



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1. Purpose of this Report. This report provides demographic information about the officers and enlisted personnel of the United States Army as of 31 October 1980. For purposes of comparison, it also includes selected information gathered from Army-wide surveys in 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979. (Individuals who desire more detailed reports on the 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979 data should consult the Army Personnel Composite reports for those years).

2. Data Source. The information presented here stems from annual, worldwide sample surveys of Army personnel conducted with the use of questionnaires. In each survey two separate random samples have been drawn, one selected from the population of all active duty Army commissioned and warrant officers and the other selected from the population of all enlisted personnel. Of the officers selected for inclusion within the sample, 3,210 officers (2,928 commissioned and 282 warrant) responded with usable answer sheets. Of the enlisted personnel selected for inclusion within the sample, 8,309 responded with usable answer sheets. The overall return rate was approximately 31% from officers and 28% from enlisted personnel. However, these rates are dwarfed somewhat by the low return rate of USAREUR and the absence of any returns from KOREA. The approximate return from the officer and enlisted personnel samples excluding USAREUR and KOREA was near 35%.

3. Notes of Caution. Because the information presented here stems from only a sample of the Army and not from a census of the entire Army population, users of the information should be cognizant of the possibility of three types of errors in making generalizations about the entire Army population. First, there is always the possibility of sampling error resulting when a sample is not a perfect microcosm of the whole Army. Secondly, because everyone selected for inclusion within the sample will not comply with the survey requests, a nonresponse bias may result. In the case of the 1980 data, 69% of the officers and 72% of the enlisted soldiers who were selected for inclusion in the sample did not respond. Therefore, because the group of actual respondents falls short of the sample sought, a user should be cautious in stating that sample data reflects the entire Army. Third, measurement error may be created by an ambiguous survey question, unclear instruction wording, or a failure of all respondents to provide true and accurate responses.
