INTERNATIONAL DATA ARCHIVE--FINAL REPORT

June, 1971 - December, 1972

Research Program and Plan

The International Data Archive has undertaken as its primary goals the acquisition, processing and dissemination of data set/software packages. From a total of four processed and nine unprocessed data sets in 1969 when the Archive was established, there are now over 50 data sets available. Over eleven million card images of data have been serviced to more than 90 institutions over the last three years.

OVERVIEW OF THE PROJECT

The International Data Archive (IDA) project has accomplished the following major tasks during the last contract period (June, 1971 - December, 1972): (1) data processing and standardization; (2) acquisition of new data sets and an updating of reports describing the data holdings and variables within the data sets; (3) servicing of requests from outside users; and (4) development and pre-testing of the Computer Aided International Relations teaching (CAIR) package.

1. DATA STANDARDIZATION

Routine data processing and standardization, e.g., keypunching, preparing codebooks, checking the data to determine in which class it should be placed, and converting the data to machine readable form have been performed by the International Relations Archive of the Inter-university Consortium for Political Research with support from IDA.

Roll Calls for the Twenty-Fifth and Twenty-Sixth Sessions of the United Nations were added to the United Nations file, and the entire United Nations data set was subsetted into separate files so that each session is available independently of the other sessions.

World Handbook II Aggregate Data File was standardized and the codebook completed. The very large and comprehensive Cross-Polity Time Series data set was also standardized, and selected political, economic and demographic variables were updated to 1972, with IDA support.

Codebooks were prepared for two data sets received via the data generation efforts of the Voluntary International Coordination (VIC) project. One of the codebooks describes the data sets which have been created as part of the Programmed International Computer Environment (PRINCE) project of the International Relations Program of Syracuse University, which were designed to provide estimates for the values of the principal variables used in the model underlying PRINCE. The other codebook describes a data set which consists of a content analysis of 367 of President Lyndon B. Johnson's speeches delivered between 1964 and 1968 that are about or contain references to Vietnam. The source for the study was Papers of the President, 1964-1968. The data set is divided into four sections with a total of 121 variables.

Data sets received by the International Data Archive have been divided into four classes which have been developed to reflect the staps that would be taken between the time the original investigator sends his data and the point at which these data are cleaned, fully documented,

maintained, and easily retrievable. The desire of many scholars to have reasonably quick access to data once they are released by the original investigator coupled with the limited resources available for continued optimal standardization (Class I) has necessitated the development of a classification system to facilitate the description of data in various stages of processing. These classes are described as follows:

Class I: Class I data sets have been checked, reformated and cleaned to archival standards. The data have also been recoded and reorganized to maximize their utilization and accessibility. A codebook capable of being read by a computer is available. This machine readable codebook fully documents the data and may also contain statistics such as frequencies and means. All Class I studies are available on magnetic tape in either card image or OSIRIS (Organized Set of Integrated Routines for Investigation with Statistics) format.

Class II: Class II studies have been checked and reformated to archival standards. Data have been put into OSIRIS format, with amps (&, +), dashes (-), blanks and other codes not accepted by the OSIRIS programs removed from numeric data. The studies in this class are available on magnetic tape in either OSIRIS or card image formats. The documentation exists as either a machine readable codebook or a multilithed or xeroxed version of the investigator's codebook with annotations

made by the archive staff. Peculiarities in the data have been pointed out in the documentation, and a copy is supplied when the data are requested.

Class III: Class III studies have been checked by the staff for appropriate number of cards per case and accurate data locations as specified by the investigator's codebook. Often frequency checks on these data have been made, and known data discrepancies and other problems are communicated to the user at the time the data are requested. These data exist only in card image form.

<u>Class IV</u>: The Class IV studies are in the same format as they are received by the archive from the original investigator.

2. ACQUISITION OF NEW DATA SETS AND UPDATING OF REPORTS

Several new data sets were acquired during this contract period. Most of these new data sets were a result of the data generation efforts undertaken by the Voluntary International Coordination (VIC) project under contract numbers NO0014-67-A-0181-0026 and NO0014-67-A-0181-0042, and have become part of the holdings of the archive. (See final report for the Voluntary International Coordination (VIC) project, February, 1973).

An updated report entitled International Data Archive Data Holdings was prepared during this contract period, to include all new studies acquired by the International Data Archive since June, 1972. A new Variable Index of Studies Available from the International Data Archive

was prepared, in which archive staff merged the new variables with the old. Variables in this report are listed in two ways: (1) alphabetically by key word indicating the study; and (2) listed by study after the study description.

3. DIRECT SERVICING OF REQUESTS

Though the International Data Archive has not serviced ordinary requests for data from university users during this contract period,

IDA has serviced varied types of special requests from users both in and out of the academic community.

IDA (as opposed to IRA, which services only academic institutions) has serviced requests from non-university users such as the Consolidated Analysis Centers, Incorporated (C.A.C.I.), G.E. TEMPO, the U.S. Air Force Academy, the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Systems Analysis, etc. One such request involved cleaning the World Handbook II data. Another request involved familiarizing C.A.C.I. staff with the Michigan Terminal System (MTS), in conjunction with using IDA data and software packages.

Thomas Thayer, OASD/SA requested the India-Pakistan-Bangladesh case from the Computer Aided System for Handling Information on Local Conflicts (CASCON), which had been coded by IDA staff and incorporated into the CASCON data base.

IDA programming and research staff wrote and made available to Dr. Jeffrey Milstein at Yale and Dr. Robert Young (in his capacity as adjunct associate professor at the George Washington University) a program which allows students to retrieve the U.N. Roll Calls data

via MTS.

Professor John Montgomery of Harvard University requested an analytic deck of data from World Handbook II. The computer center at Harvard did not have a program at hand for printing out the requested data (ethnolinguistic fractionalization scores and the inter-nation ranking based on these scores). IDA programming staff readily accessed the requested information and made it available to Montgomery within a very short time of his request.

4. DEVELOPMENT AND PRE-TESTING OF THE COMPUTER AIDED INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS TEACHING (CAIR) PACKAGE.

A basic purpose of the Computer Aided International Relations teaching (CAIR) package is to introduce university students and policy analysts to the substantive data analysis techniques in the fields of international studies. CAIR is designed to present the roles and limitations of certain tools in the analysis of political and security problems and allows the analyst to have some confidence in his ability to employ these analytical tools to answer questions of substantive interest. CAIR systematically reveals the inter-relationships among research design, data, statistical analysis and computer usage. CAIR gives the student an appreciation of quantitative methods as utilized in the social sciences.

CAIR's utility extends both to the student and the policy analyst. The policy analyst must be capable of utilizing modern data storage and retrieval systems which can aid the recall of past actions and the development and evaluation of current policies. In short, CAIR can teach the policy analyst how to develop and evaluate his ideas empirically..

CAIR teaches general technical skills which students and decision makers will require. These skills are not unique to any one field; they are techniques and modes of thought which can be applied across political arenas of every type--bureaucracies, legislatures, international organizations, judicial systems, and academia. CAIR, in itself, is not a tool for substantive analysis. Rather, the package is designed to teach the skills necessary to use the analytic tools available to the social scientist.

CAIR development, under this contract, originally included three phases: Phase I, the preparation of an instruction manual providing an introduction to statistical methods and examples of how to use these methods vis a vis the computer; Phase II, evaluation and pre-testing; and Phase III, a workbook providing more advanced statistical techniques along with a survey of methods and data used by scholars of international affairs. CAIR development was hindered in two ways: (1) difficulty of locating and the frequent turn-over of qualified personnel; and (2) a change within the University of Michigan computer analysis program form Consol Statistics (CONSTAT) to a more comprehensive, efficient and versatile system, the Michigan Interactive Data Analysis System (NIDAS).

Phase I of CAIR composed of an instruction manual and two data sets has been completed, and it has been incorporated within MIDAS. CAIR data set I, entitled "National Attributes and Conflict Behavior," is a composite of variables from a variety of studies in the archive. CAIR data set II is a subset of the World Handbook II data set. The instruction manual uses examples from CAIR data set II, and a codebook describing the variables used in the exercises accompanies the manual.

Phase II of CAIR, pre-testing and evaluation, has also been completed, though not as systematically in the evaluation part as had been hoped for originally. CAIR was pre-tested at a number of institutions, among them George Washington University; the School for Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University, Northern Illinois University, and The University of Michigan. CAIR was also utilized in four "Computers and Foreign Affairs" courses at the School of Professional Studies, Foreign Service Institute.

CAIR's efficacy as a teaching aid has been confirmed by those involved in the above mentioned courses, both from the students' and teachers' viewpoints. A systematic evaluation of CAIR, e.g., pre- and post tests, questionnaires, etc., was not feasible given the problems IDA had with respect to adequate staffing. Phase III of CAIR, the advanced methods workbook was not completed due to the same problem. Nevertheless, approximately 15 institutions over the past year have requested descriptions of CAIR (see research report #2, May, 1971), and CAIR data set I either in card image or tape form.

Non-academic institutions have also been introduced to CAIR, such as the Navy War College, Army and Navy personnel, and staff at the Department of State and the Department of Defense.

INTRODUCTION

This variable index contains all substantive variables of the data sets which have been obtained and/or processed during the three years in which the International Data Archive has been in existence.

The variables are listed in two ways: (1) in alphabetical order by key word; and (2) by study. For most variables the key word is obvious, but for many variables there are at least two possibilities for key words, e.g., Agricultural Production as % of GNP or GNP: % Agricultural Production. No set criteria were established for selection of a key word in these instances, and the user is advised to check for each of the possible choices of key words. In some cases, for clarity, the name of the data set appears first, e.g., U.N. Resolutions; Country, Total Interaction. Some of the variable names, however, remain unavoidably ambiguous in meaning outside the context of the specific data set.

Following each variable is an abbreviated study name which is the data source for that variable. The "KEY TO STUDY NAMES" gives the complete study name, the principal investigator(s), the date(s) and the unit(s) of analysis. The dates represent the time period of the entire data collection, but not necessarily the dates applicable to specific variables. For some variables the appropriate dates are given in the variable name.

Introduction

It has been said that in all of man's written record only God, love, and inner struggle have received the attention given to the topic of "conflict." And as social scientists continue to examine manifestations of conflict--conflict behaviors--they seek to develop theories which will explain the roots of such behaviors. In this exercise, we will study violent conflict behaviors within nations. We will employ quantitative methods to systematically evaluate the adequacy of an hypothesis bearing on the occurrence of civil strife. The exercises will be developed around the works of Davies and Gurr. Therefore, to fully understand the analysis undertaken here, you should be familiar with some of their articles.

Specifically, we will consider the hypothesis:

The <u>higher</u> the level of relative deprivation in a country, the <u>higher</u> the level of civil violence.

Do the patterns we find when we examine relevant <u>data</u> support this hypothesis. To answer this question, we must first determine some way to <u>measure</u> the two variables we are linking together in our hypothesis, namely, relative deprivation and civil violence. Let's consider civil violence first.

One measure of this variable that has been used in other research is the total number of deaths resulting from violent political events occurring within a nation during a certain time period. The data we will use were collected and published in The World Handbook of Social and Political Indicators, by Charles Taylor and Michael Hudson. In the codebook you have

for this dataset (see Variables 37-39) we find that most of these deaths occurred in conjunction with armed attacks by one group toward another. The time period we will study is 1960-1964 (Variable 38, labelled DTHS60-4). The countries included in our study are listed in the codebook (see Variable 1, C-CODE).

Let's describe DTHS60-4. Things we may want to know are:

- (1) What was the average or <u>mean</u> number of deaths from political violence in 1960-1964 in the countries under study?
 - (2) How much does DTHS60-4 vary from country to country?
 - (3) What is the range of scores for countries on DTHS60-4?

Mean and Range

The <u>mean</u> (or average) of a variable is easy to determine. For example, if we knew the DTHS60-4 values for eight countries, the mean value would be the sum of the values divided by the number of cases (8). The <u>range</u> is simply the distance from the minimum to the maximum score in the sample.

Variance

We are interested in why DTHS60-4 is high in some countries and low in others. In other words, we are interested in the <u>variance</u> of DTHS60-4. We will want to get some measure of this variance. This can be computed by taking into account how much each country's DTHS60-4 value differs from the mean value.

EXAMPLE 2.

The symbol \overline{X} is often used to stand for "the mean of variable X." The symbol Σ means "the sum of."

The symbol N means "the total number of cases."

What we have done is to calculate first the difference between each country's score and the mean, $(X-\overline{X})$. We next want to get an <u>overall</u> measure of how much countries tend to differ from the mean. Thus, we want to find something like an "average difference from the mean." A first thought might be simply to sum up the $(X-\overline{X})$ values and divide by N. The sum of $(X-\overline{X})$, however, must <u>always</u> equal zero; that is how the mean is defined. We can, however, <u>square</u> these deviations from the mean, sum them, and divide by N to obtain a "mean squared-deviation." This value, $(X-\overline{X})^2$ is known as the <u>variance</u>, or x. The square root of the variance is called the <u>standard deviation</u>, x.

The size of the standard deviation tells us how far away, on the average, country scores are from the mean. For this reason, the standard deviation is known as a measure of a variable's <u>dispersion</u>. The <u>variance</u> of a variable is important because, as we said, it is this variance in the dependent variable that we are trying to explain by the variance in the independent variable.

^{*}For reasons we won't go into here, we may sometimes use N-1 instead of N in the denominator of the variance. The basic idea is still the same, however.


Frequency Distribution

As we said, the standard deviation tells us how "spread cut" the cases are with reference to a particular variable. A <u>frequency distribution</u> shows us pictorially the same thing; it is simply a tabulation of the number of cases having each score, or interval of scores, on a variable.

^{*}DESC will also supply the value of the "standard error of the mean." We will not discuss this value here.

EXAMPLE 3.

A frequency distribution on DTHS60-4 of the fifteen countries presented thusfar is shown below (Figure 1).

Figure 1 shows that most of the fifteen countries experienced less than 10 deaths from political violence in the period 1960-1964, that a few countries had scores in the 10-30 range and that one country had a high DTHS60-4 score that pulled the mean away from the low end of the scale.

Ideally, we would want the distribution of cases along the range of a variable to approach a <u>normal distribution</u>, as shown in Figure 2.



Many statistical techniques technically require normally distributed data values. The more that the data are not normally distributed, the more the chance that the results of the analysis will be distorted.

EXAMPLE 4.

The command: hist v=38 int=25: c=all enabled us to obtain a frequency distribution (with 25 intervals) for all the 136 countries for the DTHS60-4 variable.

The frequency plot illustrates a tendency noticed in the previous example, only much more so: a single country experiencing very high levels of political violence has caused the distribution to be extremely skewed. Practically all the countries have been "bunched" on one end of the range, with just a few nations scattered along the range. The cases do not fall symmetrically around the mean. The high standard deviation (4064.7 deaths) obtained in Exercise 2 indicates what we now see, namely, a very skewed distribution.

Variable Transformation

A partial solution to this predicament is to <u>transform</u> the scores in some way that will allow the countries to be distributed more normally

along the total range of the variable. One common transformation is logarithmic (to the base 10). First, some value (usually 1) is added to each country's score. This is necessary because a score of 0 cannot be logged. Once this is accomplished, each country is assigned the <u>log</u> of its original score (the log of 1 is 0). These transformed scores should distribute themselves more normally than the original values.

EXAMPLE 5.

For our example, the proper TRANS commands are: trans v60=v38+1 l=dths+1 trans v60=log10(v60) l=logdths hist v=60 int=25:

The distribution is still skewed, since nothing can be done to "spread out" the cases with raw scores of 0. But at least the cases are now distributed along the entire range, and the distribution is more normal than before. We will use this LOGDTHS variable in later analysis.

EXERCISE 3.

Choose one of the event frequency variables. Find the mean, range, and standard deviation. Plot a frequency distribution and describe what you find. Does a logarithmic transformation improve the distribution of country scores?

Indicator Construction

We must now determine how we will measure our <u>independent variable</u>, relative deprivation. We remember from the articles we read that relative deprivation refers essentially to a perceived "gap" between the level of need satisfaction people expect and the actual level of satisfaction. As Davies argued this gap is likely to occur when a period of economic and social development is followed by a period of reversal (see Figure 3).



One <u>indicator</u> of the economic well-being of the people of a nation is <u>gross national product per capita</u>. Since the notion of relative deprivation has to do with occurrences over time, we should focus not on the level of GNP/per capita at any one time point, but instead should examine <u>growth</u> in this variable within countries <u>over time</u>.

We can construct an indicator that measures the percent of growth in GNP per capita from 1955 to 1960 in each nation. This indicator is defined as:

% of growth in
$$= \frac{GNP/C. 60 - GNP/C. 55}{GNP/C. 55}$$

Similarly, for each nation, the percent gain in CNP/capita achieved in 1965 compared with GNP/capita in 1960 is:

We now have measures of growth in GNP/capita for two time periods and for each country. Now, let us assume that, for a given country, the populace's expectations of economic growth in the second time period were based on the actual growth achieved in the first time period. Then the difference between percentage growth in GNP/C (1955-60) and percentage growth in GNP/C (1960-65) will serve as an index of the gap between expected and achieved need satisfaction.

EXAMPLE 6.

To create the index of relative deprivation (labelled REL.DEPR), the following commands were required:

trans v70=v19-v18 l=gnp60-55 trans v70=v70/v18 l=%gnp.t1 These first two commands give us the percent growth in GNP per capita in 1960 when compared with 1955. The next two commands form the percent growth in GNP per capita for the 1960-1965 period.

trans v71=v20-v19 1=gnp65-60 trans v71=v71/v19 1=%gnp.t2

The subtraction of actual growth in GNP per capita, 1960-1965, from the "expected" growth rate based on growth in GNP per capita, 1955-1960, forms our index of relative deprivation for the latter time period.

trans v72=v70-v71 l=rel.depr

By using the DESC and HIST commands, we can investigate the distributional characteristics of our new variable, REL.DEPR.

DESCRIPTIVE MEASURES

First, we see that we are able to obtain an index value for only 51 countries. This is because there were no data available on GNP/capita for many countries for the 1955 and 1960 time periods. Next we see that the mean is negative, -.0362.* How would a country receive a negative score on the REL.DEPR index, and what would this mean? A negative score simply means that, for that country, the growth rate in the second time period was greater than the rate for 1955-1960. Based on our assump-


tions, this would mean that actual need satisfaction exceeded expected need satisfaction. We would expect low levels of violence in countries with negative scores on REL.DEPR.

From the DESC output we also see that the scores on REL.DEPR range from -. 32185 to +.24112 with a standard deviation of .1222.

The frequency distribution of REL.DEPR is not badly skewed. Most of the cases are close to the mean, and both ends of the distribution taper off smoothly. There is little need to transform this variable in order to "normalize" the distribution.



EXERCISE 4.

Energy consumption per capita is another measure of economic development that we could have used. Compute an index of REL.DEPR using variables 15-17. Describe the characteristics of this new index using the DESC and HIST commands. Would you suggest a transformation of your index in order to improve the distribution?

Relationships Between Two Variables: Scatter-Plot

We have obtained measures of our dependent and independent variables. It is now time to begin evaluating the hypothesis that was stated at the beginning of our work, i.e., that relative deprivation is positively related to civil violence.

One good way to get a picture of how two variables "go together" is with a scatterplot. A scatterplot involves nothing more than placing each country on a graph according to its scores on the dependent and independent variables. The range of values of the dependent variable is marked along the vertical (or Y) axis, and the independent variable values are marked along the horizontal (or X) axis.

Figure 4 shows four hypothetical scatterplots. Figure 4a shows

a strong positive relationship between two variables. Cases scoring high on

X also tend to be high on Y. Very few cases fail to fit the pattern.

Figure 4b shows a more moderate relationship between the two variables.

Again, a positive trend in the distribution of cases is apparent, but there

are a number of cases that are scattered far away from the trend line.

Figure 4c shows no relationship whatsoever between the two variables.

Cases are scattered all about the surface of the graph with no apparent




pattern. Finally, Figure 4d shows a moderate <u>negative</u> relationship.

There is a clear trend in the pattern of cases, but this time the higher the X value, the <u>lower</u> the Y value tends to be. That is a <u>negative</u> or <u>inverse</u> relationship. A scatterplot can tell you a good deal about both the <u>direction</u> (negative or positive) and the <u>strength</u> (strong, moderate, none) of the relationship between two variables.

EXERCISE 5.

Using a set of axes like the one below, plot the following countries. Describe the relationship you find.

EXAMPLE 7.

The SCAT command enables us to see a scatterplot of the relationship between two variables. For our example, the command:

scat v=60,72

illiustrates the relationship between LOGDTHS (variable 60) and REL.DEPR (variable 72).

We can see that there is a moderate, but clear, positive association between the two variables. High levels of relative deprivation are associated with high levels of political violence. We also notice that there is a cluster of countries that do not fit the overall pattern very well. It turns out that these countries are almost all western democracies.* This may lead us to suspect other factors which serve to moderate the relationship between relative deprivation and civil violence. (Alternatively, we may suspect that our measure of relative deprivation is flawed, since these countries all tend to have high GNP per capita scores.)

EXERCISE 6.

Obtain a scatterplot of the log of deaths from domestic violence (1960-4) against the relative deprivation index computed from the three energy consumption per capita variables. Discuss the relationship you find.

Regression

In the previous scatterplot, we drew in a dashed line to show the general direction of the association, but we didn't say how we decided where to place this line. This line is called the <u>regression line</u> of variable Y on variable X.

By looking at another picture of the same scatterplot (Figure 5) we can see something interesting. Although the line goes through most of the points, it misses each case by some amount, <u>e</u>. Each <u>e</u> value is the distance between where a case is <u>actually</u> located in the scatterplot and where it would be located if the relationship were <u>perfectly linear</u>.



These e values, then can be thought of as the error between the observed relationship and an "ideal" linear relationship. It makes sense that we would want to draw the regression line depicting the direction of the relationship in such a way that we minimize these errors.

Such a line can be described by an equation of the form:

$$Y = a + b_{yx} X$$

where a is the value Y when X is 0, and b is the slope of the line. The slope is defined as the ratio of how far "up" you would have to go to hit the regression line (ΔY) to ΔX , some distance that you go "over" parallel to the X axis. The value of this ratio, $\Delta Y/\Delta X$ will be the same for any value of ΔX ; it is a measure of the slope of the entire line. If we let ΔX equal 1, then the slope can be seen to be a measure of how much increase in Y would be expected given an increase of one unit in X. It is important to note that b_{yx} does not equal b_{xy} . The change in Y for a given change in X will almost never equal the change in X due to a given change in Y. The choice of which variable is the dependent one is a decision based on the theory you are evaluating.

Although we won't prove it here, it can be shown very simply that the way to solve for the values of a and b_{yx} for any set of data such that we minimize the overall error is by these two formulas:

$$b_{yx} = \frac{\sum (x - \overline{x}) (y - \overline{y})}{\sum (x - \overline{x})^{2}}$$

$$a = \overline{y} - b\overline{x}$$

These formulas may look complicated at first, but if you look at each part of them, they are not too strange. The demoninator of b_{yx} , for example is $\sum (X-\bar{X})^2$, the "sum of squared deviations" in variable X. This

is the same value that is used in computing the <u>variance</u> of X. The numerator of b is $\sum (X-\bar{X})$ $(Y-\bar{Y})$. This means that for each case you see how far its X score is from the mean of X, how far its Y score is from the mean of variable Y, and then multiply these two deviations together $(X-\bar{X})(Y-\bar{Y})$. The " \sum " sign denotes that you do this for each case and then add up the $(X-\bar{X})(Y-\bar{Y})$ values obtained.

The formula for "a" is easy once you have b_{yx} . It's just the mean of Y minus the quantity b_{yx} times the mean of X.

Read this section on Regression over again, and then go on to EXERCISE 7.

EXERCISE 7.

Using the data from EXERCISE 5, compute the equation for the regression line of LOGDTHS60-4 on REL.DEPR (Remember, REL.DEPR is the X variable and LOGDTHS60-4, the Y variable). Once you have obtained the equation, substitute for X the values 0, -.10, +.10, and +.20 to obtain the values of Y predicted by the regression line. Draw in the regression line on your scatterplot. How far away is the LOGDTHS60-4 score of Honduras from the prediction made by the regression line (The value of the prediction is found by substituting the REL.DEPR score for Honduras into the regression equation)? Use a retup like the one on the rest page to perform the necessary calculations.

EXAMPLE 8.

The command, regr v=60,72, yields the regression of DTHS60-4 on REL.DEPR for all countries for which we have data. Notice that the dependent variable comes first following "V=". The output from REGR contains much information, only some of which we will discuss here. Right now we are concerned only with the coefficients of the regression equation. The constant is the "a" value; it is 1.3897. The byx coefficient is 2.7207.



Our regression equation, then, is :

LOGDTHS60-4 = 1.3897 + 27207REL.DEPR

This is the equation of the line drawn in EXAMPLE 7. Moreover, by substituting in the REL.DEPR score of a country into the equation, we can obtain a predicted LOGDTHS60-4 score based on our regression line.

Looking back at the output, we notice something called a "MULTIPLE R" value of .32084 and an "R-SQR" (R squared) value of .10301. We will discuss the meaning of these values in the next section.



EXERCISE 8.

Use the REGR command to obtain the coefficients of the regression of LOGDTHS60-4 on your REL.DEPR measure based on energy consumption.

Correlation

We now take the scatterplot from EXAMPLE 7 and draw lines on it corresponding to the mean values of X and Y (see Figure 6). The graph is now divided into four quadrants. Also, each point can now be located by the new coordinates $(X - \overline{X}), (Y - \overline{Y})$. It is clear that the product $(X - \overline{X})(Y - \overline{Y})$

is positive for all cases in quadrant I.

is negative for all cases in quadrant II.

is positive for all cases in quadrant III.

is negative for all cases in quadrant IV.

If a positive relationship exists between two variables, most of the cases will be located in quadrants I and III, and $\sum (X-\overline{X})(Y-\overline{Y})$ will be large and positive. For a negative association, most cases will lie in quadrants II and IV, and $\sum (X-\overline{X})(Y-\overline{Y})$ will be large in absolute value and negative. If no relationship exists, the cases will be scattered all over the four quadrants and $\sum (X-\overline{X})(Y-\overline{Y})$ will be approximately zero. Hence, $\sum (X-\overline{X})(Y-\overline{Y})$ may serve as a measure of association between X and Y.

This measure, however, has two shortcomings. First, the size of this product may be increased arbitrarily by adding cases. This may be corrected by obtaining an <u>average</u> product, that is by dividing the product by N. Second, the measure is arbitrarily influenced by the units of measurement of X and Y. This can be corrected by using <u>standardized</u> scores. By dividing $(X - \overline{X})$ by the standard deviation of X, $s_{\overline{X}}$, and similarly



dividing $(Y - \overline{Y})$ by the standard deviation of Y, s_y , we obtain new scores measured in terms of standard deviations. These new scores are unaffected by the units of measurement we have used to measure X and Y.

The measure of association, then, is:

$$r = \sum \left[\frac{(x - \overline{x})}{s_x} \cdot \frac{(y - \overline{y})}{s_y} \cdot \frac{1}{N} \right]$$
$$= \frac{\sum (x - \overline{x})(y - \overline{y})}{s_x \cdot s_y \cdot N}$$

This is the formula for the <u>Pearson r correlation coefficient</u>. This coefficient will always equal some value in the range -1.00 through +1.00. The sign of the coefficient denotes the direction (positive or negative) of the relationship. The absolute value of the coefficient gives an indication of the strength of the association.

A correlation of ± 1.00 indicates a "perfect" positive relationship between X and Y. Graphically, all cases would lie exactly on the regression line in the scatterplot, and there would be no error in predictions. Similarly, r = -1.00 indicates a "perfect" negative relationship. A correlation of 0.00 indicates no association whatsoever. Other values of \underline{r} imply weak, strong, or moderate relationships. The correlation coefficient is $\underline{symmetric}: \ r_{xy} = r_{yx}.$ This is because \underline{r} is a measure of $\underline{association}$, as opposed to \underline{b}_{yx} which measures \underline{change} in Y relative to \underline{change} in X.

The correlation coefficient is useful for another purpose as well. You recall that we stated our interest in explaining the <u>variance</u> in one variable (LOGDIHS) by taking into account another variable (REL.DEPR). The correlation coefficient <u>squared</u> (r^2) indicates the <u>proportion</u> of variance

in the dependent variable accounted for by the independent variable. This proportion, of course, may range from .00 (when r = .00) to 1.6. (when r equals ± 1.00 or ± 1.00).

EXERCISE 9.

Using the data from EXERCISE 7, compute the correlation coefficient (\underline{r}) for the association between LOGDTHS and REL.DEPR. Most of the necessary calculations were performed in that exercise. Remember:

$$s_{x} = \sqrt{\frac{\sum (x - \overline{x})^{2}}{N}}$$

$$s_{y} = \sqrt{\frac{\sum (y - \overline{y})^{2}}{N}}$$

Interpret the coefficient you obtain. What is the value of r^2 ? What does this value indicate?

EXAMPLE 9.

The command: corr v=60,72

produces the coefficient of correlation between the two variables. For our sample of 51 countries, the correlation between LOGDTHS and REL.DEPR is approximately .32. This indicates a modest relationship between the two variables.

Conclusions

In this set of exercises we have discussed the process of determining measures of the concepts in a <u>hypothesis</u> obtained from a <u>theory</u> of civil violence. You have been introduced to ways of describing the distributional characteristics of individual variables, index building, and transformations of variables.

Next, ways of examining the relationship between two variables were discussed--scatterplot, regression, and correlation.

It is clear that there are many topics that are yet to be covered, as some of the footnotes in these exercises have made apparent. Nevertheless, if you have completed the exercises and studied the examples presented here, you will have a good foundation for further study.



A <u>riot</u> is a violent demonstration or disturbance involving a large number of people. "Violence" implies the use of physical force and is usually evinced by the destruction of property, the wounding or killing of people by authorities, the use of riot control equipment such as clubs, gas, guns or water cannons, and by the rioters' use of various weapons.

Riots, in comparison with demonstrations and armed attacks, are characterized by spontaneity and by tumultuous group behavior. This is not to assert that riot events are unplanned, but the riot organizers constitute a small, often invisible, portion of the rioters. Events were classified as riots if it appeared from the report that most of those involved were violently agitated in their behavior, that they formed an excited or confused crowd or mob, that they were engaged in unpredictable acts of disorder, and that the objects of their violence would not seem to be closely related to the objects of their political discontent in the analysis of a dispassionate observer. The data sources rarely reported the number of people involved in a riot, and when they did, there was no way of assessing the accuracy of the estimates. Therefore, it was impossible to assert that a riot involved, say, at least 100 people. In common parlance it is possible to speak of a riot involving as few as three people. It is doubtful that any of the reported riots involved that small a number; to be reported at all it is likely that their participants would have been numbered in the hundreds and thousands, rather than in tens.

Coders were instructed to distinguish between riots and armed attacks on grounds of apparent spontaneity of most of the participants. Violent raids against property and persons were occasionally reported; coders were instructed to exclude such events from the riots variable and to code them as armed attacks if they were directed by opposition to the government, or as governmental sanctions if they were directed by the government against its opposition. Coders were instructed to count as riots events that began as demonstrations but became riots. Such events were not counted as demonstrations. Riots taking place within parliaments or other ruling bodies were also included.

Unlike the other indicators, the number of <u>deaths from political violence</u> is not an event variable, but a body count. The deaths reported occur mainly in conjunction with armed attacks, but also with riots and to a lesser extent with demonstrations.

The category includes persons of the country who die participating in foreign interventions in the country, but this does not include foreigners. It excludes persons wounded in political violence. It does not include assassination victims - these are indicated in connection with the assassination variable. Nor does it include victims of political execution, deaths in enemy prisons, deaths in formal warfare, or deaths in border incidents with other countries. Victims of ordinary criminal homicide were of course also excluded.

In coding deaths, coders were instructed to be especially careful of duplicate reports. The publications of periodic summaries of deaths during periods or prolonged and widespread civil strife, along with the daily reports, sometimes made this task difficult - particularly given the incomplete or ambiguous nature of the reports. Occasionally, sources would cite only a certain number of "casualties" or "victims;" but only reports specifying "deaths" were included.

An <u>armed attack</u> is an act of violent political conflict carried out by (or on behalf of) an organized group with the object of weakening or destroying the power exercised by another organized group. It is characterized by bloodshed, physical struggle, or the destruction of property. A wide variety of weapons may be utilized, including guns, explosives, bricks, spears, gasoline bombs, chemicals and knives. The category is intended to encompass all organized political violence in a political system, and it is intended to exclude all non-violent protest and incidents of turmoil (riots), as well as organized violence, such as crime, that is not observed to be directly relevant to cleavages, conflicts and issues in the state's political process.

The target of an armed attack typically is a regime, government, or political leader, or its ideology, policy or actions. The target may also be a religious, ethnic, racial, linguistic, or special interest minority. In cases of general insurgency in which a government may itself resort to organized violence, it may include an insurgent or rebel movement or pretender-government. Armed attacks are organized by political groups that wish to displace an establishment regime or gain for themselves substantial power or autonomy. Typically, these include liberation movements, revolutionary ideological parties and unintegrated minority communities; in cases of major insurgency, the military and security forces of the state are included. When an insurgency situation reaches such proportions that the government can no longer control it by normal punitive measures (such as those coded as governmental sanctions), the government's actions as well as the insurgents' fall within the definition of armed attacks.

personnel, public utilities, roads and transport facilities, dwelling places, factories, and markets. Occasionally whole villages are the target of armed attacks. Armed attacks are often reported as acts of sabotage, terrorism or liberation.

A <u>protest demonstration</u> is a non-violent gathering of people organized for the announced purpose of protesting against a reqime, government, or one or more of its leaders; or against its ideology, policy, intended policy, or lack of policy; or against its previous action or intended action. The protest issues involved are perceived as significant at the national level, but within that framework demonstrations directed at all branches and levels of government are included. This category of events includes demonstrations for or against a foreign government, its leaders, or its visiting representatives when such a demonstration is reported to indicate opposition to the demonstrators' own government.

This category excludes election meetings, rallies, and boycotts because such meetings are associated with a particular formal process that is unevenly distributed over the countries and time period covered, and because the variable is intended to encompass peaceful protest outside the formal structures of government. There is inevitably a degree of ambiguity over the criteria of "non-violence" in such demonstrations. Biased reporters may occasionally underplay or exaggerate the extent of turmoil associated with a particular gathering, just as they can misreport the size of a demonstration; but no particular direction of bias has been observed. The incompleteness of sources makes it impossible to assert that some damage and even occasional serious injury does not accompany some of these demonstrations. But if destruction of property or bloodshed is observed as more than marginal to a demonstration, then the event is judged to have been transformed into a riot and is coded as such; it is not coded as a demonstration, even if it began as one. If there is some indication that a demonstration terminated peacefully, with the crowd dispersing, but that after a period of time a new crowd began rioting in the same place and presumably over the same issue, then two events -- a demonstration and a riot -- would be recorded.

A political strike is a work stoppage by a body of industrial or service workers or a stoppage of normal academic life by students to protest against a regime, a government, government leaders, a government policy or action. Strikes of an economic nature -- called, for example, to enforce demands for higher wages, better working conditions, and shorter hours -- are not included unless they are judged to have assumed a primary political significance. An indication that an economic strike may have greater political importance is that a political party or movement embraces the economic demands, and supports and disseminates them with the objective of embarrassing the government, eroding its base of support and even precipitating its fall.

A political execution is an event in which a person or group of persons is put to death under orders of the national authorities while in the custody of those authorities.

Excluded are assassinations (even if known to have been arranged by the authorities), persons killed in riots, armed attacks, strikes, etc., even if at the hands of the authorities. Also excluded are executions for criminal offenses such as murder that is not reported to have political significance. Typically, a political execution is one in which the person executed is charged with activities threatening the security of the state, the regime, the government, or the leadership. Executions for political crimes committed before 1948 are also excluded. Reports of death sentences handed down for political crimes are not included unless there is specific indications that the sentences were carried out.

A governmental sanction is an action taken by the authorities to neutralize, suppress, or eliminate a perceived threat to the security of the government, the regime or the state itself. The category encompasses a diversity of governmental activities, but they share the characteristic of constituting specific responses to a perceived security problem at the national level, even though the sanctions are sometimes carried out by sub-national governmental units, in conformity with the particular constitution of the state. An attempt has been made to exclude sanctions against criminal behavior that has no observed relevance to the political security of the state; thus there are no reports of crackdowns against organized crime or drives by the police to reduce crime in the streets.

Governmental sanctions may be directed against either perceived internal or external threats or interference. The category includes three types of action:

(a) Censorship - an action by the authorities to limit, curb or intimidate the

mass media, including newspapers, magazines, books, radio and television. Typical examples of such action are the closing of a newspaper or journal, or the censoring of articles in the domestic press or dispatches sent out of the country. (8) Restrictions on political participation - this type includes general restrictive measures by the authorities, such as the act of declaring martial law, mobilizing troops for domestic security, or instituting a curfew. It also includes action specifically directed against an individual, a party or other political organization. Such specific actions include the removal of a governmental official, reportedly because of his political beliefs or activities, the banning of a political party or acts of harassment against it (like denying it a permit to hold a public meeting), the arrest of opposition politicians on ground of state security, the exiling or deportation of persons for political action or expressing opposition regarded as detrimental to the national interest, and the arrest or detention of persons reportedly involved in political protest actions, including demonstrations, riots, political strikes, armed attacks and assassination attempts. (C) Espionage an action by the authorities in which one or more persons (nationals or foreigners) are arrested or detained on charges of spying, sabotage, or prohibited interference in the domestic politics of the state constituting a threat to internal security.

One special characteristic of the governmental sanctions indicator is the variation in the boundary of such an event in time. One usually thinks of the severity of a government's control over political participation as a condition or a state, rather than in terms of a succession of events. A government that promulgates a censorship law, for example, is setting a constant limitation on political activity that may be unchallenged and therefore all the more effective. What is indicated is merely the frequency and concentration of sanction events. It is relatively easy to determine when a sanction event begins but not when it ends. Its beginning is marked by a discrete action, a departure from the normal behavior or inaction of the authorities. For example, a report that "the government began a massive wave of arrests of subversive elements which is expected to last several weeks" would constitute a single sanction event, even though it denotes the beginning of a coherent process of behavior that may deviate considerably from the short time frame, simplicity, and coherence of the typical riot or armed attack event.

A second characteristic is the heterogeneity of the indicators; the variety of governmental behavior it encompasses is wide indeed. While all the actions described have a broad conceptual unity, some users still may find the variable too inclusive for their purposes. The problem of consistent reporting may be especially serious for this variable. In addition to the standard difficulties of information flow from remote places and the "attention span" of the sources, there is the likelihood of systematic underreporting from particularly repressive countries.

A <u>relaxation of governmental restrictions on political activity</u> is an event in which a government modifies or eliminates restrictions on political action or expression of the type classified as governmental sanctions (Event Variable 519). Only such actions initiated by a government without decisive pressure from an external government or agency are included.

"Political" includes all activities reported to be related to the security, stability and distribution of power in a given country, and so the "political shpere" may differ cross-nationally. For example, governmental actions relaxing (or contracting) the boundaries of permissiveness in literary expression might be coded for the U.S.S.R. as relaxation (or sanction) events while they would not be coded at all for the United States.

This category includes events such as decisions to lighten or eliminate sentences for political crimes, to relax or reverse laws restricting political action and expression, to enact new laws granting greater freedom, to acquit or decree amnesties for political prisoners, to reopen closed universities and newspaper offices, to shorten the period of compulsory military service and to lift curfews or martial law.

STUDY DESCRIPTION

This data set consists of a content analysis of 367 of President Lyndon

B. Johnson's speeches delivered between 1964 and 1968 that are about or contain references to Vietnam. The source for the study was Papers of the President, 1964-1968, eight volumes.

The index of each volume was searched for all references to Vietnam (North and South), Vietcong, Southeast Asia, Indochina, Hanoi or any other reference that might be related in any way to the Vietnam war. All documents in which any such references appeared were read; only those that contained at least 1 1/2 - 2 inches of text devoted to Vietnam (approximately 150-200 words) were included in the study. For example, documents in which the words "Vietcong", "Vietnam" or the phrase "Vietnam war" occurred only peripherally were excluded.

The data set is divided into four sections with a total of 121 variables.

Section I contains general information about each document; Section II gives the number of times each of 61 "symbolic key words" appeared in each document; Section III gives the number of times each of 34 countries, cities, regions and international organizations was mentioned in each document; and Section IV gives the number of times President Johnson made reference to the American public or to himself in each document.

SECTION 1: GERNERAL DOCUMENT INFORMATION Variables 1-9

Variable 1: Document number.

The document number is a five-digit number, the first two digits signifying the year of the document (1964-1968) and the last three signifying the number assigned to that document in <u>Papers of the President</u>.

Variable 2: Deck number.

Variable 3: Document date.

The document date appears as follows: year, month, day.

Variable 4: Decision-maker code.

The decision-maker code for this data set is "2" (for Johnson).

Variable 5: Document Designation code.

The document designation code is as follows:

1 - press conference

2 - formal speech

3 - informal remarks, comments

4 - t.v. address

5 - White House statement

6 - Congressional request, letter

7 - other

Variable 6: Vietnam designation code.

The Vietnam designation code is as follows:

0 - document not specifically concerned with Vietnam

1 - Vietnam document specifically

Variable 7: Vietnam reference code.

The Vietnam reference code is a one-digit code ranging from 1 to 9, 1 indicating that 5-15% of the document is devoted to Vietnam, 5 indicating that 50% is devoted to Vietnam and 9 indicating that the document is totally devoted to Vietnam.

Variable 8: Number of coded columns (one decimal place).

The number of coded columns indicates the number of columns of Papers of the President coded for each document.

Variable 9: Audience designation code.

The audience designation code is as follows:

- 1 specific audience (VFW, AFL-CIO, etc.)
- 2 general audience (press conference, t.v. address, etc.)

SECTION II: SYMBOLIC WORDS Variables 10-70

Section II is a simple frequency count of 61 "symbolic tip-off words" that appeared in the Johnson speeches. No context surrounding the words was taken into account; no intensity weightings were given to any words.

"Tip-off words" were derived by instructing three coders to read the same ten randomly chosen documents and to extract from them any word that they considered a "symbol". That first coding resulted in a list of approximately 40 symbols and there was general agreement on at least half of them. Ten different documents were then coded using the preliminary list. Although inter-coder reliability was high at that point, additional symbols were added as a result of the second round of coding. The second list was revised after a small number of documents had been coded, resulting in the final list of 61 "tip-off words". Inter-coder reliablility for these data averaged .81.

SECTION III: GEOGRAPHICAL REFERENCES Variables 71-115

Section III is a frequency count of 34 countries, cities, geographical regions and international organizations that were mentioned in the Johnson speeches. The inter-coder reliability for these data is .75.

SECTION IV: PERSONAL REFERENCES Variables 116-121

Section IV gives the frequency with which Johnson used each of six pronouns referring either to himself or to a generalized public. No inter-coder reliability tests were made on these data.

STUDY DESCRIPTION

The data sets described in this <u>Codebook</u> have been created as part of the PRINCE Project of the International Relations Program of Syracuse University. The data sets are designed to provide estimates for the values of the principal variables used in the model underlying PRINCE, a programmed international computer environment. The variables from the model for which data has been created include issue positions, influence attempts, power, affect, and transaction-related actions. I

With this data, users may test the extent to which some of the dynamics of the TRINCE model correspond to the observable dynamics of contemporary international relations. Two important points must be made, however. On the one hand these data sets are far from complete; there are many other ways of estimating the variables in the PRINCE model. On the other hand, the data sets are not specific to PRINCE: researchers may, and hopefully will, find them useful for many different purposes. We would especially point out the interaction data in File 1, taken from the World Event Interaction Survey. These interactions have been coded according to the substantive issue being dealt with. The variables abstracted are required by the PRINCE research, but others may find them useful as well.

There are five sets of countries covered by different data sets in this Codebook:

- the United States and 106 other nations with which it interacted in the period covered by the WEIS data, January 1966 - August 1969 (Files 1 and 2)

- 3) the two-way relationship between Israel and the United Arab Republic, a dyad marked by an extraordinarily high degree of persistent international conflict (File 1)
- 4) 122 nations that are members of the United Nations (File 3)
- 5) 49 nations for whom at least one issue position statement was recorded by The New York Times between January 1 and June 30, 1972 (File 4)
