

FOREWORD

This "U" military science classification system was developed by MSG Morris Swett during the period, 1915-41, when he was principal cataloger. He desired to have a practical schedule which was more detailed than the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) System and more pragmatic than the Library of Congress (LC) classification. It is a moot point whether the DDC, LC, UDC, Bliss, Colon, etc., would be so today. The important thing is, he devised a scheme which had applicability for this specialized library. MSG Swett was librarian at the U. S. Army Field Artillery School throughout most of the period from 1915 until he retired in 1954. Due to many singular activities on behalf of Fort Sill, the library was renamed in his memory during 1968.

He introduced a subject index to cover artillery areas in-depth, and also phased-over the military science portion of the collection. He switched the entire holdings from DDC between 1927 and 1929. Four military members comprised the staff at the time. The total holding numbered 34,238 volumes when he was finished. The transition to LC involved A-TX, V, Z, only. The U-UZ was his own invention. (LC still has not developed after U-UH.)

While this cataloging tool is a lasting tribute, it has obviously been revised and updated by the school-trained library cataloging professionals which have followed. By surname the group of ladies are in order of period of service: Hackett, Kerns, Hall, Wilson, and Relph.

The system is still in use here because it fills local needs. It has stood the test of time very well. As with life, this may not be everyone's "cup of tea," but it has worked in this case. The schedule which follows amounts to a working draft as development continues. Inclusion of an item, or omission, does not imply USAFAS indorsement or sanction of the compiler's point-of-view nor does it guarantee accuracy of content. Comment and criticism concerning this list is solicited.

Finally, this schedule borrows elements of the LC system, including use of tables, etc. It is not intended to replace LC, but to support it for highly specialized military library collections. Special thanks are extended to the USAFAS Word Processing Center for their kind cooperation.

INTRODUCTION

The MSL Classification System is primarily an adoption of the LC "U" classification, which specializes in field artillery. Due to local necessity, at the time, this expansion was accomplished prior to LC; and therefore, numberical positions may overlap and differ from their more philosophical approach of LC, now in its Third Edition.

Problems which plague any system (i.e., anytime one has more than one title) is that many subjects can logically be placed under various classifications. Also, scattering of fields sets-in the first time the cataloger forgets to annotate the "Subject Headings Authority," and separate subjects index.

At the close of this section are examples of cataloging decisions made by the undersigned on the basis of present, felt need, or experience. In some cases, the "U" schedule was not used due to the need to proceed with prior development.

Some areas have fallen into disuse. The UL300's have supplanted the UF160's. Drill manuals are no longer separated from technical information on a given gun. This is now done within the UL303 section, for guns and howitzers. The call number of 75mm guns, if written by Dickinson, would be: UL303 A4 (75mm) D6. It should be noted, also, that the library now uses LC author numbers (1-9) instead of the more involved Cutter tables, although more thorough, for other than open entries.

This cataloger finds the MSL "U" system a good one where expansions are required what with growth in technology, weapon systems, and concepts. Examples of representative cataloging decisions are illustrated as follows:


