

FOREWORD

This bibliography presents books held by the Morris Swett library which deal with intelligence-gathering or performance toward that end by individuals on behalf of a given country. This title has been chosen as it most clearly suggests the legitimate purpose behind any espionage, spy, investigative or secret agent endeavor, whether performed by or attributed to organizations which recall a veritable alphabet soup of acronyms. This number deals with the subject in a general way. Specific how-to manuals, combat/artillery intelligence, or other highly subjective treatises are not covered.

The books selected for this two-part listing have been chosen for their coverage of Twentieth century events. Part One breaks down individual works in a chronological arrangement according to period of time covered. Part Two covers materials which are periodically updated which provide much of the research-reference typology which helps to form - or suggests the methodology for forming - the larger intelligence estimate.

Inclusion of an item, or omission, does not imply USAFAS indorsement or sanction of the compiler's point-of-view nor does it guarantee accuracy of content. Comment and criticism concerning this list is solicited.
