



FOREWORD

This bibliography covers United States Army posts and forts of the American West as recorded in books and periodical articles held by the Morris Swett Library, which have existed or may still be operational today. Arrangement of this summary is in three parts, proceeding from the general to the specific. Part one deals with the introductory phase during which exploration and expansion were the dominating factors. The second part deals with the general establishment of posts and forts on a regional basis. Part three presents books and periodical articles which cover specific posts and forts within the borders of a given state. Throughout, the emphasis is on the Trans-Mississippi West as reflected by the table of contents.

Whether the intent was exploration or Indian pacification the cause of manifest destiny was greatly supported by military developments west of the Mississippi River during the last century. The resulting historical record preserves forts with names such as Laramie, Leavenworth, Sill, Smith, and Vancouver.

Inclusion of an item or omission neither implies USAFAS indorsement or sanction of the compiler's point-of-view, nor does it guarantee accuracy of content. Comment and criticism concerning this list is solicited.
