to Red Beach Da Nang.
- (h) On 20 May 1970, the 1st Battalion (all) (Si) 44th artilleny and attached units were detached from 108th Artilleny aroup and attached at to all Corps artilleny.
- (i) On 22 May 1770, a radar detector movement near Strong Point C-1. Dusters fired 70 rounds. Movement ceased.
- (j) On 1 June 1970 at 1935 hours, Dusters at a-1 fired 44 rounds in support of B-1 which was receiving small arms fire from grid YD200753.

 Small arms fire ceased.
- (k) On 6 June 1970 at 2045 hours, personnel located at FSB An Do (T-Bone) spotted movement heading toward LZ Sally. The Dusters located at An Do fired 240 rounds. Negative surveillance.
- (1) On 10 June 1970 at 1930 hours, A-1 received sniper fire from grid YD274750. Dusters at A-1 fired 40 rounds and sniper fire ceased.
- (m) On 11 June 1970 at 2034 hours, personnel at A-1 spotted 10 VC/NVA about 1000 meters to the northwest. A-1 Dusters fired 50 rounds with negative surveillance. At 2040 hours, personnel at A-2 spotted personnel in approximately the same area. Dusters from A-2 fired 50 rounds with negative surveillance.
- (n) On 18 June 1970 at 2000 hours, personnel at FSB Anzio reported 3 VC moving north. Dusters from FSB Anzio fired 108 rounds. Negative Surveillance. At 2100 hours, movement was again spotted to the northeast. The Dusters fired 100 rounds with negative surveillance.
- (o) On 25 June 1970 at 2050 hours, personnel at A-2 spotted an NVA company approximately 4000 meters to the northeast. Dusters fired 250 rounds at the target. No surveillance was performed on the mission.

- (p) On 28 June 1970 at 0100 hours, personnel at 150 Bastogne spotted the movement of 5 or 6 individuals to the northwest. The Dusters fired 80 rounds of the unknown results.
- (q) On 1 July 1970 at 0745 hours, G/65 reported that Ripcord was receiving APG's and mortars are was under ground attack. At 0945 hours, G/65 reported dipcord still receiving periodic small arms fire and mortar rounds. At 1033 hours, G/65 reported action at Ripcord had ceased. The Quad 50 counterfired with 4000 rounds. There were negative casual lies; however, the antenna of a PRC-77 was hit by chrapmel.
- (r) On 3 July 1970 at 2230 hours, the 7th ARVN Meet made contact with a plateon-size force of MVA sappers between B-1 and A-1, moving toward A-1. The Quad 50 at A-1 fired 10,000 roungs. Adealts of that action were 9 RVA KTA; 1 NVA PON; 5 AK-50's, 4 B-40 rockets, 17 hard remained at 50 pounds of C4 captured. At 2315 hours, an undetermined at the A-1. VA were spotted between B-1 and A-1. The Quad 50 fired dnother 10,000 rounds. Adealts of that action were 5 AVA KTA confirmed.
- (s) On 7 July 1970 at 2030 nours, the Quad 50 at appeard received small arms fire, mortar rounds and did fire. Two WIA from G/S5 were reported.
- (t) On 9 July 1970 at 1445 hours, two Basts toployed from the Loc Special forces Camp as a part of the C Stry red played.
- (n) On 13 July 1970, the minesweep security massice between Don, Ha about Point C-1 was terminated as a part of the clatry redeployment.
- (v) In 14 July 1970 at 1320 hours, a quad 50 section from 6/65 Leated at alpeore was responsible for 2 confirmed chemy KIA's.
- (a) On 16 July 1970 at 1015 hours, A may assum a spondiality for the AM support at Khe Gio Bridge, but Kinner. Casp Graph fire C stry. At 1015 hours, 2 Dusters at Cam to Bridge were withdrawn. There actions were conducted in connection with the redeployment of C stary to the Church area.
- (x) On 17 July 1970, 2 motors from C Bitay war do noted to LZ fion the in apport of the 2nd A.V. Division.
- (y) on 19 J dy 1970 at 0730 hours, C Bory's 1st condon departed dong ha Combat Base. The which vehicles traviled by read to Chu Lai, closing at 1915 hours. Tracted vehicles were briten to the ESS does at Tam my near map here they were leaded on ESS send transported to the Lei, arriving on 23 J by 1970. Paster crows were transported to Phu Bai from where they were flown to Chu Lai.
- (z) On 19 July 1970 at 1915 hours, 1 VC was spote and mill 55. Duster fired 250 rounds with 1 casesy KIA confirmed.
- (aa) On 19 July 1970 at 2340 hours, an unsater in a number of VC were described near Fire 3 so Berbare. Desters fired 532 rounds with Confirmed.

- (bb) On 23 July 1970, a quad 50 machine gun section fir d 40,000 rounds in support of the closing of Ripcord, prior to its removal.
- (cc) On 27 July 1970, 2 Dusters from C Bury deployed to Fire Base Nui Ong in support of the 2nd ARVN Division.
- (dd) On 29 July 1970, 2 Dusters from C Btry deployed to FSD Dragon in support of the 2nd ARVN Division.
- (ee) During the reporting period, elements of this bettaline supported 29 convoy security missions and 172 minesyang operations.
- (ff) During the reporting period, elements of this battalien withstood 123 stand off rocket and/or mortar attacks with a total of 1639+ energy rounds received. The size and number of rounds are as follows: 50mm mortar = 59+; 52mm mortar = 449; 122mm rockets = 160; 140mm rockets = 54, 144+ umborn size mortars and 153 unknown size rockets.
- (gg) During the reporting pariod, Dustar elements of this battalion responded to a total of 26 rader or sensor targets with a total of 3,759 rounds expended. Surveillance was not conducted on those targets.
- (hh) Daster 40mm annumition was allocated to battalion for the first time. Starting on 25 July 1970, the first allocation was for 49, 379 rounds.
- (ii) The searchlight battery continued to perform its mission of perimeter defense for guarding fire support bases, logistics outposts, bridges, roads and other key installations. However, the use of the searchlight has been increased and emphasis shifted from defensive to a more active or offensive role. With the development of SCAMS (see para 2 c (2)), and the addition of 3KW generators to the searchlight battery inventory, lights have been positioned on OP's previously inaccessible to jeep mounted searchlights. Used in conjunction with Night Observation Devices and Integrated Observation Systems, these searchlights have greatly increased the acquisition capabilities of their positions. This has resulted in 21 searchlight assisted enemy contacts resulting in 54 enemy KIA, 1 POW, 3 boats sunk and 5 secondary explosions.

- e. Religious Activities:
- (1) During the quarter, no memorial services were held.
- (2) During the reporting period, the Battalion Chaplain conducted 90 worship services as follows:
 - (a) Base Camp 35
 - (b) Field locations 55
- (3) During the reporting period, the office of the Battalion Chaplain was moved to the new battalion headquarters area. Services were established at the local chapel. This unit's religious program was coordinated with the existing program at this compound. The Chaplains serving Dong Ha Combat Base will provide for the troops remaining at that location.

f. Medical:

- (1) During the reporting period, there have been 910 out-patient visits to the Aid Station.
- (2) As a result of the battalion's increased area of commitment, the medical section has taken the following actions:
- (a) Established two forward aid stations, one at Dong Ha Combat Base and the other at Chu Lai.
- (b) The Battalion Surgeon's office has been moved to Da Nang, where an office was opened. This will also be the supply point for all the battalion's medical needs.
- (c) Additional medical corpsmen were procured for the newly acquired field positions.
- (3) Vector control and roach extermination measures were initiated and the medical sanitation teams were reactivated.
- (4) With the advent of additional cases of malaria in the I Corps area, efforts were made to insure the utilization of the malaria prophyloxis by the field troops.
- g. Civil Affairs: The Civil Affairs program of this battalion consisted primarily of MEDCAP visits by the battalion surgeon. In a joint program with the 108th Artillery Group Surgeon, weekly visits were made to Gia Linh Village. The purpose of these visits was to cooperate with the Vietnamese Nurses and the Rural Health Development Association in the diagnosis and treatment of patients and in the training of the local Vietnamese health personnel.

h. Education:

- (1) 1st Bde, 5th Inf Div (Mech) Education Center, Quang Tri Combat Base, administers all courses and tests for Batteries A, B and Battery G, 65th Arty.
- (2) The 26th General Support Group, Phu Bai Combat Base, administers all courses and tests for Battery D.
- (3) The 80th Support Group, Da Nang, administers all courses and tests for HHB and Battery G (SLT) 29th Artillery.
- (4) The Americal Education Center in Chu Lai administers all courses and tests for personnel of Battery C.
- 2. (C) Lessons Learned: Commanders Observations, Evaluations and Recommendations:
 - a. Personnel: None
 - b. Intelligence: None
 - c. Operations:
 - (1) Command and control:
- (a) Observation: Effective Command and Control of a Battalion consisting of seven batteries deployed in 63 locations in general support of a Corps requires additional mobility support in the form of available helicopter transportation.
- (b) Evaluation: With the redeployment of the battalion headquarters to Da Nang and C Battery to the Chu Lai area, command and control of the battalion presents a greater challenge. The battalion now has assets spread over a two hundred mile front. The size of this area of operations makes it difficult to provide effective battalion level command and staff support by wheeled vehicle. While the battalion receives some helicopter support from XXIV Corps Artillery, the needs of that headquarters, together with their limited helicopter assets, makes the degree of support available from that source insufficient to meet all of the battalion needs.
- (c) Recommendation: That the current TOE be changed to include an Air Section as part of the battalion staff support. A recommendation for such a change to the current TOE was forwarded through channels during this reporting period.
 - (2) Searchlight Employment:
- (a) Observation: A test is currently being conducted in the battalion to determine the feasibility of employing a specially configured 23" Xenon searchlight in stationary positions in areas not accessible by road. This Self-contained Airmobile Searchlight (SCAMS) consists of a searchlight mounted on a standard US Army and Air Force CONEX and is powered by a 3KW DC generator.

The CONEX gives the searchlight added height to shine over bunkers and other average sized obstacles and provides living and storage areas for the crew as well as a ready made air portable container for the searchlight generator and section equipment during movement.

- (b) Evaluation: The SCAMS is capable of being used on any position which affords room for a CONEX. The 3KW DC generator can be remoted to approximately 25 feet from the CONEX. (This is limited only by the length of power cable.)
 - 1. SCAMS serves the following purposes:
- a Supplement the surveillance and detection activities of small or isolated outposts by providing good perimeter defense coverage. As a self-contained unit, quarters and supplies are provided with SCAMS; thus no special provisions need be made for searchlight crewmen. SCAMS stays ready rigged for airlift. Moreover, the 3KW DC generator and the search can be moved into the CONEX and be ready for extraction within minutes.
- \underline{b} Rapid deployment to areas of increased enemy activities. The greatest benefit of SCAMS lies in the fact that the lights can be moved into areas where enemy activity is being experienced and, as the level of activity decreases, moved to other more active areas with no special considerations required for quartering of personnel or construction of towers or platforms for the searchlights.
- <u>c</u> Provide a means of testing the appropriateness of a proposed search-light location prior to committing searchlight assets to a particular area and without requiring construction of special platforms.
- <u>d</u> SCAMS is intended to supplement rather than to replace the AN/MSS-3 jeep mounted searchlight. The mobility of the jeep makes it preferable in these areas able to use that mobility. However, small areas without roads can benefit from the compactness and portability of SCAMS.
- e. Recommendation: That the experiment be continued until sufficient data is accumulated to determine if SCAMS will accomplish its designed purposes. Also, that other searchlight units consider this concept as a possible method of searchlight employment, where appropriate.
 - d. Training: None
 - e. Logistics: None
 - f. Organization: None
 - g. Communications: FM Radio Communications:
- (1) Observations: With the redeployment of the Battalion, the difficulties in communicating between the battery command posts and the battalion command post were somewhat increased. Presently, the Battalion command post is centrally located at Da Nang with the northernmost battery command post 140km to the northwest at Dong Ha and the southernmost battery

command post 90 km to the southeast at Chu Lai. A centrally located relay station has been set up on Hai Van Pass (altitude 720 meters), 10 km north of the battalion command post. This station utilizes two AN/VRC-46 radios and an HYL-3 automatic retransmission unit thereby providing automatic retransmission in the secure voice mode. An RC-292 omni-directional antenna was initially utilized for retransmission but proved to be unreliable. A USMC type directional log-periodic antenna is presently being used. Best results have been attained by pointing the antenna in a direction perpendicular to the batteries. This method of antenna orientation, although providing the most effective communications thus far attained, is still being tested.

- (2) Evaluation: The present deployment of this battalion has created a tenuous situation in which reliable FM communications is sometimes lacking is both the plain and secure modes. This is due to the limited capabilities of authorized TOE communications equipment.
- (3) Recommendation: Recommend that similar type units be made aware of the communication limitations experienced by this organization, utilizing TOE equipment. Further recommend that consideration be given to the possible use of the log-periodic antenna to help extend the range of FM Communications for similar type units which are required to communicate over long distances.

- 1. This Headquarters has reviewed the Operational Report-Lessons Learned for the quarterly period ending 31 July 1970 from Headquarters, 1st Battalion (AW)(SP), 44th Artillery and comments of indorsing headquarters.
- 2. Reference item concerning "Command and Control," page 14, paragraph 2c(1): nonconcur. Recommendation that the current TOE be changed to include an air section as part of the battalion staff support does not appear to have sufficient justification to warrant approval. This particular battalion is unusual in the spread of its assets over such a vast area of operations. In this case, MTOE action would be more appropriate than a TOE change. The unit may submit a change to its present MTOE in which it includes the air section. A submission must include complete justification per paragraph 2-42e, AR 310-49 and page three, USARPAC Supplement 1 to AR 310-49. Helicopters are a "Closed Loop" item and the losing unit must be cited. Trade-off spaces must be identified to accommodate personnel in the air section since strength increases cannot be supported by USARV. Force Development Division of USARV, G3 will render technical advice and assistance in preparation of the MTOE if desired (telephone 926-4240/4630). Unit has been so advised.


