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PREFACE


This research was conducted under project 7734, Occupation and Career Management; task 773405, Job Satisfaction and Productivity; work unit 77340504, Development of an Instrument for Assessing Levels of Job Satisfaction. This report completes the third phase of the stream of research for development of the Occupational Attitude Inventory (OAI). Phase I developed an experimental OAI as documented by Tuttle, Gould, and Hazel (1975). Phase II described the development and documentation of an operational OAI to be used to collect job attitude predictor and criterion data for Air Force management and research programs and is documented by Gould (1978). The third phase describes the attitudes reported in the administration of the OAI to a large sample of enlisted personnel in all Air Force specialties.

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COMPARATIVE ANALYSES OF ENLISTED JOB SATISFACTION AS MEASURED BY THE OCCUPATIONAL ATTITUDE INVENTORY

I. INTRODUCTION

Previous reports (Gould, 1976, Tuttle, Gould, & Hazel, 1975) have described the initial development of the Air Force Occupational Attitude Inventory (OAI) and its subsequent revision. The purpose of the present report is to describe the results of administering the revised OAI to 7,567 airmen worldwide. These data are made available to allow users to compare their results against the attitudes of a broad sample of Air Force personnel. In addition, future research by the Air Force Human Resources Laboratory (AFHRL) using the OAI will be compared against these initial data. A third purpose is to examine differences in attitudes of airmen at different times in their career; the eventual goal is to identify Air Force-related factors that influence reenlistment decisions.

Revised versions of the OAI are being used by various organizations such as the Leadership and Management Development Center (LMDC) at Maxwell AFB and the Army Military Personnel Center. The need for this type of instrument with accompanying means is widespread throughout the Air Force. Commanders have become aware of the possibilities for improvement of morale and productivity with the assistance of a survey instrument. Unfortunately they have had only limited Air Force data for comparison with their local findings. Although the information reported does not reveal career-ladder-specific data, it does present the results by yeargroups. This breakdown is often more useful than are the combined Air Force means. Future Air Force-wide administrations of the OAI will provide more detailed information such as career-ladder-specific results.

Although recent efforts have been directed toward on a logical reduction of the number of items in the OAI, it appears that the optimal length may have already been obtained. This fact is mentioned in a prior report (Tuttle et al., 1975) where it is pointed out that the wide diversity of Air Force jobs precludes limiting the OAI to a smaller group of items. In fact, a recent study (Pritchard & Shaw, 1978) found that the OAI had the broadest coverage of intrinsic satisfaction reward areas of 18 major job satisfaction measures. Some users, however, have found it beneficial to employ shortened versions of the OAI to investigate specific problem areas such as communication or supervision. This is a particularly useful approach in the case of LMDC, where the intervention period is necessarily short.

Previous reviews (Brayfield & Crockett, 1955; Herzberg, Mausner, Peterson, & Capwell, 1957; Porter & Steers, 1973; Vroom 1964) have pointed out a consistent and negative relationship existing between turnover and job satisfaction. The OAI will be used to establish the reliability of this relationship in the Air Force. Of particular importance is the discovery of whether or not the relationship is causal. If so, the multidimension approach used in developing the OAI may lead to the root causes of turnover in the Air Force.

II. QUESTIONNAIRE CHARACTERISTICS

The OAI has been described in detail in previous technical reports (Gould, 1976, 1978; Tuttle et al., 1975). It is divided into three sections. Section I, General Information, consists of 51 queries concerning demographic/biographical background and attitudinal information. Section II, Occupational Attitude Information, consists of 200 statements concerning aspects of the job. The attitudes of the incumbent toward these aspects are indicated on a 9-point linear scale ranging from (1) extremely dissatisfied to (9) extremely satisfied. Items 191 through 200 in this section pertain to aspects of a supervisor's work and are only completed by airmen who supervise other people as part of their job. Section III, Importance of Job Aspects to Career Decisions, contains the 35 factors of the OAI. These factors are rated on a 9-point scale, ranging from (1) not important to (9) extremely important. At the end of Section III, space is provided for the airmen to write in additional positive or negative comments concerning their service in the Air Force.



III. SAMPLE CHARACTERISTICS

In 1975 the OAI was mailed to 10,000 Air Force enlisted personnel performing in all AFSC. Two-thirds of those sampled were first-term airmen. The sample was stratified in this manner to provide a large sample of first-termers at the time of the follow-up research a few years later. Although the return rate of questionnaires of this type has often dropped to about 50%, 7,567 (75.7%) usable OAI questionnaires were completed and returned. Table 1 shows the distribution of the returns by yeargroup based on total active Federal military service (TAFMS). Groups 2 through 5 (1 to 48 months service) were labeled "first-termers"; the N for first-termers was 5,005 or 66.1% of the sample. Groups 6 and 7 (more than 48 months service) were labeled "careerists"; the N for careerists was 2,478 or 33.7% of the sample. Table 2 shows the distribution of the returns by sex, marital status, and education level. The sample was predominantly male; only 9.5% of first-termers and 1.8% of the careerists were female. More than half of the first-termers were single, while 85.3% of the careerists were married. The education levels showed slight differences between first-termers and careerists. Of the total sample, 94.9% had a high school education or higher. Only 3.3% of the total sample had a 4-year college degree or higher.

In response to the question "If you could immediately cross-train to another AFSC, would you cross-train?" 55.3% of the first-termers and 64.4% of the careerist replied "yes." Table 3 contains the responses to the question "If separated from the Air Force today, could you obtain a civilian job which has equal or better pay and is at least as desirable as your current job;" Of the total sample, 73.9% replied "uncertain, probably yes" or "yes." While 44.3% of the first-termers replied "yes," only 33.1% of the careerists replied "yes." The computed chi-square for these responses was significant at the .001 level. When asked if they plan to reenlist, 58.6% of the first-termers said they probably will not or definitely will not reenlist at the end of their current enlistment; only 14.4% of the careerists responded in either of these two categories.

Table 4 shows the distribution of responses to attitudinal questions about the jobs airmen are currently performing. Only 55.6% of the first-termers found their job to be fairly interesting to extremely interesting, but 70.9% of the careerists rated their jobs in the same categories. Several explanations might be offered for this result: (a) a larger percentage of those who do not find their jobs interesting get out of the Air Force, (b) jobs become more interesting as the number of years in service increases, (c) the process of cognitive dissonance occurs after an airman decides to reenlist, causing careerists to perceive their jobs as interesting, or (d) airmen get a broader perspective of the types of jobs available and revise the placement of their job on their internal interest scales. Of the first-termers, 64.5% reported that their jobs utilize their talents and training fairly well or better, while 78.2% of the careerists said the same. In response to the question "In general, how satisfied are you with your present job?" 41.6% of the first-termers and 31.0% of the careerists said they were slightly to extremely dissatisfied. This question is job specific and does not reveal how satisfied they are with the Air Force itself. The computed chi-square for all three of these items was significant at the .001 level.

Several questions were asked concerning parents' and spouse's or fiance(e)'s attitudes toward the military as shown in Table 5. The strong influence of spouses and fiance(e)s is indicated by the response of 72.2% of the first-termers and 81.1% of the careerists that spouses and fiance(e)s had considerable to extremely important influence on their career decisions. Only 57.7% of the first termers' spouses and fiance(e)'s were perceived as pleased or extremely pleased with a military career. However 84.9% of the careerists' spouses or fiance(e)s were perceived as pleased or extremely pleased with a military career. Parents' attitudes were not reported to be very important in deciding on a military career. Only 24.8% and 16.7% of the first-termers and careerists, respectively, rated their parents' attitudes as considerably important or extremely important in making career decisions. However, 82.3% and 86.7% of the first termers and careerists, respectively, perceive their parents' attitude toward a military career as pleased or extremely pleased.

The airmen also indicated their family's attitude toward five facets of Air Force benefits as shown in Table 6. In general, the responses of the first termers agreed with those of the carecrists. The carecrists expressed significantly (p<.001) more family dissatisfaction than the first termers on two of the aspects: medical care, and commissary and BX. The first termers expressed significantly more (p<.001) family dissatisfaction with recreational facilities. There were no significant differences between family attitudes of first termers and carecrists on the other two aspects of benefits. Overall the perceived satisfaction was high; from 69.2% to 73.2% of the total sample reported that their families were pleased or extremely pleased with these aspects.

IV. ITEM CHARACTERISTICS

Factor analysis of the 200 items in the OAI resulted in 35 factors. The development of these factors will be discussed in Section V. The means and standard deviations of the item responses are contained in Appendix A. The 15 items with the highest job satisfaction rating means were contained in 10 of the factors (Table 7). These mean ratings ranged from 6.31 to 6.88 on the 9-point scale. The item with the highest satisfaction rating, 6.88, was No. 198, "the chance to have other people come to you for information and advice"; this item is contained in the Supervision factor. Items No. 61 and 65, "the friendliness of your co-workers" and "the protection provided by the Air Force Life Insurance program," had mean ratings of 6.73 and 6.71, respectively; these items were contained in the Opportunities for Social Contact factor. Item No. 8, "the attention given to safety in your work area," and item No. 40, "the educational opportunities provided by the surrounding community," had mean ratings of 6.68 and 6.42, respectively; they are included in the Unit Safety Program factor. Item No. 158, "the opportunity provided by the Air Force for self-improvement education," had a mean rating of 6.60; this item is included in the Personal Growth and Development factor. Items 18 and 22, "the chance to know for yourself when you do

a good job" and "the chance to be responsible for your own work," had mean ratings of 6.32 and 6.55; they are included in the Independence in Work Procedures factor. Item No. 110, "the amount of leave time you are allowed," received a mean rating of 6.47; it is contained in factor 33, Leave and Time-Off Policies. Three of the high satisfaction items, Nos. 68, 87, and 76, are contained in factor 16, Job Hazards. Item No. 25, "your personal relationship with your supervisor," and item No. 157, "the technical competence of your supervisor," received mean ratings of 6.43 and 6.38, respectively; these items are contained in the Managerial and Technical Competence of Supervisors factor. Item 20, "the opportunity to meet new people," had a mean rating of 6.37; it is contained in the Close Association with People factor. Item 116, "the importance of your job performance to the welfare of others," received a mean rating of 6.31; this item is contained in the Work Itself factor.

The items with the lowest overall mean job satisfaction ratings are presented in Table 8. These ratings are the means for all airmen responding to the OAI, first termers and careerists. There were 27 items that received mean ratings below 5.0. Of these items, there were four that more than 50% of the airmen rated in the extremely dissatisfied to slightly dissatisfied category; these were Nos. 34, 60, 1, and 182. Appendix B contains the responses of airmen to the items presented as percentage of airmen in a yeargroup rating the items in a category. The item that ranked the lowest in satisfaction was No. 34, "the opportunity for promotions in your career field," with a mean of 4.24; while 52.7% of the airmen were slightly to extremely dissatisfied on this item, only 30.4% were slightly to extremely satisfied. Item No. 60, "the cost of living in the area in which you are assigned," was the next lowest item with a mean of 4.28; while 51.9% of the airmen were slightly to extremely dissatisfied with this item, only 29.4% were slightly to extremely satisfied. Item No. 1, "the Air Force's efforts to remove irritants and sources of dissatisfaction," was the third lowest item, with a mean of 4.31; while 51.1% of the airmen were slightly to extremely dissatisfied with this area, only 31.3% of the airmen were slightly to extremely satisfied with this area. Item No. 182, "the extent to which your military pay covers your living expenses," was the ninth lowest item with a mean of 4.61; while 51.2% of the airmen were slightly to extremely dissatisfied with this item, over 38.0% were slightly to extremely satisfied.

Two other items stand out when the means are examined by yeargroup. Although item No. 52, "your pay compared to what you could make on the outside," had 45.4% of the airmen responding slightly to extremely dissatisfied, the proportion of airmen responding in this category varied as a function of years in service. For first termers, the mean ratings range from 50.1% to 51.5% in the slightly to extremely dissatisfied category. Only 39.9% of those with 5 to 8 years service, and 30.8% of those with more than 8

years service responded in these categories. Several explanations might be posited concerning this trend. Those airmen who perceive better pay on the outside may be leaving service for that reason. Another explanation might be that pay increases improve enough throughout a career to equalize Air Force pay with comparable civilian salaries. A third possibility is that airmen believe that due to their age, they might not be able to secure jobs at as high a grade level if they got out of the Air Force.

Items No. 192 through 200 pertained only to airmen who were supervisors. Approximately 2,100 of the respondents fell into this category, the majority being career airmen. The overall means for these items ranged from 5.40 to 6.88, reflecting high satisfaction of the supervisors with these aspects of their jobs. Thus, from the supervisors' point of view, the Air Force has structured their roles appropriately in areas such as number of people supervised, amount of associated paperwork, respect given, and so forth.

V. ANALYSIS OF FACTORS

The development of the 35 factors in the OAI is described by Gould (1976) and Tuttle et al. (1975). The original 348 items were administered to a sample of 3,000 airmen, mostly first termers. A principal components analysis with Varimax rotation of the responses to the items resulted in the final 35 factors. To further reduce the number of items, Gould and Christal (1976) developed an item selection computer algorithm which employed multiple linear regression techniques to select items based on the amount of

unique reliable variance that each contributed. This algorithm is titled VARSEL, Variable Selection for Multiple Purpose Prediction systems in the Absence of External Criteria. The final 200 items were refactored and found to retain the original factor structure.

After administration of the OAI to the 7,567 airmen, factor scores were computed. The means of each item loading on a factor was assigned equal weight in determining the factor scores. The factors and their means are presented in Table 9. The means for the factors ranged from 4.46 to 6.41. For the sake of discussion, the factors with means below 5.0 will be considered low satisfaction factors, the factors with means from 5.0 to 5.9 will be considered medium satisfaction factors, and the means from 6.0 and up will be considered high satisfaction factors.

The high and low satisfaction factors are presented in Table 10. Factor 20, Opportunities for Social Contact, had the highest mean rating of all the factors, 6.41; whereas 65.8% of the sample had high

satisfaction on this factor, only 10.8% had low satisfaction. Factor 17, Job Security, had a mean rating of 6.29; while 62.4% of the airmen had high satisfaction on this factor, only 13.0% had low satisfaction. Factor 18, Moral Acceptability of Job, had a mean rating of 6.17; in the total sample, 56.5% of the airmen reported high satisfaction on this factor, and only 10.9% reported low satisfaction. Factor 33, Leave and Time-Off Policies, had a mean rating of 6.15; while 62.0% of the airmen had a high satisfaction rating for this factor, only 17.4% had a low satisfaction rating. Factor 28, Supervisory Responsibilities, had a mean rating of 6.15; for this factor, 61.4% had a high satisfaction rating while only 14.7% had a low rating. Factor 25, Safety Programs and GMT Within Your Unit, had a mean rating of 6.10; for this factor, 59.5% reported high satisfaction and 15.2% reported low satisfaction. The last factor to be considered as a high satisfaction factor is No. 13, Family Attitude Toward Job, which had a mean rating of 6.07; while 53.1% of the airmen were slightly to extremely satisfied on this factor, only 12.0% of the airmen were slightly to extremely dissatisfied.

Only four factors had mean satisfaction ratings below 5.0 (Table 11). Factor 2, Cost of Living, had a mean rating of 4.46, which was the lowest mean rating that any of the factors received; only 30.6% gave this factor a high satisfaction rating, while 46.9% gave it a low rating. Factor 22, Promotion Chances Based on Ability, had a mean rating of 4.76; only 38.2% rated this item high, while 41.5% rated this factor low. Factor 26, Status in Civilian Community, received a mean rating of 4.76; only 30.7% gave this factor a high rating, while 36.1% gave it a low rating. Factor 23, Quality of Base Housing and Eating Facilities, received a rating of 4.83; only 38.2% gave this factor a high rating, and 40.6% gave it a low rating.

Both pay and promotion opportunities have received low satisfaction ratings as items and as factors. Factors more related to the work itself have received higher ratings. At first glance, this might seem to be an acceptable situation; however, research by Hallriegel and White (1973) suggests that this situation only looks good on the surface. They found that factors related to work had an effect on the level of commitment but that pay and promotion opportunities are the determinants of which job is chosen next. The literature is not unanimous on this point, however. For instance, Kraut (1975) reported that work itself was the only significant attitudinal factor determining whether an employee intended to remain with an organization. He notes that intent to stay does not relate to pay. Future analyses with the OAI will determine if this relationship exists in the Air Force.

It is interesting to look at the differences between first termers and career airmen in rating their job satisfaction. Table 12 shows the factor means derived for these two groups, it can be seen that overall, the

first-termer ratings were lower for all factors except No. 29. The career airmen rated 17 factors 6.00 or higher, while the first termers only rated one factor this high, No. 20, Opportunities for Social Contact. The three factors that received ratings below 5.00 for career airmen relate to cost of living, promotion chances based on ability, and TDY cost and conditions. The six factors rated this low by first termers related to cost of living, status in civilian community, quality of base housing and eating facilities, promotion chances based on ability, travel, and additional duties. These six factors are among the seven factors that had the lowest mean ratings for careerists. Thus, there is considerable agreement between the two groups on which areas are the most dissatisfying, the difference being in the intensity of dissatisfaction.

VI. ANALYSIS OF IMPORTANCE ITEMS

In Section III of the OAI, the airmen were asked the importance of job aspects to their career decisions. The 35 factors are contained in this section and the airmen indicate the influence which each job aspect will probably have on their career decision. The factors are rated on a 9-point scale, ranging from (1) not important to (9) extremely important. As shown in Table 13, 12 factors were ranked high in importance to career decisions. The three highest importance ratings were given to factor 34, Work Itself; factor 22, Promotion Chances Based on Ability; and factor 12, Economic Security. Work Itself was rated in the medium job satisfaction range by most airmen. Promotion Chances Based on Ability received one of the lowest overall job satisfaction ratings. Economic Security was in the middle satisfaction range and was the

26th factor from the top in job satisfaction. Of the 12 high importance factors, eight were rated in the middle range of job satisfaction by most airmen. Two of the factors, Job Security and Leave and Time-Off Policies, received both high importance and high job satisfaction ratings. However, two factors, Promotion Chances Based on Ability and Cost of Living, received high importance to career decision ratings and low job satisfaction ratings. Findings such as these provide indicants of areas in which the Air Force should place more emphasis. Factor 23, Quality of Base Housing and Eating Facilities, and factor 26, Status in Civilian Community Resulting from Military Job, were the other two factors which received low job satisfaction ratings. These factors received importance ratings in the medium and low range, respectively. The comparison of job satisfaction ratings to importance ratings may provide insights that each alone does not reveal. Overall the high importance factors received satisfaction ratings in the medium range. This suggests that the Air Force is successful in satisfying most needs related to these job aspects. The exceptions, Promotion Chances and Cost of Living, appear to warrant more attention.

VII. SUMMARY

The OAI was administered to 10,000 airmen worldwide with a response rate of 75.7%. The means of responses by years of service are included in Appendix A. Attitudinal information revealed a number of surprising and often not-so-surprising results. A larger percentage of careerists than first termers find their jobs interesting and their talents and training utilized. A larger percentage of careerists are satisfied with their jobs. The influence of spouses and fiance(e)s on career decisions is reported as being quite strong; however, only 57.7% of first termers as opposed to 84.9% of the careerists report that their spouses and fiance(e)s are pleased with a military career. Items that were rated high in satisfaction by the total sample included such job aspects as having others come to you for advice, friendliness of co-workers, safety, education opportunities, responsibility, internal feedback on work, leave policies, and supervisors. Looking at the factors that received high satisfaction responses, one finds Social Contact, Job Security, Moral Acceptability of Job, Leave Policies, Supervisory Responsibilities, Safety, and Family Attitude Toward the Job. Items that received low ratings included such job aspects as opportunities for promotion, Air Force efforts to remove irritants, cost of living, extent military pay covers living expenses, cost of TDY, on-base housing, and promotion based on ability. These findings agree with the factor ratings in which four factors received low satisfaction ratings by the total sample: Cost of Living, Promotion Chances Based on Ability, Status in Civilian Community, and Quality of Base Housing and Eating Facilities. There is considerable agreement between first termers and careerists on which factors are the most dissatisfying; differences exist in intensity of feeling rather than direction.

Factors that rated high in importance to career decisions included such job aspects as Work Itself, Promotion Chances, Economic Security, and Self-Improvement Opportunities. Of the 12 factors with high importance ratings only two were low in satisfaction ratings: Promotion Chances Based on Ability and Cost of Living. This approach to finding discrepancies between what the airmen perceive as important and what the Air Force perceives as important may provide direction to attempts to improve retention and productivity. Future research should focus on methods to diminish this perceived difference.
