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FOREWARD

Tripler Department of Clinical Investigation had an exciting year in FY92. Despite serious challenges to research in the form of personnel freezes, funding cuts, and increasing demands on health care professionals to provide clinical services, there was no significant fall in research productivity. More impressively, Dr. Cathy Yamauchi-Uyehara was awarded an American Heart Association grant after submitting the highest ranked proposal This was made more significant in view of for the AHA district. the AHA policy to not award grants to military investigators. The Joint Tripler AMC/Kapiolani Medical Center for Women and Children's Neonatal Fellowship Program, which conducts all nonhuman studies in Tripler's DCI, has continued to maintain its position at the forefront of neonatal pulmonary medicine. The contributions of Dr. John Claybaugh, Tripler's senior scientist, to both research and administration of DCI are undiminished. MAJ Thomas Mundie has provided inspiration to all phases of research at Tripler, and especially to the Joint Neonatal Fellowship Program.

The importance of nursing in health care delivery has finally been officially recognized. Through the generosity of the Department of Nursing, Tripler DCI has a full time Director of Nursing Research. MAJ DeRuvo has proved an outstanding resource for not only nursing but clinical research in general. Having been assigned to Tripler for only a short time, she has already secured several grants.

Tripler DCI has continued its annual seminar entitled Introduction to Research for Health Care Providers, and presented a much improved program this year. Additionally, DCI introduced a Basic Science to Clinical Medicine seminar series, with the first program scheduled for January 1993 being entitled Free Radicals and Reperfusion Injuries.

The success of Tripler's DCI is not dependent strictly on its personnel. Recognition of the support of LTC Heckert (Chief, Resource Management), MAJ Dickson (Chief, Personnel Section, Resource Management), COL Charles Jones (DCCS), and the chiefs of all clinical departments at Tripler can not be overemphasized. In a time when clinical departments are taking cuts in personnel and supply dollars, these people protected TAMC DCI from undue hardships.

To COL Harrison and MAJ Grabenstein - Thank You. Your on-site visit provided us with a tremendous amount of assistance, and reemphasized HCSCIA's commitment to supporting all DCIs.

Finally, I have to recognize the one person who has endured the unenviable task of maintaining protocols, relentlessly pursuing principal investigators to obtain needed changes or documents, interfaced with the new and improved HCSCIA staff, single-handedly preparing this Annual Progress Report while performing all those tasks which are done to support the animal use and CIC/HUC committees, and generally keeping TAMC DCI and Tripler along the straight and narrow road to compliance with regulations. 

F. :

The major problems have remained unchanged. As hospital budgets become increasingly linked to clinical workloads, the increasing demand on clinician time has reduced their ability to participate in research. Personnel freezes during FY92 handicapped research both within TAMC DCI and Tripler AMC as a whole. Funding problems have also delayed the installation of equipment which has been purchased, postponing indefinitely research utilizing that equipment.
