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13. ABSTRACT (Maximum 200) The goal of this study was to determine military environmental factors associated with violence towards service women. A national sample of 558 women veterans completed a computer-assisted telephone interview assessing their experiences with in-military sexual harassment, unwanted sexual touching, physical assault and rape. Pre-military physical and sexual victimization events and demographic factors were additionally considered as risk factors for in-military violence. Vocational, health status, and psychological differences (including findings of post-traumatic stress disorder, depression, anxiety, alcohol dependence, and panic disorder) between victimized and non-victimized women were also described.				
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FOREWORD

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Introduction

Violence in the workplace, including sexual assault, is clearly an occupational hazard for women. Lifetime rates of rape for American women may be as high as 13%, and 22% of American women report some form of sexual assault during their life (National Victim Center, 1992). Factors associated with the occurrence of workplace sexual violence have not been well studied despite research indicating sexual victimization is not a random event and some occupations, such as military service, increase women's risk of victimization. A Pentagon survey of 20,000 active Army personnel found in 1990 alone the rate of sexual assault in the Army was 129 rape cases per 100,000 population. This occurrence compared unfavorably to 1990 FBI national statistics of 81 rape cases per 100,000 civilians (Roche, 1993). Public Law 102-585, Women's Health Care Act of 1992 (Title I - Women Veterans Health Programs) has resulted in the increased visibility of women veterans experiencing sexual trauma during active duty. This study was designed to further examine the association between the military environment and sexual victimization and to determine vocational impairment resulting from consequent health status impairment and psychological outcomes (such as post-traumatic stress disorder). Such information is necessary to develop and implement appropriate prevention strategies that will directly improve the safety, health, and military effectiveness of service women.

Background

Women are entering the military in dramatically increasing numbers and assuming traditionally male work assignments. In the military theater of South-east Asia, women comprised less than 2% of the armed forces with 90% occupying administrative positions. In the Persian Gulf War, women made up 11% of the armed forces, and less than half were employed administratively (Silberman, 1993). Unfortunately few studies specific to service women are available.

The Department of Defense (DOD) performed one of the largest (12,500 active personnel) scientific surveys of sexual harassment (Martindale, 1988). Female personnel (64%) were almost four times as likely as male personnel (17%) to experience some form of sexual harassment. Five per cent of female service women had experienced actual or attempted rape. The proportion of women reporting sexual harassment was highest when the commanding officer (C.O.) encouraged sexual harassment than when the C.O.s were indifferent or neutral; and lowest when the C.O. discouraged sexual harassment.

Subsequently a Navy-wide survey of sexual harassment was performed in 1989. Researchers discovered that 68% of their service women reported that they had been sexually harassed during the 1-year survey period while on duty, on base, or off duty aboard ship, compared to 5% of service men. Seven percent of service women reported attempted or actual rape or assault (Culbertson, et al, 1989).

A 1987 -1991 pentagon survey of sexual harassment among 20,000 active Army personnel found that 64% of women reported they had been sexually harassed during their time in the military. Fifteen percent had been touched or cornered and sexual assault or attempted sexual assault reportedly occurred in 3% of women. In 1990 alone, the rate of sexual assault in the Army was 129 rape cases per 100,000 population. In contrast, FBI national statistics in 1990 were a rate of 81 rape cases per 100,000 (Roche, 1993). The Pentagon (1992) surveyed readjustment counseling services at Vietnam Veterans Outreach Centers and found 26% of women presented with stress related to sexual trauma incurred on active duty (Silberman, 1993).

A report on sexual assault in Desert Storm Veterans studied 142 women veterans who responded to a self report survey of sexual harassment (Wolf, et al., 1992). Verbal sexual harassment was reported by 63% (n=90) of respondents, physical touching by 31% (n=44), and attempted or completed rape by 8% (n=11). This study also reported that the effects of harassment and combat exposure on mental health outcome appear to be additive and not interactive. In a 1997 Department of the Army study of active duty personnel, exposure to sexual

trauma appeared to be service women's greatest risk factor for post-traumatic stress disorder (Knudson, et al., 1998).

In 1995 DoD, replicating their 1988 research, surveyed active duty personnel to determine if rates of unwanted sexual attention across all services had changed (Bastian et al., 1996). Overall rates declined with 53% of women reporting unwanted, uninvited sexual attention; 29% reporting sexual touching, cornering, or pinching; and 4% reporting attempted or completed rape. Servicewomen most frequently cited military co-workers (44%) or military personnel of higher rank/grade (43%) as the perpetrators. These unwanted sexual behaviors primarily occurred on military installations, at work and during duty hours. Despite the decline in rates, sexual misconduct was acknowledged to persist as a major challenge that all Services must continue to combat.

Environmental Factors and Sexual Victimization

Environmental factors, emotional variables, and opportunity are all interrelated to sexual victimization, but have not been carefully investigated. The interplay of these variables appears to be influenced by work and leisure settings.

Burt (1978, 1980) theorized that social attitudes are an important causative factor in sexual victimization. A multicultural study found that acceptance of rape myths ("all women want to be raped", "she was asking for it") was significantly correlated with restrictive beliefs about women's social roles and rights (Costin & Schwarz, 1987). Women with low seniority, low-status or low-skill jobs, or those who work in an area where they are a threatening minority are more apt to be the targets of sexual victimization. (Gruber & Bjorn, 1989). Highly skewed sex ratios at work can facilitate sex-role spill over, the carryover of gender-based roles into the work setting. Women performing traditional jobs face the problem of being seen by men in such settings as sex objects. Women in nontraditional jobs face the problems of being visible role deviants which often results in a sexualized work environment with increased sexual overtures at work (Guttek & Cohen, 1987).

It has been hypothesized that risk of victimization increases directly with the amount of contact a woman has with potential perpetrators that sexually aggress (Koss & Dinero, 1989). Over 80% of sexual assaults reported by college-age and adult women are committed by acquaintances (Koss, 1985; Koss et al, 1988). In the work setting, isolation of workers from fellow employees and the public appears to increase the risk of work-related rape. Rapes frequently occur between late evening and early morning (between the hours of 7 pm and 6 am) and 85% of victims in one study were working alone at the time of the incident (Alexander et al, 1993).

In the social setting, Muehlenhard & Linton (1987) found that dates where high levels of sexual aggression occurred were characterized by heavier amounts of drinking by both victim and perpetrator, when compared with non aggressive dates. In a survey of male students, greater self-reported sexual aggression was characterized by frequent use of alcohol, violent and degrading pornography, and involvement in peer groups that reinforce highly sexualized views of women. Highly aggressive men were typified by greater hostility toward women, which may decrease their sensitivity to their victims' suffering or encourage greater aggression in the face of resistance (Allgeier, 1986; Koss, 1985; Koss & Dinero, 1992). Environmental risk factors of sexual victimization in the military environment have not previously been studied in a systematic fashion.

Research Questions

1. What military environmental factors are associated with sexual victimization of service women?
2. How does sexual victimization impair self reported military job performance, job satisfaction, and service attrition or longevity of affected service women?

3. How is the military response to victimization reports associated with subsequent psychological functioning and health status outcomes of affected women veterans?
4. How is psychological functioning and health status of women veterans affected by sexual victimization?

Methods

Subjects

The study design involved a historical cohort study of women veterans who had served in Vietnam, post-Vietnam, or the Persian Gulf War eras. Results from a pilot study indicated sexual violence occurred significantly more often in women serving in Vietnam and subsequent eras, as compared to those serving previously. A national registry of 8,693 women veterans serving in these periods was compiled from the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) comprehensive women's health care centers registries. Geographic regions of the United States of subjects in the registry included the north-east (Boston), south (Durham, Tampa), mid-central (Minneapolis, Chicago); and west coast (Los Angeles). Women veterans included in these registries have either: 1) obtained treatment at a Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC) or Vet Center, 2) sought a service-connected disability, 3) attended local veteran's conferences, or 4) answered newspaper advertisements requesting registration for mailing lists. Based upon the pilot data and a conservative 17% response rate, a random sample, stratified by region and era of service, consisting of 2,172 subjects was selected from the registry to achieve a final desired sample of 550 participants.

Data Collection

Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval was obtained from The U.S. Army Medical Research Command (USAMRC), Iowa City Veterans' Affairs Medical Center (VAMC) and The University of Iowa. Cover letters with information summaries and consent forms were sent with postage paid return envelopes to potential subjects in a staged process. Written informed consent was required by USAMRC's IRB. Mailings (n=2,172) were distributed over a six-month period (September 1996 to March 1997) in order to minimize the lag between obtaining consent and participation. Follow-up letters were mailed to non-responders approximately six weeks following initial contact. Subjects returning consent forms were scheduled for a computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI) performed by The University of Iowa Social Science Institute (ISSI, Iowa City, Iowa). The software used for this project was Ci3-CATI (version 1.1). Range and logic edits were built into the structured interview so that interviewers could correct erroneous entries during the interview. All interviewers were experienced, female interviewers who completed structured training specific to this research. Interviewer performance and data quality were monitored by ISSI and co-investigators. Subjects who completed the interview were compensated \$40 for their participation.

Media coverage of alleged sexual misconduct at The Aberdeen Proving Grounds occurred midway through data collection for this project. To assess the possible biasing of responses, a brief self-report questionnaire addressing the impact of media coverage on their participation was mailed to women following interview completion. Of the 75% (n=365) who responded, the majority (83%, n=336) were either unaware of the media coverage or were aware but felt it did not affect their answers. Conversely, 7% (n=29) were aware of the media and believed that their answers were affected: most noting that the coverage normalized their experiences and allowed them to feel more comfortable in answering sensitive questions honestly (93%, n=27).

To determine whether respondents were representative of women in the national registry, a random sample of 200 non-responders was selected. Demographic information obtained through the DVA decentralized electronic claims databases (Austin, TX) and compared to that of study participants. Fifty non-responders were interviewed by telephone to determine their reasons for not participating in this research, and self-appraisal of their health. No significant differences were found between the study participants and non-responders in branch or era of military service, or in the number of years since discharge. However, study participants were slightly older

(40.5 years versus 37.3; $p < .000$), had entered the military at an earlier time (18.2 years since first entry vs. 15.4; $p < .001$), and were more likely to have ever been married (71% vs. 58%; $p < .007$). Participants were also more likely to have service-connected disabilities for medical (59% vs. 50%; $P < .0267$) or for psychiatric disorders (17% vs. 8%; $p < .0015$). Conversely, telephone interviewed non-responders were almost twice as likely to report poor or fair health as participants (50% vs. 27%; $p < .009$).

Fifty-six percent ($n=28$) of non-responders contacted by telephone stated that they did receive mailed information about the study. Reasons for not participating given most frequently included: being too busy (50%); belief the topic (sexual victimization) was not reflective of their military experience (50%), or conversely that the topic was too close to their own military experiences (32%) and there was a fear the interview would bring back bad memories (29%).

Research Instruments

The computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI) developed for this research included demographic and self-report questions specific to the participant's medical history; experience of physical assault and rape. In addition to basic demographic, medical, and occupational information, subjects were asked closed end questions regarding types of sexual violence and physical assault that occurred prior to, during, and following military service. Questionnaires used in the CATI (see Appendix One) included the following:

Medical Outcomes Study Short Form, 36-Item General Health Survey (SF-36). The SF-36 measures self-reported health-related quality of life (HRQL) including both positive and negative aspects of functioning and well-being. The 36 questions are allocated to eight scales: physical functioning (PF), physical role (PR), bodily pain (BP), general health perceptions (GH), vitality (VT), social function (SF), mental health (MH), and emotional role (ER). The SF-36 has been widely used in a variety of settings and shown to have excellent reliability and validity. It has demonstrated sensitivity to health differences in the general population and in patients with chronic diseases, and is predictive of health outcomes over time.

Diagnostic Interview Schedule-Revised (DIS-IV-R). The DIS-III-R has been used extensively in psychiatric literature to make lifetime diagnoses in accordance with DSM-III-R criteria for symptoms. It provides questions in making lifetime diagnoses, but achieves brevity by attempting to classify subjects of non-cases as soon as it can be determined whether or not positive diagnostic criteria will be met. For the purposes of this study the following subscales were used: post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD); tobacco; panic; generalized anxiety; phobia-agoraphobia; major depressive episode; alcohol; drugs.

The Symptom Checklist-90-Revised (SCL-90-R). The SCL-90-R is a commonly used measure of current, point-in-time, psychological symptom status. It is composed of nine primary symptom dimension that include: obsessive-compulsive, interpersonal sensitivity, depression, anxiety, hostility, phobic anxiety, paranoid ideation, psychoticism, post-traumatic stress disorder, and a global indice of distress.

Military Environment Scale (MES). The MES was developed the pilot study for this research. It was developed for both clinical and research use to examine different parameters of the service woman's military experience. These include: types and severity of sexual victimization; work environment; living environment; leisure environment; ranking service member gender-related conduct; health care access; and self-concept. In addition, demographic information and pre military trauma and family environment questions are included. Questions regarding the servicewoman and military response to reported physical or sexual misconduct were modified from the 1988 DoD survey (Martindale, 1988). Respondents were asked to indicate how frequently each of a series of statements was true of their military experiences, generally on a scale from 1 ('never') to 5 ('almost always'). For some items, respondents to indicate the level of distress they felt at the time due to a particular experience if they rated the item '2' (rarely) or higher. Level of distress was scaled from 1 ('very low') to 5 ('very high'). In summarizing data, those items which occurred sometimes, often, or almost always (rated 3-5) were grouped together to indicate that an event, perception, or belief was present, whereas those said to occur rarely or never (rated 1-2) were grouped to indicate the absence of the same event.

The U.S. Merit Systems Protection Board Sexual Harassment Questionnaire (vocational impairment subscale). Used as a survey in landmark studies (1980, 1987) of sexual harassment in the federal workplace, this interview was used to assess vocational outcomes. The vocational impairment subscale addresses the following vocational impairments due to unwanted sexual attention: sick leave usage; annual leave usage; leave without pay usage, and job productivity. For the purposes of this study, additional questions about accidents at work were included.

Study Definitions

Rape was defined as any act that occurred without an individual's consent which involved the use of force or threat of force, and included attempted or completed sexual penetration of the victim's vagina, mouth or rectum.

Physical assault was defined as any act not occurring during rape or attempted rape whereby the individual believed that they were in physical danger. These events included being pushed, shoved, grabbed, slapped, kicked, beaten, choked, threatened or attacked with a weapon or other object.

Domestic violence was defined as physical assault initiated by a spouse or partner. Pre-military rape and domestic violence were defined as previously indicated but occurring prior to enlistment. The experience of childhood physical and sexual abuse were queried in individual questions without a detailed definition provided to subjects.

Dual victimization is used to describe women who experience both rape and physical assault.

Results

Participants

Twenty-two percent (n=473) of registry information about potential subjects was found to be invalid at the time of survey, including returned mail due to incorrect address (n=449), incorrect era of service (n=18) or gender (n=4), or deceased subjects (n=3). Thirteen respondents directly refused participation and 6 withdrew consent when contacted by the interviewer. Six subjects who initially consented were lost to participation due to an inability to recontact them by telephone or mail. An additional 82 consenting subjects were not interviewed because the target sample size had been reached and funding limitations precluded increasing the sample. Therefore a response rate of 38% (n=640) was obtained and 558 subjects participated. It is noteworthy that 44% (n=22) of non-responders contacted by telephone reported that they never received mailed information about the study. The majority (82%, n=18) stated they would have participated in this research if study information summarized by the interviewer had been received.

General Demographic Information

The average age of respondents in the sample was 40.5 years (s.d.= 9.2 years). The majority of respondents were white (73.4%). One third were married at the time of the interview, while 29% had never been married. More than 30% (n=164) were college graduates and 53% (n=298) had completed some college; one fourth were currently enrolled in school at least part time. More than 60% (n=343) were employed at least part-time; 10% (n=53) were unable to work due to disability. More than half had annual household incomes over \$25,000, yet 22.6% had annual incomes below \$15,000. Data describing the full sample are presented in Table 1.

Military Data

All branches of the armed forces were represented; the majority of respondents served in the Army (50.4%), followed by Air Force (23.1%) and Navy (21.0%). Service eras ranged from World War II through recent discharge (within the survey year, 1996-97); all respondents who served prior to Vietnam completed at least a portion of their active duty service during 1964 or later. Ten percent of participants (n=58) held officer rank. Ninety-nine subjects (17.7%) served in a combat zone, 30% (n=170) served in a field unit, and 7% (n=39) served on sea duty. Two-thirds of the subjects completed their original tour of duty, while 39% (n=218) served more than one tour. Over one-third (n=199) served in the Reserves or National Guard, in addition to their active-duty status; 9.1% were currently serving in a Reserve or National Guard unit at the time of the interview. On average, respondents first entered active duty service 18.2 years ago (± 8.7 years); average time since final discharge from active duty was 11.5 years (± 8.9 years). Demographic data related to military service for the full sample are presented in Table 2.

Health Status and Health Care Descriptors

Descriptive data regarding health status and health care utilization summarized here are presented in Table 3.

Service-connected disability. Two-thirds (n=372) of respondents were service-connected for medical or psychiatric disabilities. More than half (n=326) were service-connected for a medical disability, 11.3% (n=63) for a psychiatric condition other than post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), and 7.7% were service-connected for PTSD. Ten percent (n=58) were service-connected for both medical and psychiatric disabilities. Sixty-five percent (n=362) of respondents said they had chronic medical problems. Almost one-fourth (n=133) had taken prescription medication for a psychiatric or emotional problem within the 30 days prior to their interview.

Insurance. Fewer than 50% (n=271) of the sample said they had any type of private insurance. One-third (n=186) reported having no insurance, while 17.7% (n=99) were eligible for Medicare, Medicaid, or other indigent care insurance.

Use of Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC) Health Services. We asked about use of services at VAMCs for any reason, then specifically for treatment of emotional problems or substance abuse. Given that the sample was drawn from VAMC registries, it was expected that a large portion of respondents would be utilizers of VAMC services. Approximately 40% (n=219) of subjects said they received some, but not all, of their health care through a VAMC, while 44% (n=246) said they used VAMCs for all health care needs. Sixteen percent (n=91) of respondents said they did not use any VAMC health services.

Approximately 25% (n=134) of women admitted being hospitalized for treatment of an emotional problem at some point during her lifetime. Eighty-three of these women (62%) were hospitalized at some time for this treatment at a VA medical center, while 51 (38%) said their hospitalization for emotional problems occurred somewhere other than a VA medical center. Almost half (n=296) the respondents said they received outpatient treatment for emotional problems during their lifetime. Ninety-five of these women (36.5%) said their treatment was obtained outside the VA system, while the same number said they received all their outpatient treatment through a VAMC.

Fewer than 10% of the sample said they received any inpatient or outpatient treatment for substance abuse. Of those who were hospitalized (n=54), 61% reported at least some of their inpatient treatment was obtained at a VAMC. Outpatient treatment for substance abuse was acknowledged by 44 subjects. Of these, 37% obtained at least some of their treatment at a VAMC.

On average, respondents saw a physician ten times during the 12 months preceding the interview for health care other than pregnancy or childbirth (mean = 10.0, s.d. = 14.5). The median number of physician visits was five. Table 3. Current Health Status and Health Care Utilization

Physical and Sexual Violence

Table 4 presents physical and sexual violence participants reported to experience prior to, during, and following military service.

Prior to Military Service One third of the subjects reported they joined the military at least in part to escape an abusive or distressing home life. The experience of childhood and adult violence prior to military service was prevalent in this sample with 36% (n= 203) reporting childhood or teenage physical abuse; 37% (n=205) childhood or teenage sexual abuse; 28% (n=156) reported they were raped prior to military service; and, 21% (n=115) had experienced domestic violence.

During Military Service In-military unwanted sexual behaviors and physical violence were prevalent in the sample. More than 75% (n=432) of respondents reported experiences of sexual harassment during their military service. More than half (n=308) reported other unwanted sexual contact including forced kissing, touching, and genital fondling. Thirty percent (n=167) experienced one or more rapes or attempts while 35% (n=197) reported one or more occurrence of physical assault or threat of physical assault. Five percent (n=28) of those raped reported that they had been gang raped (more than one perpetrator at once). Over half of women acknowledging rape (54%, n=90) had been raped at least twice (ranging up to 36 occasions). Over half of women acknowledging physical assault (57%, n=113) had been assaulted at least twice (ranging up to more than 20 occurrences).

Following Military Discharge Fewer than 10% (n=46) of subjects reported experiencing rape following discharge from the military. All but five of these women also reported at least one form of in-military violence or unwanted sexual contact. Post-discharge physical assault was reported by 21% (n=119) of respondents, with 72% (n=86) of these women reporting domestic violence. 15.4% reported the occurrence of domestic violence in the years following military discharge.

Socio-Demographic Characteristics by Type of In-Military Violence

See Table 5 for socio-demographic characteristics of the sample by type in-military victimization. Pre-military physical and sexual abuse, joining the military to escape an abusive or distressing home life, and current use of prescription medications for emotional or psychiatric problems were reported twice as often in women either sexually or physically assaulted as in non-victimized peers. A higher proportion of women reporting both types of trauma (dually-traumatized) were also more likely to endorse these victimizations as well as pre-military rape and domestic violence when compared to non-victimized women. This dually-traumatized group also had received service-connected disabilities for psychiatric, or both psychiatric and medical disorders, and current prescription medication use for emotional or psychiatric problems more than twice as often as women experiencing no violence. Dually-traumatized women also had the highest rate of chronic medical problems of all groups. Similarly, women in this group were significantly more likely not to work because of disability ($p < .0002$).

Women who acknowledged physical assault or rape were significantly more likely to have attended or completed college than peers denying victimization. Marital separation or divorce occurred significantly more often in women who were physically assaulted in comparison with women not victimized in military. It is important to note, however, that 70% of physical assaults in military were initiated by someone other than a spouse or other significant relationship. Although physical assault or rape was reported among similar proportions of officers and enlisted personnel, a significantly higher proportion of enlisted women experienced both traumas.

Women who were not victimized were significantly older at age of military entry than women who were both raped and physically assaulted ($p < .0005$; 23 years old vs 20 years old). Women who were not victimized in military currently (1996) are significantly older ($p < .05$, 44 years) than women who were sexually harassed (39 years), experienced unwanted sexual contact (40 years), were physically assaulted (40 years), raped (41 years), or dually victimized (40 years). There were no significant differences between victimization and era of service. These findings indicate that women who enter the military at younger ages, or younger women in the military may be at increased risk of violence.

1. What military environmental factors are associated with sexual victimization of service women ?

Understanding service women's exposure to violence requires a description of the context of their routine experiences. It is also necessary to profile each type of in military violence by location, time of day of occurrence and perpetrator. Finally, determination of the relative risk of experiencing each form of victimization by military environmental factors will assist us to understand factors affecting risk of violence. Given our findings, we felt this report would be most complete and useful if we included women who experienced physical assault during their military service. In order to prescribe more accurate descriptors of environment or perpetrator profiles, we have also chosen to break victimization groups into mutually exclusive categories when appropriate to do so.

The Military Environment Of All Participants

Table 6 describes the military environment for the entire population of participants.

Military Work Environment. The vast majority of women said that their military assignments placed them in contact with personnel that made their work experiences positive (n=495, 89%) and that military coworkers were a source of emotional support (n=434, 78%). More than 80% (n=453) said they had ready access to gynecological care, while 46% (n=259) had access to psychological counseling services. (Thirty percent of subjects said they did not request access to psychological services and did not indicate if it was readily available if it had been needed.)

Unwanted sexual attention was reported in response to several questions. More than half of subjects (n=364, 65%) indicated that sexually demeaning comments, behaviors, or pornography were present at their duty station at least sometimes, with 84% of these women (n=305) indicating moderate to very high distress at the time in response to its presence. Sixty percent of respondents (n=336) said they experienced unwanted sexual advances, sexual remarks, or pressure for dates while on duty and 98% (n=328) experienced moderate to very high distress. A similar proportion of women said they felt that soldiers stared at their body while they were on duty (n=358, 64%), with 72% (n=258) experiencing moderate to very high distress as a consequence. Three out of five respondents (n=327, 59%) thought that being a female performing her particular job in the military put her at greater risk for uninvited sexual teasing, remarks, jokes, or pressure for dates relative to male peers working in the same job.

Several women reported feeling at physical risk from their coworkers as well. More than one-third of respondents (n=202, 36%) said they were in situations on duty in which they felt physically intimidated or unsafe because of the number of male personnel working around them. An additional 122 women (22%) said the event occurred rarely; however, the total number of women who reported experiencing moderate to very high distress as a result of these unsafe situations included some of the women who reported the event occurred rarely (n=229 of 324, 71%). Non-combat-related violence was reported to occur by 163 respondents (29%), with 162 women (29%) reporting the event occurred rarely. Of these total women (n=325), 62% (n=200) reported experiencing moderate to very high distress as a consequence. More than one in five women (n=127, 23%) reported being armed or ready for self-defense on base due to fear of rape, violence, or sexual harassment. One in eight subjects (n=67, 12%) reported being threatened or charged with a formal military disciplinary action (e.g., Captain's Mast) for refusing to follow orders she felt put her in places of risk because of her gender.

Living Environment. Forty-four percent (n=247) of respondents lived on base at some time during their military service other than basic training; 14% (n=80) said they lived on base the entire time of their service. A total of 228 subjects (41%) said they shared sleeping quarters or barracks with both men and women on base at least sometimes, with an additional 79 (14%) saying it occurred rarely during their service. Sixty percent of those who ever shared sleeping quarters (n=184) reported moderate to very high distress as a consequence of coed sleeping arrangements.

Sexual activities within sleeping quarters was a source of distress for some respondents. One-third (n=188) reported that heterosexual sexual activities occurred at least sometimes, with an additional 14% (n=79) reporting it occurred, but rarely. Of these 267 women, 119 (45%) reported moderate to very high levels of distress as a result. Fewer than 20% of women (n=105, 19%) said they observed homosexual sexual activities in their sleeping quarters sometimes to almost always; an additional 14.5% (n=81) said these activities rarely occurred. Of the 186 women reporting any occurrence of homosexual activities in their sleeping quarters, 47% (n=88) reported moderate to very high distress in response. One-fourth of subjects (n=138) said they experienced unwanted sexual advancements, sexual remarks, or pressure for dates in their sleeping quarters; another 21% (n=119) said these events occurred only rarely. Of the 257 women who reported any such occurrence, 65% (n=166) reported moderate to very high levels of distress as a consequence.

Ninety-six women (17%) reported being guarded by assigned soldiers at any time during their service because of a risk of rape, sexual harassment, or violence. Thirty-one percent of subjects (n=174) reported feeling physically and/or sexually at risk of harm when using the latrines or shower at least sometimes. Over 20% of respondents (n=115) reported living off base or attempting to move off base during some portion of their service to have leisure time free of sexual harassment; 15% (n=81) moved or attempted to move off base to feel safer from threat of violence or rape.

Ranking Officer/Immediate Supervisor Behavior. Approximately one-third of women (n=198, 35%) said their ranking officer asked them to perform sex-role stereotyped jobs in addition to their regular job sometimes to almost always, while an additional 12.5% said this behavior occurred occasionally. The ranking officer or immediate supervisor was said to make sexually demeaning comments or gestures to the respondent in 35% of cases (n=193) and rarely by an additional 18% (n=98). In addition, 38% of respondents (n=211) said their ranking officer/immediate supervisor allowed others in the unit to make such comments or behaviors in her presence at least sometimes, with another 15% (n=86) saying the event occurred, but rarely. A total of 232 respondents (42%) reported moderate to very high levels of distress in response to these behaviors. Twenty percent (n=113) of women reported ever being told by a ranking officer or immediate supervisor that she could exchange sex for privileges or promotion. Finally, nine percent (n=51) of respondents acknowledged ever being threatened with formal military disciplinary action for refusing to perform sexual favors (45% of those told they could exchange sex for privileges or promotion).

Response to Military Environment. Some women took steps to reduce the risk of sexual harassment or to draw less attention to themselves in response to the military environment. Twenty-eight percent (n=155) of respondents said they deliberately tried to make themselves look more masculine or unattractive in order to draw less attention from male soldiers or civilians; the same number of subjects said they tried to behave in ways to be less noticeable, such as being less friendly or not looking people in the eyes. Thirty-six percent (n=201) said they intentionally socialized only with groups of women to be safe and/or less likely to be sexually harassed. Almost half of respondents (n=271, 49%) said there were 'never' to 'sometimes' places on base where they could go for leisure without fear of assault or harassment; 69% (n=186) of these reported moderate to very high levels of distress as a result of limited leisure space. Twenty-eight percent (n=154) of respondents said they became involved in a relationship at some time to try and avoid the sexual harassment associated with being unattached. Thirty-five percent (n=198) believed that being married reduced a woman's risk of sexual harassment compared to unmarried women. Fifteen percent (n=81) moved off base at some time in their military service because they wanted to feel safer from the threat of violence or rape, and twenty-one percent (n=115) because they wanted to have leisure time without being sexually harassed.

Distress Due to Military Environment. Women acknowledged the highest distress (high and very high) to work environment factors such as: their ranking officer or immediate supervisor allowing others in the unit to make sexually demeaning comments or behaviors in their presence (50%), and on duty pressure for dates (44%), and experiencing sexually demeaning comments, behaviors, or pornography in the duty station (28%). Distress levels appeared to be in response to the living environment factors were overall not as great but were in response to a wider variety of environmental factors such as: feeling physically intimidated by the number of male soldiers around you (43%), pressure for dates in sleeping quarters (41%), feeling there were no places to go for leisure without fear of assault or harassment (38%), observing homosexual activities (29%) or heterosexual activities (27%) in living quarters on base, and sharing living quarters with both men and women (18%).

Profiles of In-Military Violence

In determining military environmental risk factors associated with victimization it is also important to provide profiles of location, time of day, and perpetrators to begin establishing a context of violence. Tables 7 and 8 presents these descriptors of the location, time by victimization group. It is important to note that because of repeat and gang victimization response choices are not mutually exclusive and percentages do not add up to one hundred percent.

All forms of violence were reported to occur most frequently on base and were perpetrated most often by males. Non-commissioned officers were consistently the most likely to be perpetrators of all forms of violence. However, superiors in the chain of command and commissioned officers were frequently offenders. Peers of similar rank were more likely to be perpetrators than soldiers with lower rank.

Although harassment was reported to occur more frequently between noon and 6 pm, more severe forms of violence (unwanted sexual contact, rape, physical assault, and both rape and physical assault) occurred more frequently in barracks or sleeping quarters on base. The more severe forms of victimization were perpetrated far more often by someone who had been sexually harassing the victim (see table 9) and someone using alcohol or drugs. Alcohol or drug utilization by the victim was highest in women reporting rape.

Factors Associated with In-Military Violence

Relative Risk of In-Military Violence Following Childhood Victimization. Data on the relative risk of repeat victimization in military given each type of pre-military violence are presented in Table 10. In general, veterans who reported childhood violence were about twice as likely to experience in-military physical and sexual violence or unwanted sexual contact.

Relative Risk of In-Military Violence Associated With Military Environment Variables. In order to determine the relative risk of in-military violence associated with each of the variables assessed by the Military Environment Survey (See Table 11), all scaled items were dichotomously recoded as follows: 'never' (1) and 'rarely' (2) were set to '0' (didn't occur); 'sometimes' (3), 'often' (4), and 'almost always' (5) were set to '1' (event occurred). Pearson chi-square analyses were performed to determine if exposure to the environmental factor was associated with increased risk of sexual harassment, unwanted sexual contact, rape, and physical assault. Each analysis was followed by calculation of the relative risk when significant differences were found. All relative risk ratios presented in Table 10 are significant at an alpha level of .05 or less.

As expected, women who reported the presence of sexually demeaning comments . at the duty station or experiences of unwanted sexual advances on duty were more likely to report sexual harassment (respectively, 14.7 and 18.1 times more likely). Women who reported the presence of these behaviors in their military environment were seven times more likely to report unwanted sexual contact, and 3 to 5 times more likely to report in-military rape or physical assault. Feeling that other military personnel stared at her body on duty increased the odds that a woman reported sexual harassment by six times; reports of unwanted sexual contact and rape were four times more likely, and physical assault occurred 2.5 times more often.

Being in a job that put her at increased risk of sexual teasing or pressure for dates or being in situations in which she felt unsafe because of the number of male personnel was associated with 8.3 times the reported cases of sexual harassment, 4.4 to 5.7 times more frequent reports of unwanted sexual contact, and a three- to four-fold increase in reports of rape or physical assault. Women who said they observed non-combat-related violence among military personnel on duty or who were themselves armed or ready for self-defense on base due to fears of rape, violence, or sexual harassment were four to five times more likely to report sexual harassment, three to four times more likely to report unwanted sexual contact, and two to four times more likely to experience rape or physical assault. Subjects who were threatened or charged with disciplinary actions for refusing to follow orders that put them in places of increased risk because of gender were more than 20 times as likely to report sexual harassment as their peers who did not experience these types of threats or charges. Experience with such threats or charges was associated with a three- to four-fold increase in reports of unwanted sexual contact, rape, and physical assault.

2. How does sexual victimization impair self reported military job performance, job satisfaction, and service attrition or longevity of affected service women?

Victimization during military service appeared to profoundly affect service women's ability to perform their jobs, their physical and emotional well-being and their opinions about the military (see Table 12). Women dually traumatized in-military reported that their ability to perform their jobs, their physical and emotional well-being, and their opinions about the military as most adversely affected. It should not be overlooked that women who were sexually harassed or experienced unwanted sexual touching noted up to four times greater negative effects than women with no in-military victimization. Fitness for service and military readiness were reported to be adversely affected in at least half of dually traumatized women, and in 41% of those raped and approximately one third of those physically assaulted. Women who experienced physical assault also reported the greatest negative effect on self-esteem.

Service women reported that in-military violence does cause them to leave the military early. Nearly half of women experiencing dual victimization left the military early followed in frequency by one-third women who experienced rape, then more than a quarter of women who were physically assaulted.

Missed or Light Duty Days by In-Military Violence Group

All forms of violence experienced by service women during military affected the number of work days missed and number of light duty days taken (see Table 13). It is of interest that a smaller proportion of women reporting rape are represented in the 15 to more than 30 plus sick days taken group (31%, n=23) than the no victimization group (34%, n=32). Women dually victimized (47%,n=44) and women experiencing unwanted sexual contact were represented more often in this group followed by those physically assaulted (45%, n=47), then those sexually harassed (44%, n=39). Women who were victimized also took more light duty days than those not victimized. In the 15 to more than 30 days of light duty group, women who were sexually harassed (47%, n=19) and then women dually victimized (47%, n=44) took the greatest number of days

followed by those physically assaulted (43%, n=44) and lastly by those experiencing unwanted sexual contact (36%, n=38).

Workplace Injuries by In-Military Violence Group

Women who were physically assaulted or dually victimized during military service had approximately twice as many workplace injuries as non-victimized women (64% vs 34%). Nearly half of those experiencing unwanted sexual contact (47%) and harassment (47%) also reported injuries (See Table 13). Injury rates of women who experienced rape during military service were the lowest of severely victimized women (35%) and were similar to non-victimized women .

3. How is the military response to victimization reports associated with subsequent psychological functioning and health status outcomes of affected women veterans?

The military response to violence can only address those women who chose to report it. As we found only a minority of women chose to formally report their victimization, presenting only the military response would be an over-simplification of the issue. Consequently we will describe service women's responses to victimization and reasons why they chose not to formally report. Lastly, psychological and health status outcomes of reporters will be compared to non-reporters as there was insufficient data to meaningfully describe military responses.

Service Women's Response to In-Military Violence

The majority of women regardless of victim group told the perpetrator to stop the behavior or threatened to report the behavior (See Table 14). Physically assaulted women were most likely of all groups to report their victimization however (43%, n=43) and least likely to ask for a transfer or discharge. Dually victimized women were next most likely to formally report their victimization (31%, n=29) most likely of all groups to obtain a discharge due to the violence experienced (17%, n=16) and to ask for a transfer (27%, n=25). Women who were raped during military service were least likely of severely victimized women to formally report (22%, n=16). However, only 16% of women who were sexually harassed and 19% of those experiencing unwanted sexual contact reported their victimization. All groups were more likely to talk with a health care provider about the violence than to seek emotional counseling.

Reasons For Not Reporting

Nearly half of dually victimized women (45%, n=29) noted that they did not report their victimization because they didn't know how to. This was also true of approximately one-third of all other victimization groups. Conversely, a large proportion of respondents did not report because the person to report their victimization to was the perpetrator or was a friend of this perpetrator. This was true across all victim groups, occurring most frequently in dually victimized women (72%, n=46); and in nearly half of physically assaulted women, women experiencing unwanted sexually contact and sexually harassed women; and approximately one-third of women acknowledging rape. Belief that the violence experienced was to be expected in the military was reported by approximately one-quarter to one half of victimized women (21% - 47%). Most were too embarrassed or ashamed to report their victimization (27% - 83%); or feared a negative impact on their military career (36% - 91%). A majority did not report because they did not think anything would be done (44% - 78%) and that reporting would make their workplace more unpleasant (51% - 80%).

Officer Response To Formal Report of Violence

Again, due to the low reporting rates meaningful interpretation of this data is not possible (See Table 15).

Psychological Functioning And Health Status Of Women Who Did and Did Not Report Victimization

Findings indicate that women who formally reported victimization during their military service, appear to currently feel better psychologically and have better health-related quality of life across several domains than non-reporters. The exception is that physically assaulted women currently report poorer physical functioning.

Servicewomen formally reporting rape demonstrated significantly lower SCL-90-R scores (indicating lower psychological distress) in the following domains: Somatization ($p < .02$; .69 vs 1.27), Obsessive Compulsive ($p < .01$; .66 vs 1.45), Depression ($p < .01$; .56 vs 1.28), Post-Traumatic Stress ($p < .05$; .67 vs 1.20), and Global Symptom Index ($p < .04$; .68 vs 1.21). They also reported significantly higher SF-36 scores (indicated better health-related quality of life) in the following domains: Physical Functioning ($p < .004$; 90 vs 68); Social Functioning ($p < .02$; 86 vs 63); and Emotional Role Functioning ($p < .03$; 85 vs 58).

Servicewomen formally reporting physical assault demonstrated significantly lower SCL-90-R scores (indicating lower distress) in the domains of: Interpersonal Sensitivity ($p < .01$; .62 vs

1.0), Anxiety ($p < .01$; .52 vs .94), Phobic Anxiety ($p < .01$; .62 vs 1.1), and Psychoticism ($p < .04$; .40 vs 6.8). Physically assaulted women who formally reported their victimization as compared to those who did not demonstrated only two significant differences in health-related quality of life. The SF-36 domain for Physical Functioning was lower for those who reported, indicating poorer functioning ($p < .04$; 62 vs 74); but higher, indicating better functioning in Mental Health ($p < .05$; 73 vs 64).

4. How is psychological functioning and health status of women veterans affected by sexual victimization?

Victimization and Psychological Functioning

Table 15 presents the relationship between type of violence experienced in the military and current psychological health. Women experiencing dual victimization had the highest unadjusted scores (and thus most distress) of all groups. They demonstrated significantly higher scores than non-victimized women across every SCL-9-R subscale. Dually victimized women had significantly higher scores than women reporting physical assault in somatization, interpersonal sensitivity, depression, anxiety, phobic anxiety, psychoticism, and post-traumatic stress disorder. They also had significantly higher scores than women reporting rape in phobic anxiety. Women reporting rape in-military demonstrated the second highest levels of psychological distress with every SCL-90-R subscale score higher than non-victimized women, and with the post-traumatic stress disorder subscale score higher than that of physically assaulted women. Women reporting physical assault had higher distress than non-victimized women in somatization, obsessive-compulsive, depression, anxiety, paranoid ideation, post-traumatic stress disorder, and the global symptom index.

Adjusted mean scores on the SCL-90-R subscales demonstrated that scores for somatization, interpersonal sensitivity, depression, anxiety, hostility, phobic anxiety, paranoid ideation, psychoticism, post-traumatic stress disorder, and the global symptom index remained significantly lower for victimized subjects, even after conservatively adjusting for the effects of chronic health problems, service-connected disabilities, and current psychiatric medication usage. These results indicate the persistent effect of in-military violence on current psychological functioning.

Victimization and Psychiatric Diagnoses

Table 16 presents a comparison of select DIS DSM-IV disorders between women physically assaulted or raped and non-victimized women. Victimized women were found to meet diagnostic criteria for post-traumatic stress disorder, panic disorder, anxiety disorder and major depressive disorder significantly more often than non-victimized women did. It is of interest that alcohol dependency was not found to be significantly different between women victimized in military and those who were not. However, when chi-square comparisons were performed observing alcohol dependency between types of victimization (physical assault, rape, both physical assault and rape) a significant between group difference ($p < .009$). More women in the dually victimized group (20%, $n=19$) were diagnosed with alcohol dependency than any other group. This trend was repeated with other disorders, with more dually victimized women diagnosed with PTSD ($p < .001$; 36%, $n=33$) and major depressive disorder ($p < .001$; 63%, $n=57$) than any other group. Rates of these disorders in both victimized and non-victimized women were higher than that found in general population studies. This may additionally be a reflection of the VAMC clinical population, with higher proportions of psychiatric and medical service-connected disabilities than that found in the general population. Regardless, victimization clearly appears to increase the risk of development of these disorders.

Victimization and Health Status (Health-Related Quality of Life)

The relationship between type of violence experienced in the military and current HRQL using adjusted means is shown in Table 16. Women experiencing physical assault had significantly lower scores (and thus more severe limitations) than non-victimized peers in physical role functioning, vitality, social health, and emotional role functioning. Those reporting rape demonstrated significantly lower scores than non-victimized women in general health, social health, emotional role functioning and mental health. Subjects experiencing both physical assault and rape had the lowest scores on each of the SF-36 subscales compared to all other groups; only the bodily pain subscale score was not significantly lower than that of women experiencing no violence. Dually-victimized women had significantly lower scores on the general health and mental health indices than those who reported physical assault without rape, suggesting that the effect of both physical assault and rape may have further impaired subject's overall perceptions of their physical and mental health. In addition, women with a history of both types of violence in the military reported significantly lower emotional role functioning than all other groups.

Adjusted mean scores on the SF-36 subscales demonstrated that scores for physical role, emotional role, mental, and general health ratings remained significantly lower for victimized subjects, even after adjusting for the effects of chronic health problems, service-connected disabilities, and current psychiatric medication usage. These results indicate the persistent and powerful effect of in-military violence on current HRQL.

Potential Limitations

A number of limitations to the current study should be noted. Women who participated in this study were more likely to have service-connected disabilities (SCD) for medical and psychiatric disorders. This suggests that this study population is more likely clinical as opposed to population based and indicates some degree of response bias. Women who have experienced physical or sexual victimization may have been more likely than their peers to participate in the current study due to the relevance of their experience. Consequently, we may need to assume that the reported rates of rape or sexual assault in military are elevated in the current study. However, non-responder subjects reported a similar prevalence of pre-military victimization as in other studies (Rosen, et al., 1996; Koss, et al., 1997; Knudson, et al., 1996). Additionally, rates of victimization identified in our study were consistent with the most recent research focusing on recent era women veterans (Murdock, et al., 1996; Wolfe, et al., 1992; Koss et al., 1997) and similar to that indicated by non-responders therefore lessening our concerns with response bias. That non-respondents reported poorer health than participants further confirms that response bias may not be confounding findings. It is important to note, however, that the major focus of this report is on assessing the environmental risk factors for and the impact of different types and combinations of violence against women.

We obtained a response rate of 38% (n=640). Complete data was obtained for 558 subjects. Response rates for sexual harassment surveys are typically modest. Indeed only six of twenty studies reviewed by Rubin, et al. (1990) had return rates above 50%. However, given that 44% of telephone interviewed non-responders did not receive mailed study information in addition to previously noted invalid registry information (22%), it is possible that a greater proportion of our registry information is outdated than can be determined by mail. Consequently, our response rate may be higher than currently reported. Response rates for this research may have been negatively affected by the IRB requirement of written consent. Verbal or implied consent required by telephone contact removes the impediment of time delays and the inconvenience of the extra steps of signing each of five pages, returning these by mail, and then scheduling an interview.

Media coverage of alleged sexual misconduct at The Aberdeen Proving Grounds occurred midway through data collection for this project. To assess the possible biasing of responses, a brief self-report questionnaire addressing the impact of media coverage on their participation was mailed to women following interview completion. Of the 75% (n=365) who responded, the majority (83%, n=336) were either unaware of the media coverage or were aware but felt it did not affect their answers. Conversely, 7% (n=29) were aware of the media and believed that their answers were affected: most noting that the coverage normalized their experiences and allowed them to feel more comfortable in answering sensitive questions honestly (93%, n=27). Consequently, we do not believe that the media coverage biased results of this study.

Conclusions

1. Our finding that a majority of servicewomen experienced sexual harassment is not unique or surprising. The pervasive and repetitive nature of unwanted sexual behaviors and physical violence that participants reported is a concerning, new finding. High rates of physical assault (independent of both domestic violence and rape), repeated rapes and physical assaults, and dual victimization during military service indicate decidedly more severe problems. These findings are all the more remarkable because these same women related positive work experiences in the military.

Thirty percent (n=167) of participants experienced one or more rapes or attempted rapes, while 35% (n=197) reported one or more occurrence of physical assault or threats of physical assault. Fifty-four per cent of women who were raped and 57% of those who were physically assaulted were victimized on two or more occasions. Of women who experienced the more severe forms of violence, 34% reported dual victimization. More than 75% (n=432) of respondents reported experiences of sexual harassment during their military service and more than half (n=308)

reported other unwanted sexual contact including forced kissing, touching, genital fondling, and simulated intercourse.

2. Our findings also indicate that the behaviors of officers and supervisors may be the most powerful risk factor for violence towards servicewomen. Officers (most often noncommissioned), superiors in the chain of command, and immediate supervisors were most commonly cited as perpetrators of violence. Women were five times more likely to experience unwanted sexual contact and three to four times more likely to have been raped or physically assaulted in-military when working in a climate in which ranking officers or immediate supervisors made or allowed sexually demeaning comments or gestures. When women were sexually harassed, their risk for assault was four times greater and their risk for rape was eight times greater. Not surprisingly then, perpetrators of this severe violence were frequently identified as someone who engaged in sexually harassing the victim

3. Current reporting procedures may increase repeat victimization of servicewomen. Between 33% and 72% of service women did not formally report their victimization because the person they would report to was the perpetrator or a friend of the perpetrator. Other reasons cited commonly for not reporting included not knowing how to report, the beliefs that nothing would be done, or that their military careers would be adversely affected. Consequently, this data depicts a military environment in which sexual victimization is expected (as many women reported) or normalized by officer behavior. This report indicates an environment in which violent acts towards servicewomen are permitted and repeated as the failure to report and consequently address the problem is common. So long as the consequences of reporting victimization are perceived as more negative for the victim, and not the perpetrator, the cycle of violence, tolerance, and repeat violence will likely persist. Our finding that women who formally reported victimization currently feel better psychologically and report better health-related quality of life than non-reporters is hopeful and requires further study.

4. The military base environment is not conducive to the safety of servicewomen. All forms of victimization occurred most frequently on base. The risk of more severe violence is increased for women off duty, between the hours of 1800 and 2400 and in association with the utilization of alcohol by both victim and perpetrator. Opportunities for victimization of women are pervasive in the military environment. Service women's perceptions of feeling unsafe, resultant distress, and defensive behaviors (arming themselves for protection or moving off base to feel safer) were reported frequently across the entire population of participants. Although younger women, and women with a history of pre-military victimization had increased risks of in-military violence, numerous military environmental factors carried higher risks for violence.

Relative risk ratios indicate that on base co-educational sleeping quarters or barracks did not by themselves increase the risk of physical or sexual assault. However, women were two to four times more likely to be physically or sexually assaulted if they experienced unwanted sexual advances, remarks, or pressure for dates in on base sleeping quarters, or observed homo- or heterosexual activities in the sleeping quarters. Vulnerability in utilizing latrines or showers also increased the risk of victimization. Consequently, further research is required to determine if differences in physical layout, supervision of shared quarters, or selection of housed occupational groups affects rates of violence. Small sample sizes for combat zones, field and overseas units do not allow for valid analysis of a differential risk for these settings. However, temporary duty and training assignments were identified as high risk for victimization by women who experienced sexual harassment, rape, or dual victimization. This requires further observation.

5. Violence negatively affects servicewomen's ability to perform their jobs. Given the consistency with which they adopted hypervigilant and defensive postures for personal safety, it is not surprising that victimized women report themselves as less fit for service or lacking military readiness. They report more sick and light duty days, sustain more work injuries, and leave the

military earlier than non-victimized peers because of the violence they experienced. Dually victimized women are affected most negatively. The treatment necessary for health-related sequelae of violence may offer a partial explanation for the finding that these women are more likely to discuss their victimization with a health care professional than a counselor.

6. This study demonstrated that physical and sexual victimization results in substantial, long term physical and emotional health consequences. Study participants entered the military an average of 18 years prior to the current study, with an average length of time since discharge of 11.5 years. The degree of both psychological and health related impairment so remote in time from the period of victimization suggests the negative health consequences of rape and physical assault are both severe and chronic in nature.

Women who have suffered dual traumatization reported comparatively greater distress than female psychiatric outpatients in the areas of somatization, obsessive-compulsive behavior, hostility, phobic anxiety, paranoid ideation, psychoticism, and the global symptom index. Women who reported rape demonstrated the second highest levels of psychological distress across all scales followed by those physically assaulted. Victimized women met DSM-IV criteria for PTSD almost twice as often as non-victimized women and were significantly more likely to meet criteria for anxiety, panic, and major depressive disorder. Women victimized by both rape and physical assault reported the poorest health-related quality of life, with all subscales falling well below the 25th percentile when compared to national norms for women. Twenty percent of women with dual victimization met DSM-IV criteria for alcohol dependence. Mean scores for general health, emotional role functioning, and mental health subscales of those experiencing both rape and physical assault in the military were significantly lower than among subjects who experienced no violence or solely physical assault in military. Thus, rape appears to have a greater influence on these HRQL domains than physical assault.

Recommendations

Despite strenuous training efforts by the armed forces to foster a zero tolerance for sexual misconduct, violence towards servicewomen continues to occur. This perhaps mirrors findings of civilian studies indicating that men become more defensive following rape prevention interventions. Attitudes that predisposed them to sexually coerce are in fact reaffirmed more strongly following interventions, resulting in increased likelihood of sexual aggression (Berkowitz, 1992; Leinhen, 1992; Berg, 1993). Thus, the efforts made at training programs to combat sexual violence are not sufficient alone to solve the problem. As our results indicate, the next logical intervention would be greater overseeing of and accountability for conduct in the day to day workplace and barracks. The simultaneous development of new channels for reporting are necessary so that victims can report without fear of retribution. In our study, women who had reported their victimization felt better than non-reporters both physically and emotionally. Clearly more research understanding these relationships is necessary.

We found victimized women were more likely to seek medical attention than to formally report their victimization or seek psychological counseling. This indicates that an important intervention would be the education of health care providers about how to appropriately inquire about trauma experiences, and the significant medical and psychological sequelae resulting from these experiences.

Previous Department of the Army researchers (Knudson, Durand, & Stretch, 1996) have suggested screening for trauma be an integral aspect of routine physical examinations and that trauma screening be performed on a yearly or biyearly basis for all soldiers. The integration of programs aimed at early treatment intervention for victims identified at these screenings would indicate an attempt to lessen the psychological and health related problems delineated by this study.
