Adenomyomatous polyps are uncommon benign polypoid neoplasms composed of endometrial glands and associated endometrial stroma embedded in smooth muscle with thick-walled vessels. We present a novel case of a 48-year-old female with an adenomyomatous polyp with an unusual inverted growth pattern displaying full-thickness pseudoinvasion beyond the serosal surface. Prior to surgery, imaging showed an infiltrative lesion suggestive of endometrial carcinoma. An endometrial biopsy was benign but definitive operative management was pursued given the concerning imaging. Gross examination of the uterus demonstrated a 7.2 cm, relatively well-circumscribed inverted polypoid neoplasm with pushing borders. A defect and protruding red tissue was noted where the neoplasm penetrated the serosal surface. Histologic examination demonstrated benign endometrial glands, associated endometrial stroma, thick-walled vessels, and a prominent smooth muscle component consistent with an adenomyomatous polyp. To our knowledge, this unique presentation of an inverted adenomyomatous polyp extending beyond the serosa is extremely rare and is the first time reported in the literature.

SUBJECT: Ethics Review for Poster Approval Request

1. BLUF: A request for a legal review of a poster presentation titled "Adenomyomatous Polyp with Inverted Growth Pattern and Serosal Pseudoinvasion" was submitted by Capt Nathaniel Smith. Capt Smith and his co-authors plan to present this research at the College of American Pathologists Annual Meeting in Las Vegas, NV on 25-28 September 2016. The abstract submitted included the required disclaimer. The disclaimer must also be included on the poster that will be displayed for presentation. A Public Affairs review will be required if it has not already been obtained. There are no conflicts of interest issues with the poster presentation.

- 2. FACTS: An abstract of research titled "Adenomyomatous Polyp with Inverted Growth Pattern and Serosal Pseudoinvasion" was submitted for review. The authors plan to present this research through a poster presentation at the College of American Pathologists Annual Meeting in Las Vegas, NV on 25-28 September 2016.
- 3. LAWS AND REGULATIONS: DoD 5500.07-R, Joint Ethics Regulation (JER), section 3-305 lays out rules governing "Teaching, Speaking and Writing." If the presentation will "deal in significant part with any ongoing or announced policy, program or operation" of the Air Force, the presenter is required to include a disclaimer that states the "views presented are those of the speaker or author and do not necessarily represent the views of DoD or its Components."
- 4. ANALYSIS: While the presentation does not "deal in significant part with any ongoing or announced policy, program or operation" of the Air Force, the presenters' military affiliation and/or ranks will likely be included on the poster presentation. Additionally, the research and information to be discussed in the presentation was obtained as part of their military medical practice. The authors included the required disclaimer on the abstract. Additionally, the disclaimer must also be included on the poster. A Public Affairs review will be needed if it has not already been obtained. There are no apparent conflicts of interest that would prohibit presentation of this research at this conference.

5.	CONCLUSION: The abstract presented for review included the disclaimer required by the
