The premise of this paper is that membership of a state in a regional subsystem is not a static proposition, but one to be treated as an empirical question. Sub-systemic boundaries and member positions within the subsystem are subject to change and evolve over time as actors move up and down the regional pecking order and in and out of various subsystems.

A "regional subsystem" is an empirically defined group of at least two or more countries who consistently interacted together, and who are recognized internally and externally as a distinctive arena. It is possible to determine the actor composition of a subsystem without relying exclusively on subjective opinion. By avoiding empirical methods of system identification, one is never sure of what is being measured or what changes are evolving over time. This paper's analysis uses the United Nations' General Assembly Roll Call votes as its source for interaction data. The voting periods used are the 38th to the 42nd sessions for its recent cold war period data and the 48th to 51st for the period immediately following the fall of the Berlin Wall. UN voting alignment blocs in the Middle East reflects both a country's political and social ideology in its relations with other countries in the region. This paper displays empirically defined cohesive blocs of states for the periods which tend to have high levels of interstates agreement, constituencies, and or ideologies which can be reflected by the public United Nations' roll call vote.

The Middle East is a large regional system that spreads out over two continents. Some say it includes thirty sovereign nation-states, and encompass a profusion of ethnic, sectarian, and national identities.¹ However, James Piscatori and R.K Ramazani have suggested the Middle East must stand as an exception to the contribution of regional systems. It is a part of the world that defies the application of rigorous methodologies. Data are hard to come by and they are often wrong. Cultural attitude surveys are almost impossible to take except among limited groups in a few countries, and the trends are difficult to discern amongst the rapidly shifting political and cultural currents.² William Zartman observed, "regions tend to be assumed first and identified later. Often these subsequent identifications are highly subjective and thus subject to disagreement."³

The premise of this paper is that membership of a state in a regional subsystem is not a static proposition, but one to be treated as an empirical question. For the purposes of this research paper William Thompson's definition of a "regional subsystem" is used as follows. A "regional subsystem" is an empirically defined group of at least two or more countries who consistently interacted together, and who are recognized internally and externally as a distinctive arena. It should be possible to determine the actor composition of a subsystem without relying exclusively on subjective opinion.⁴ Sub-systemic boundaries and member positions within the subsystem are subject to change and evolve over time as actors move up and down the regional pecking order and in and out of various subsystems. This paper's analysis will use the United Nations' General Assembly Roll

Call vote as its source for interaction data. The Evolution of the Middle East and African Sub-Regions

It has been said that the Middle East suffers from ethnocentric overtones and ambiguity. No one actually seems to know what actually constitutes it. Middle East analysts James Piscatori and R.K. Ramazani write that:

If the Middle East is a regional system, it is so metaphorically, that it is like a unit with subcomponents in regular interaction. 'Sub-systemic' elements, however, portend to be more revealing of how the states of the area cooperate with each other, coordinate their interests and polities, and disagree with one another. The Middle East, already burdened with its own mysticism, hardly needs the added burden of identification with 'an almost mystical wholeness'.⁶

Even though the Middle East has been a loosely defined region, it is identified with a very

distinctive history of Arab, Ottoman, British, and French Imperial influence. The term "Middle

East" was said to have been invented by the naval historian A. T. Mahan in 1900 to divide the orient

into three administrative sections: The Near East, Middle East and Far East. It reflects the

ethnocentric prejudice of Europeans rather than the realties of the Arab world.7

In order to describe the Middle East's and North/sub-Saharan African regional subsystems, we must distinguish congruous patterns of interaction that define the internal and external relations




Figure 1. Voting alignments at the 95.5 percent level. Source: Arend Lijphart, "the Analysis of Block Voting" p. 914 and 1958 sessions of the General Assembly. Arend Lijphart using the Rice-Beyle statistical method

of a region. The problem arises when the experts, all asking the same questions, cannot agree on a set geo-strategic/geographical area. This is by no means a new phenomenon but has been with us from the early days of the cold war period as illustrated in both Figure 1 and Table 1.⁸ Table 1 contains thirty-one different states. No membership list has more than twenty-nine members or less than twelve.

Figure 1 represents the Middle Eastern voting bloc identified during the 1956, 1957

of computation identified this bloc in a study.9 A Middle Eastern bloc emerged at the 95.5 percent

level. The members of this group were Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, and Libya--all belonging to the Arab Caucusing Group. Additionally, there were both North and sub-Saharan African countries connected with this group.¹⁰ Many of the differences, in both Table 1 and Figure 1, are

were emerging from their colonial existence, therefore, it is reasonably safe to assume that a 1958 system may be appropriate for its time frame. It is also reasonable to assume that the regional systems we see with the collapse of the bi-polar system should be equally appropriate. In addition, the more permanent states also undergo rapid realignments within a sub-region. This can come about almost instantaneously by a coup d'etat or more evident during the cold war, due to change in patrons with such countries as Egypt or Somalia. W. Thompson points out that "We should not be then be surprised to find that boundary identifications made in different points may vary. On the contrary, we have every reason to expect change unless we espouse some form of geographical determinism."¹¹

The analysts represented in table 1 prepared their groups of states based upon their definition and operationalization of the international system. In 1958, binder referred to the Middle East as a "subordinate international system."¹² He seemed to have had two thoughts in mind. First, he felt that the system was of a lesser scope than the total global system. Second, there was much less power in the sub-region than with the two superpowers' global bi-polar subsystems. Michael Brecher listed countries according to the "core", "periphery", and "outer ring", by how Israeli decision-makers had envisioned them.¹³ Only Frederick Pearson and William Thompson's lists are dependent on data analysis with a focus on the greatest activity of the states in the area.¹⁴

The work of William Thompson shows the best efforts towards empirically identifying the existence of an Arab regional subsystem. Thompson defines a regional subsystem as "a relatively regular intense pattern of interaction."¹⁵ He defines this operationally as the number of intergovernmental visits among Middle Eastern heads of states, heads of government, and cabinet

level members from the period 1946 to 1975. It was assembled into five six-year periods. Despite the strength of his empirical analysis, the reliance on such indicators have their definite weaknesses. First, one has to determine the reliability of an action-taking place after such meetings. Second, what are the biases towards cooperative activities between the countries with whom a meeting is being conducted?

While it is obvious that there are disparities that might be explained in the various subregional clusters, we should not have to accept the ambivalence of subjective regional descriptions. While W. Thompson's study makes great empirical leaps forward, it still lacks certainty regarding whether or not the states' interactions will lead them to working together as a unit. The remainder of this paper will focus on more concise state interaction amongst other states resulting in their acting as an empirically defined association. By examining the Middle Eastern and Northern/sub-Saharan voting alignments, and by using the United Nation's General Assembly roll call votes, we are better suited objectively to ascertain with whom the states are more politically aligned. Their deliberate and thought-out act of voting cohesion is a greater expression of a state's commitment to each other than that reflected by a state visit.

United Nations' Voting Data

The reality of blocs in the general Assembly of the United Nations has been recognized ever since its establishment.¹⁶ The major obstacle of course is the identification of these blocs. Margaret Ball indicates that a bloc is "any group which consistently votes as a unit on all or particular kinds of issues.¹⁷ John B. Furey asserts that a voting bloc consists of countries that vote together with consistency, and "essential to the definition of a bloc is a sense of solidarity and definite purpose." He theorizes the existence of voting blocs based on the following common characteristics: common

interests, culture, ideology, religion, economic outlook, and geopolitical activities and common objectives.¹⁸

The measurement of bloc analysis can be accomplished in one of two ways. The first method is simply by observing the voting similarities of a particular bloc without consideration of the possible reasons for agreements in voting. Second, the more difficult approach attempts to distinguish the causes of similarities in voting behavior.¹⁹

Agreement in voting may be caused either by similar attitudes or by group pressure and loyalty. According to some scholars, it is an important task of roll-call analysis to make a distinction between these two dimensions.²⁰ Simply by looking for similarities based on a selected number of roll-call votes does not achieve this goal. Neither is it accomplished by first finding out the groupings that influence or persuade, e.g., the Organization of African Unity, the Arab League and even NATO. The reason is that this method does not succeed in keeping one factor, group influence and loyalty constant while varying that of the second factor, attitude.²¹

The most satisfactory method of distinguishing between the two components of attitude and group influence and loyalty in identifying cohesive blocs is the Rice-Beyle method.²² In a study conducted by Dr. Kul B. Rai, it was determined that the Index of Agreement devised by Liphart on the basis of the Rice-Beyle technique measures the degree of cohesion or lack of it between a pair of nations on UN voting far more accurately than does the once more popular Pearson's "r".²³ Due to the high acceptance of the Liphart model to delineate regional blocs with UN roll-call votes, it is

used in this study to determine the sub-regions in both the Middle East and Africa above the Equator. Lijphart model to delineate regional blocs principal is very simple.²⁴ It performs both tasks of bloc identification and measurement of their cohesion simultaneously based on their voting record. The Rice and Beyle method develops indicators of voting agreement between pairs of states in the General Assembly and defines a bloc as a group of states, between all possible pairs of whom the voting agreements are equal to or greater than an assigned figure.²⁵

DATA ANALYSIS

The voting data analyzed is derived from two distinct time periods portraying both cold war and post cold war sub- regional blocs within the international structure. The purpose of selecting these distinct time periods is to describe what affect, (empirically defined) changing from a two superpower, bipolar international system to a single super power multipolar international system had on sub-regional blocs in the Middle East and Africa. A total of twenty-two states were chosen to delineate the cold war sub-regions. The post cold war portrayal involved the same twenty-two states, plus an additional eight sub-Saharan African states. The selection of countries for this research was based on two criteria. First, a group of core and peripheral Arab states were chosen from studies conducted in Table 1. The second group of countries were all chosen from North and sub-Sahara Africa. The sub-Sahara countries were included to determine what influence, if any, they have on their northern neighbors and Middle East countries. These sub-Saharan countries all share or shared a common history of strong Arab and Islamic influence. A larger number of countries could have been included, but the sample chosen is adequate for the purposes of this paper.



The Cold War roll call vote sample consists of 73 votes from the 38th to the 42nd General Assembly session (1983-88) non-unanimous votes between twenty-two Middle East and African states. The sample post Cold War consist of 403 votes from the 46th to the 51st UN General Assembly session (1991-96) non-unanimous votes between thirty Middle East and African states. No purpose is served by selecting unanimous votes in cluster bloc analysis. The listing of all roll call votes included in this study, and how the country voted, can be found can be found in appendix 1. The associated titles of the resolution are situated in appendix 2.

The frequency of agreement in this research was determined by using Arend Lijphart's Index.²⁶ Lijphart index uses a slight modification to the Rice Beyle method. Lijphart contends that abstentions on a vote should be interpreted as a partial vote agreement on both sides as opposed to



not considering the vote. As such, the following formula was used to compute the degree of agreement between countries in this study. Where f is the number of complete agreements between two nations; g is the number of partial agreements (votes on which one nation votes and the other abstains); and t is the total number of votes cast by both nations in a pair.

The results of each calculated index of Agreement between pairs of states were then placed within a 22 x 22 matrix for Cold War agreement results (see Table 2 for the complete matrix). For the purposes of this paper, the only blocs considered significant are those with an agreement score of at least 95 and 90 percent. The color codes represent in Table 2 portray the actual blocks that emerged using these indexes and in matrix format for the period just prior to the fall of the Berlin

Cold War Alignments




Figure 2 is a wire diagram that shows the voting alignment that emerged at the 90 percent level of agreement prior to the fall of the Berlin Wall 1983-88. The figure reveals the existence of several blocs of nations and the existence of other nations partially aligned with these blocs. There were two major blocs consisting of four states each. The first block of four contained Egypt, Niger, Chad, and Sudan, all African countries. Their

Agreement Indexes reflected (92.3 Niger/Chad) and (92.1 Chad Egypt). Sudan had a high Index of Agreement with Somalia of 91.5 percent. Also, both Saudi Arabia and Niger had a high Index of Agreement with Somalia at 92.4 and 93.4, respectively.

The second bloc of four countries was totally comprised of African states. This bloc had the highest Index of Agreements. Mauritania and Tunisia had the highest Index of Agreement of 94.5 percent. Nigeria/Mauritania's' Agreement was 91.3. The smaller remaining clusters consisted of Israel and the United States with an Index of Agreement of 90 percent. The last small cluster is Libya and Yemen with the highest calculated index of 95 percent; and Libya and Syria with an Index


of 91.2. What is apparent with these index levels is the period of the Arab Caucusing Group reflected in Liphart's earlier study at the 95.5 percent level no longer has an influence.

Regional delineation with the data helps to better visualize the country agreement data for both cold war and post-cold periods by regional core, periphery, and fringe as seen in Table 1. The

portrayal uses the following criteria with countries sharing an Index of Agreement of at least 90 percent: First, "core" states will be those in blocs of three or more states all of which having an Index of agreement of 90% or more with each core member. Second, "periphery" will be defined as those states attached to core member states sharing an Index of Agreement of 90 percent or greater.


By using this methodology, the countries break down into two separate cores with their associated peripheries and fringes as illustrated in Tables 4&5 and Maps 1 & 2.



MAP 1.. Countries Representing 2 Regional Cores 1983-88


Post Cold War Alignments

The alignments that are developing following the end of the cold war are moving away from the classic bi-polar, East vs. West world that we have experienced since the late 1940s. The more radical countries that were clients of the East just ten years ago are now becoming more moderate in their regional associations. Historical clients of the West, such as Israel, are no longer voting a straight "western ticket" in the UN General Assembly as they devotedly did in the 1970s and 80s. There still exist two distinct regional cores in the Middle East and Africa as illustrated in figure 3. However, you now see a significant migration of the radical core countries over to the moderate with the historically moderate core countries. Prior to the end of the cold war, Algeria aligned itself with Libya, Iraq, USSR and Yemen (figure 2). Although, their post-cold war agreement



Index portrays a 91% alignment with Libya, more striking is the 94% agreement Index with Egypt, 92% with Morocco, 92% with Saudi Arabia, and an unprecedented agreement Index 96.5% with its neighbor Tunisia. The highest agreement indexes following the end of the cold war have been with

Tunisia, Egypt and Algeria all with an agreement Index of 95% or better.

During the Cold War period sampled there were five distinct members of the radical subregional core, Iran, Yemen, Algeria, Syria and Libya. The post-cold agreement Index reflects only Libya and Syria remaining in the core, with Sudan migrating to it from the moderate core (see Table 5).

Prior to the fall of the Berlin Wall regional radical and moderate (East vs. West) core countries remained separate and distinct. As the world becomes increasing more interdependent and global in nature, countries, even the most radical country cannot exist economically without connections to the global market economy. As illustrated in figure 3, Libya, a haven for terrorists and their training, now has a greater than 90% agreement Index with Egypt and is now part of the moderate sub-regional core states fringe. In addition, Algeria's agreement index reflects an increasingly strong association with the moderate sub-regional core and is considered part of the periphery of the moderate sub-regional core. The present trend may appear that a more unified Middle East is evolving among the core countries described.

The Fragmented Middle East and Africa

The Cold War period

The question as to the process of how these states came to align themselves as shown is for another study. Clearly, cluster-bloc analysis can describe and measure a state's voting behavior with others. It cannot, nor does it portend to, provide and explanation of the patterns that are revealed beyond those normally found in coalitions. A few additional comments based upon what we have postulated will help substantiate to a degree and explanation on the revealed blocs.

Nimrod Novak states the following in his book, Challenges in the Middle East,

Looking at politics in the region since World War II, we see the traditional rivalry for predominance among states from the various sub-systems in the Middle East, e.g., North Africa, the Nile Valley, the Fertile Crescent, and the Arabian Peninsula, has led to changing coalitions. We have witnessed rivalries between Iraq and Egypt, Egypt and Saudi Arabia, Algeria and Egypt; struggles between states within these sub-systems, e.g., Syria Iraq, Syria Jordan, Yemen-Saudi Arabia; and the internal conflicts within the states on their peripheries.²⁷

Bill Hazen and Mohammed Mughisuddin in their book <u>Middle Eastern Subcultures</u> reinforce this notion of divergence by stating, "At the root of the contemporary crisis in Arab political development is the issue of regionalism, which has played an important role in the course of events. This stems not only from the existence of regional diversity but also from the fact that ideological orientation differs radically from one state to another".²⁸

Strong social pluralism coupled with clashing political philosophies made the concept of a Pan Arab union inconceivable. Multiple sub-regions, as described by this bloc analysis study, are much more in line.

Many events prior to the end of the cold war helped to splinter this region. The major events were (1) the end of Nasserism; (2) friction created by the PLO; (3) regional instability problems in North Africa created by Libya and Algeria and (4) Sadam Hussein's attack on the Shiites in Iran.

The end of Nasserism. Nasser was the binding force in the Middle East before his death in September 1970. He endeavored to direct the momentum of the Middle Eastern states towards the Arab-Israeli issue. After his death, the region was void of the "popular, charismatic leader who continued to focus Arab Nationalist forces."²⁹ Sadat tried to maintain the cohesiveness, but he did not have the same appeal. As such, Sadat changed his position altogether as far as Israel was concerned with anticipation that the other Arab countries would fall in line.³⁰ This unilateral action

in fact had the opposite negative reaction. In response to his position on Israel, the region united in reaction. During the 1978 ninth Arab Summit conference in Baghdad, twenty Arab League members rebuked Sadat's policies and acted against Egypt.³¹ Egypt's long held position as unifier in the greater Arab region was now gone.

Friction created by the PLO. The Palestine Liberation Organization was the cause of much frustration in the Middle East region. The first effort we see of the Arab governments attempting to regulate and direct the efforts of the Palestine Liberation Organization was "Black September," with the restraining of the PLO in Jordan in the fall of 1970.³² Many other Arab countries followed suit by clamping down, and placing controls on PLO refugees within their borders. The PLO had additional problems throughout the seventies with Syria, Egypt and Iraq. As such, a strong unifying force within the PLO was not there.

Regional instability problems in North Africa. Prior to the end of the Cold War, one saw conflict areas change from a concentrated focus on the Arab-Israel dispute to other sub-regional areas. In North Africa, Moroccan-Mauritanian occupation of the Western Sahara in 1975 and the ensuing war between these countries, along with the Polisaro Guerilla movement created instability in the region. The Polisaros were supported by Libya and Algeria, which in turn alienated them from the moderate North African states.³³

January 1980, the region was further fractured when Tunisia abruptly broke relations with Libya when Qaddafi's commandos attacked a Tunisian mining town. This attack was intended to perpetrate a rebellion against the Tunisian government. Algeria had a minor role in support of Libya.³⁴ Libya further meddled with its southeastern neighbor Sudan. In 1983, Libya attempted to

over throw the Sudanese government. As a result, the United States sent in AWAC surveillance aircraft and F-15 fighters equipped for combat to help stabilize the region.³⁵

Saddam Hussein's attack on the Shiites in Iran. The bloody 1980-88 war between Saddam Hussein's Iraq and the Shiite fundamentalist ayatollahs in Iran - launched by the Iraqi dictator with the subsequent backing of conservative Arab states - caused far more Muslim casualties than all four wars with Israel. Besides his missile attacks against Iranian cities, Saddam's attempt to grab Iran's southern oil fields resulted in the use of chemical warfare not only against Iranian troops, but also against Iraq's own Kurdish and Shiite minorities.

Post Cold War Middle East

Since the end of the cold war and the fall of the Berlin Wall in November 1989 there have been a number of events which have impacted on the Middle East. The most significant event was the demise of the bipolar world with the collapse of the Soviet Union, along with the Politicalmilitary performance of the United States during the Gulf War. The Collapse of the Soviet Union and the military performance of the United States during the Gulf War. The Collapse of the Soviet Union and the military performance of the United States during the Gulf War led many analysts to describe the strategic environment that emerged as uni-polor.³⁶ The only way for a state to compete ands survive is economically. The now growing importance of economic power relative to traditional indexes of military capability is now transforming the geopolitical structure of international relations. Edward Luttwalk argues, "States are inherently inclined to strive for relative advantage against like entities on the international scene. As bureaucracies writ large, states are themselves impelled by the

bureaucratic urges of role preservation and role enhancement to acquire geo-economic substitutes for their decaying geopolitical role".³⁷

The major force that is pulling the fractured Middle East region together at this time is economic and not religious. For the Arab world, the path is clear: economic regional cooperation by way of a common market. Arab leaders realize that Globalization has left the Arab states with no other option but to integrate in the world economy.

The more radical countries depicting a shift towards the more moderate countries are recognizing this. Libya's Gadhafi has certainly realized this for his own survival. After decades of preaching pan-Arab unity and injecting Libya into the affairs of the Middle East, Moammar Gadhafi has decided Libya is African. Frustrated that his revolutionary message and dreams of a single Arab nation have not been better received by the Arab world and discouraged that Middle Eastern countries have been unwilling to challenge the international air embargo of his desert nation, Gadhafi is turning his attention to Africa and economics where there is a ``paradise'' of *mineral wealtb.*³⁸

Syria also is also cooperating with its neighbors for a greater Arab Market. In May 1997 for the first time Tunisian President Zine al-Abidine Ben Ali met with Syrian Vice President Abdul Halim Khaddam on the developments in the Arab world and inter-Arab economic cooperation. The two leaders_discussed the need to work for inter-Arab economic cooperation in order to engage in the globalization of their economy.³⁹

In conclusion, although there seems to be positive strides toward a more unified Middle East with the regional core countries displaying a high Index of Agreement, it will undoubtedly continue to remain an enigmatic region. The future for the Middle East is by no means predictable with a

subjective geo-economic model primarily due to the massive socio-economic changes brought about by modernization and the encroachment of western ideas. Today many Arabs, particularly the young and unemployed, find themselves caught between two cultures, one based on Islamic traditions, the other based on the secular concepts of the western world with its emphasis on economics and the individual rather than the traditional Islamic community. With this disparity in mind, it becomes in the future more important to use empirical methods of regional system identification. If one avoids empirical methods of system identification, one is never sure of what is being measured or what changes are developing over time.
