TO: Commanding General, Fifth United States Army, ATTN: ALFGC-TN Fort Sheridan, Illinois 60037

This headquarters concurs in the comments and recommendations of the basic communication with the following exceptions and additions:

a. Personnel (Paragraph 3, Section I, basic communication). There are 284 projected gains for this unit prior to the end of September 1968. As these personnel arrive on station, critical MOS shortages will be alleviated.

b. Operations and training (Paragraph 4f, Section I, basic communication). Tentative plans are to conduct platoon and company ATT's in May and June respectively.

c. Maintenance (Paragraph 5a, Section I, basic communication). Request for authority to store the high dollar value items in the unit PLL is contrary to current DA policy and no justification for a change to this policy is made. As the present support capability appears adequate, it is recommended that request be disapproved.

This headquarters concurs in the comments and recommendations provided by the unit commander and the installation commander with the following exceptions and additions:

a. Personnel.

(1) Reference 1st indorsement, paragraph a. Projected personnel gains noted in the Fort Riley indorsement are actually the total number requisitioned. Validated personnel fill for the 1/63d Armor through July is 41 EM. Fort Riley should continue to screen all available surplus and incoming personnel for possible assignment to the unit.

(2) The necessity for timely requisitioning of known losses has been impressed upon 1/63d Armor.

b. Operations. No additional comments.

c. Training and Organization. No additional comments.

d. Logistics.

(1) Reference section 1, paragraph 5a. The official PLL authorized for troop and company level as shown in TM 9-2350-230-25P/2, page 94, dated 1966 contains all of the items listed in paragraph 5a, section 1.

(2) Reference section 1, paragraph 5a. The pending change to TM 9-2350-230-25P/2 will increase the quantity authorized in the PLL based on the number of Shillelagh systems.

(3) Recommend that the items on the PLL be placed in stock at troop or company level for the following reasons: (a) The troop or company has the capability (through the use of test set, Gm Remote Control Components) of determining the unserviceable item and is authorized to replace it. (b) Stockage of the PLL at troop or company level will reduce the out-of-

action time. (c) Based on the usage of these items, the failure data can be computed and the PLL adjusted.

e. Concur with section 1, paragraph 5b. Recommend that the Vehicle Installation Branch, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, initiate action to have the frequency control selector, C2742 installed in all M-551 tanks.

f. The Combat Development Command (CDC) is responsible for the test indicated in Section II. The installation supply at Fort Riley is conducting follow-up on the equipment shortages listed in Section II as requested by 1/63d Armor and CDC. This headquarters is providing assistance and follow-up action as required.

This Headquarters agrees with the observations and recommendations as indorsed with the following additional comments concerning authorized PLL:

a. Shillelagh Missile System Logistical Support Plan (U), Feb 67, indicates that guidance set "spare assemblies will be stocked at organizational level." Further, the concept of maintenance for Shillelagh requires that guidance set assemblies be available at organizational level. The first five items listed in para 5a, basic report, are guidance set components.

b. There appears to be some question concerning the repair parts TM which would authorize repair parts for the Shillelagh system. Reference para a above indicates TM 9-2350-230-25P/2 (Sheridan TM) contains Shillelagh repair parts. TM 9-1400-465-15P is the proper organizational repair parts manual for Shillelagh Missile System peculiar parts. TM 9-2350-230-25P/2 (Sheridan TM) contains non-missile system parts (e.g., automotive). However, both TMs are to be used where appropriate in maintaining the system.




