FOREWORD

The WWII Battle of Bataan-Corregidor, 10 Jan - 7 May, 1942, and the death march which followed comprise the worst defeat suffered by any nation in modern times. It was caused by a variety of factors too numerous to be discussed here. According to all accounts, the surrender surprised the individual American soldier most of all. The loss involved most of General MacArthur's 130,000 man command and a 107,000 person Philippine Army force. The subsequent liberation of the Philippine Islands from Japanese domination was begun in earnest on 20 Oct 1944 but was not completed until March of 1945. Pockets of Japanese resistance remained until the 2 Sep 1945 armistice was signed.

This bibliography presents periodical articles appearing in twenty-seven military journals in two parts. Part One deals with the capitulation of 1942. Part Two deals with the recapture phase of 1944-45. An appendix presents a tentative roster of units and key personnel in-place during 1942. As noted in Mr. Louis Morton's The Fall of the Philippines, an entry in the Center of Military History's U.S. Army in World War II series, most of the historical records which were sent to General MacArthur's Australian headquarters in three shipments from Bataan disappeared. Verification is therefore impossible. A glossary of abbreviations used in the appendix follows.
