# AFIOH Overview



*Birthplace, Home and Future of Aerospace Medicine*

**The mission of the AFIOH is to provide world class occupational, environmental, and public health expertise to operational decision- and policy-makers.**

- Resources:
  - ~ 400 personnel: 152 military, 117 civil service, ~140 contractors
  - FY06 operating budget: \$12.7M + \$18.0M one-times
  - Facilities: ~180K ft<sup>2</sup>: 3 main and 6 smaller buildings
- Operations:
  - Labs: ~2M analyses/yr (clinical and environmental)
  - Consultants: ~200 formal technical reports/yr; 1000s of phone calls; scores of site visits; reps on ~98 external/professional organizations
  - Business operations: centralized contracting for relevant services
- Unique deployable teams
  - AF Radiation Assessment Team
  - Theater Epidemiology teams

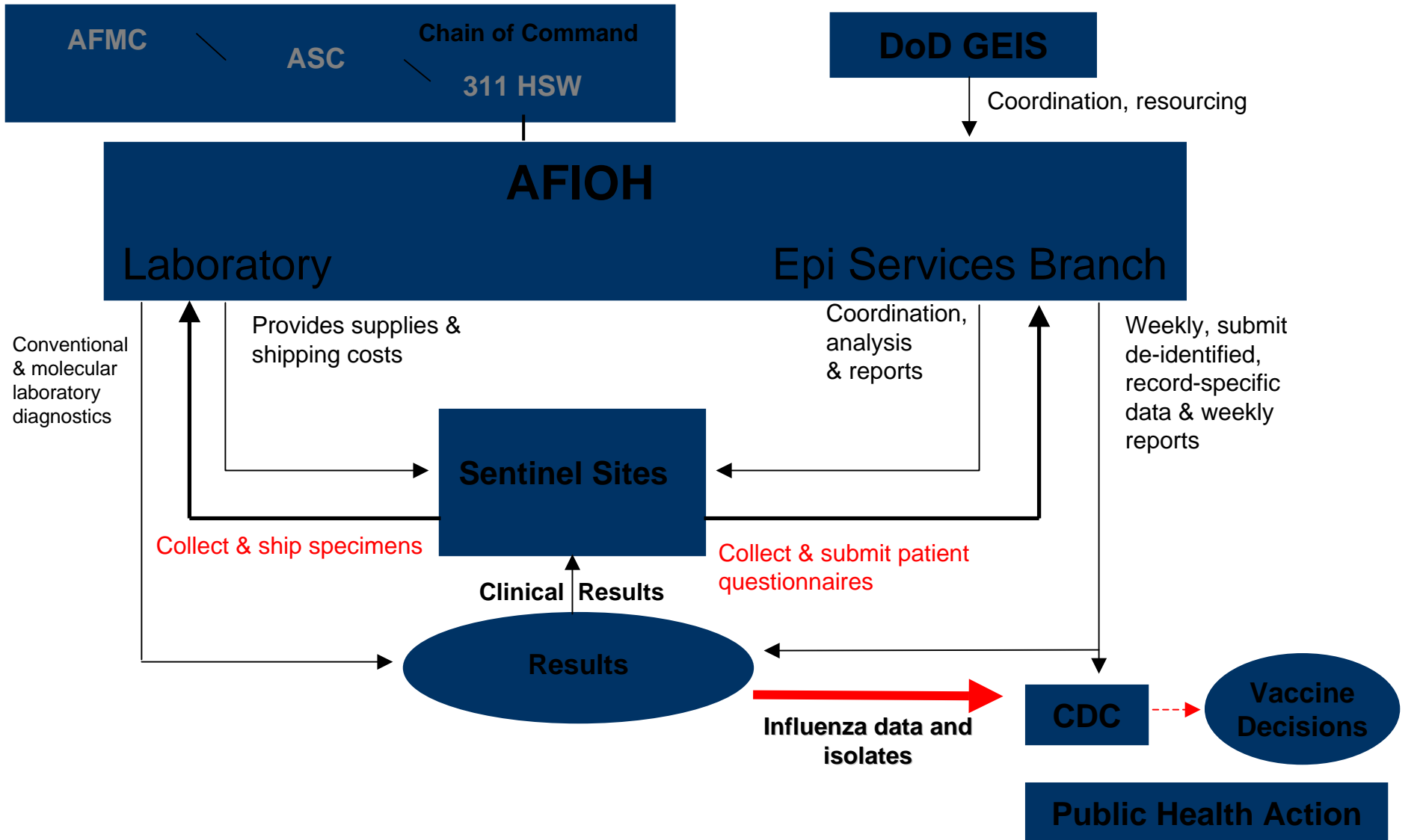
- ❖ **“Project Gargle” began in 1976**
  - **USAF’s systematic annual collection of FRI specimens from clinics and hospitals around the world**
  
- ❖ **Expanded efforts in 1997**
  - **DoD Global Laboratory-Based Influenza Surveillance Program**
  - **AF designated as the Executive Agent for lab-based program**
  - **Funding & professional guidance from DoD-GEIS**
  
- ❖ **Components of the Lab-Based Surveillance Program**
  - **Sentinel site influenza surveillance**
    - **Managed at AFIOH, Brooks City-Base, TX**
  
  - **Population-based respiratory surveillance**
    - **Managed at NHRC, San Diego, CA**

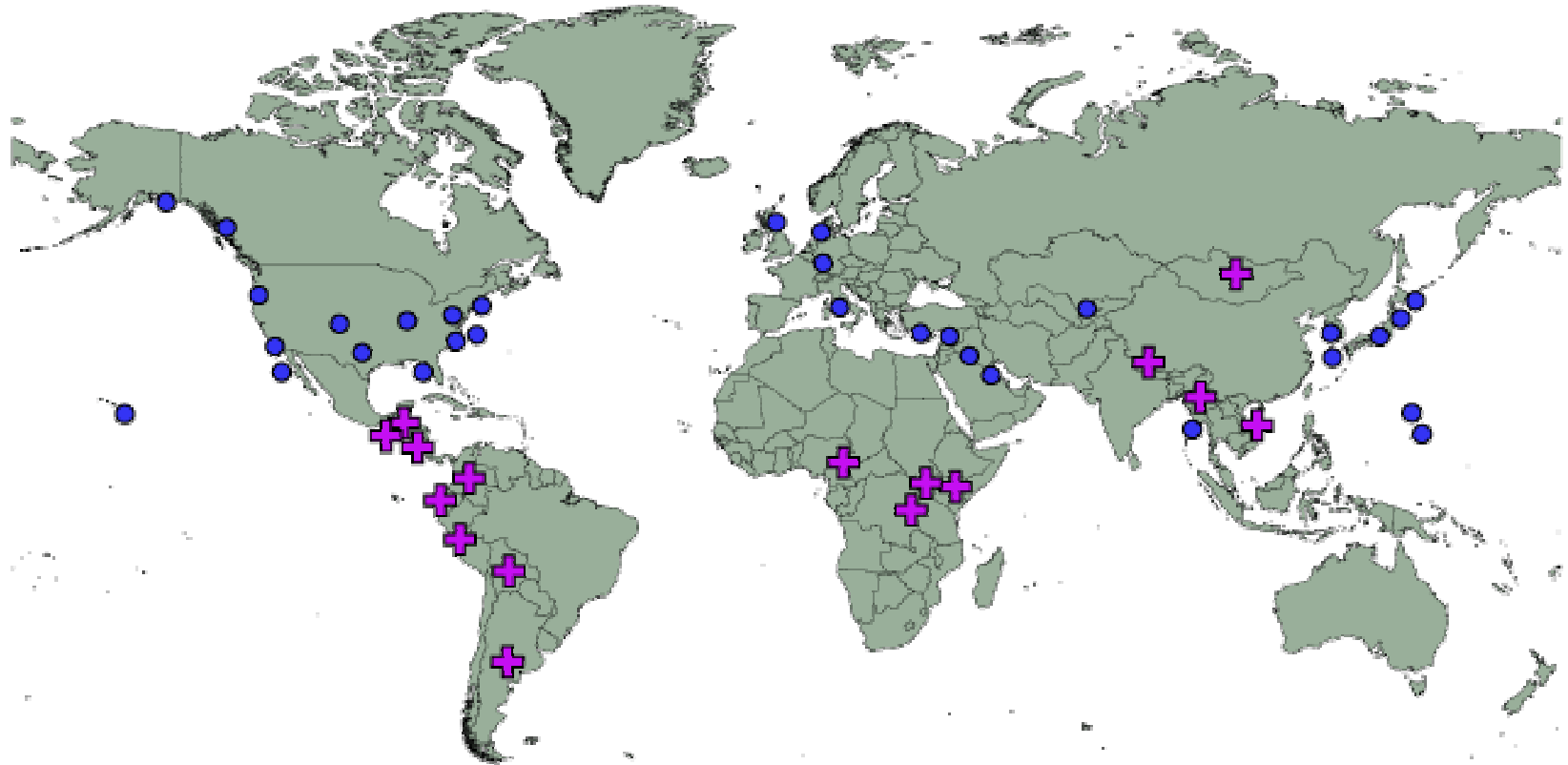

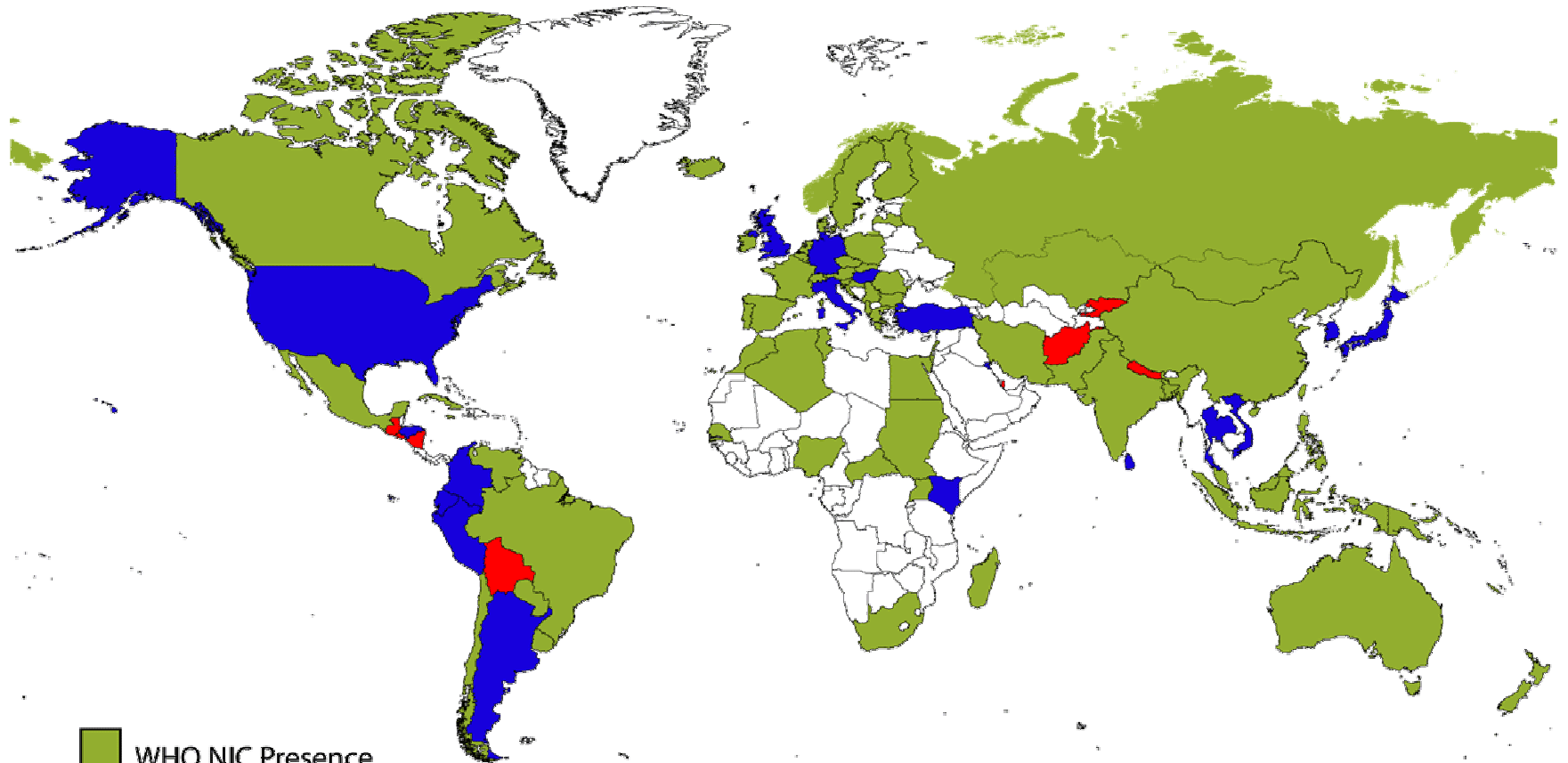




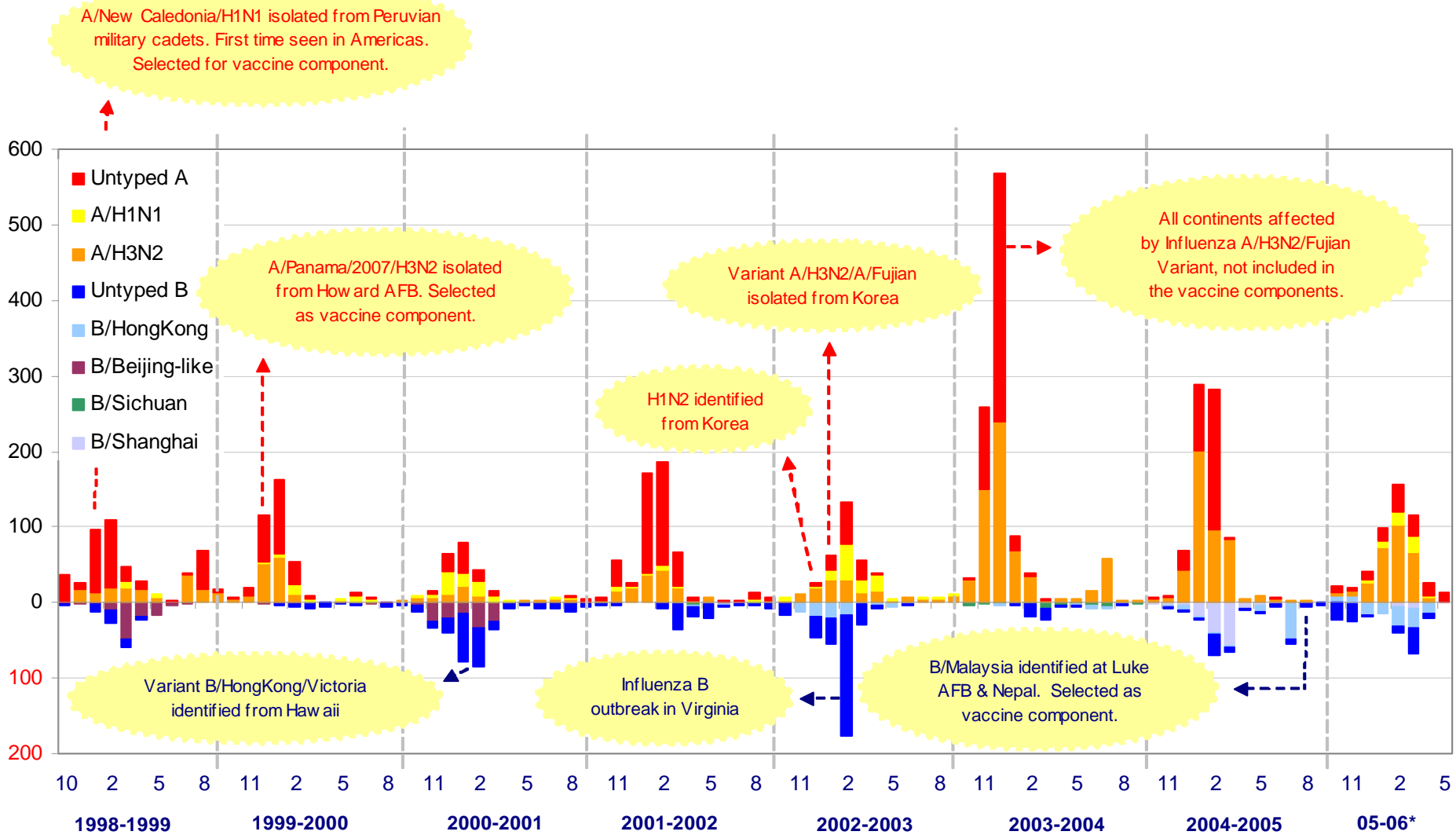

# Impact



*Birthplace, Home and Future of Aerospace Medicine*

- CDC has received > 900 isolates (1998-2006)
- Growing number of sites internationally
- Identify genetic drifts/shifts through sequencing
- Vaccine contributions in the past:
  - A/Panama/H3N2, 1998: Seed virus for vaccine 4 yrs
  - A/New Caledonia/H1N1: Peruvian cadets, 1999 (led to component decision)
  - A/California/H3N2: Nepal, 2004
  - B/Malaysia: Arizona and Nepal, 2005
- Continuously verify changes or similarities in circulating viruses identified by CDC & WHO.

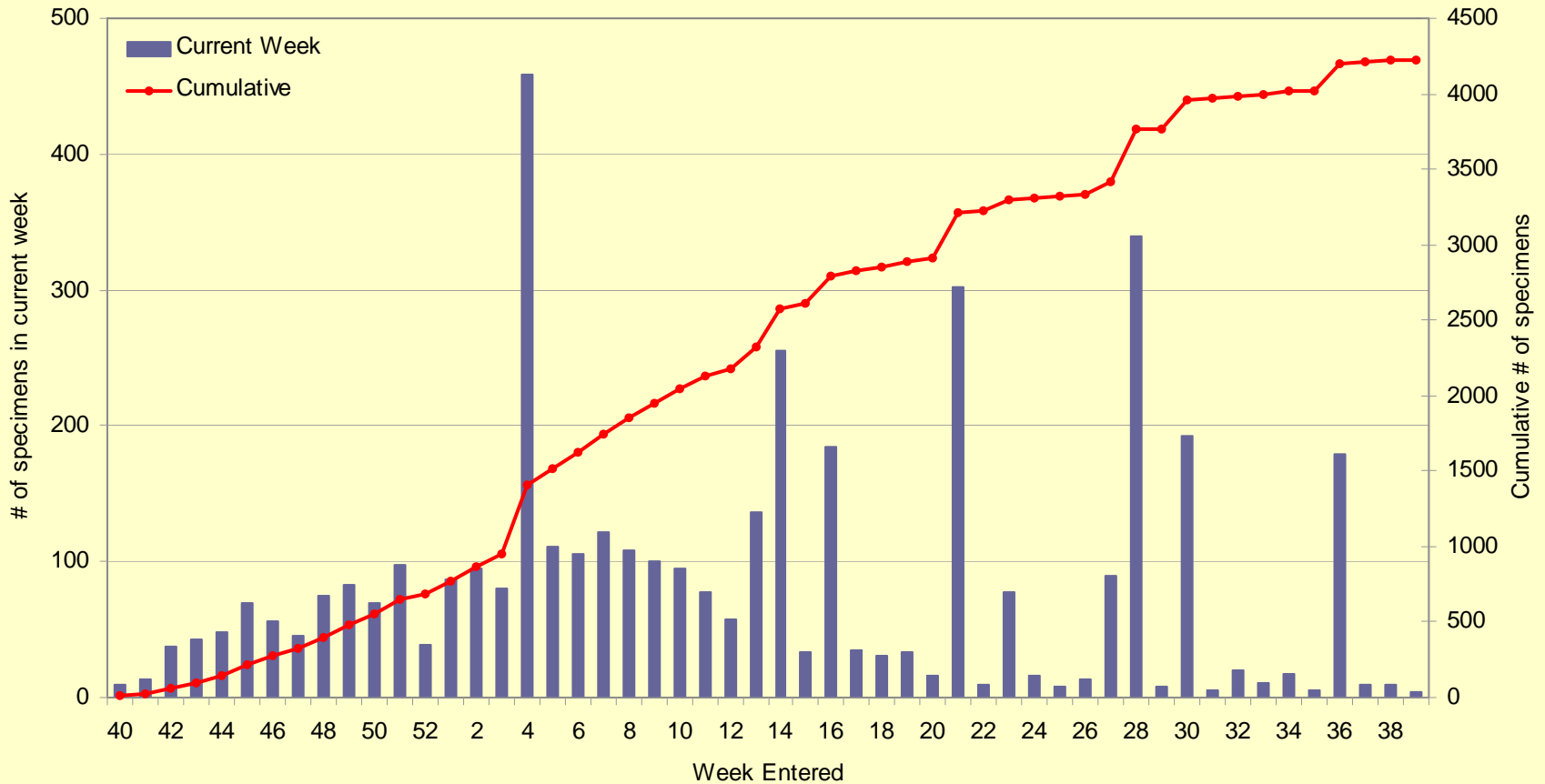

2005-2006 Seasonal Year



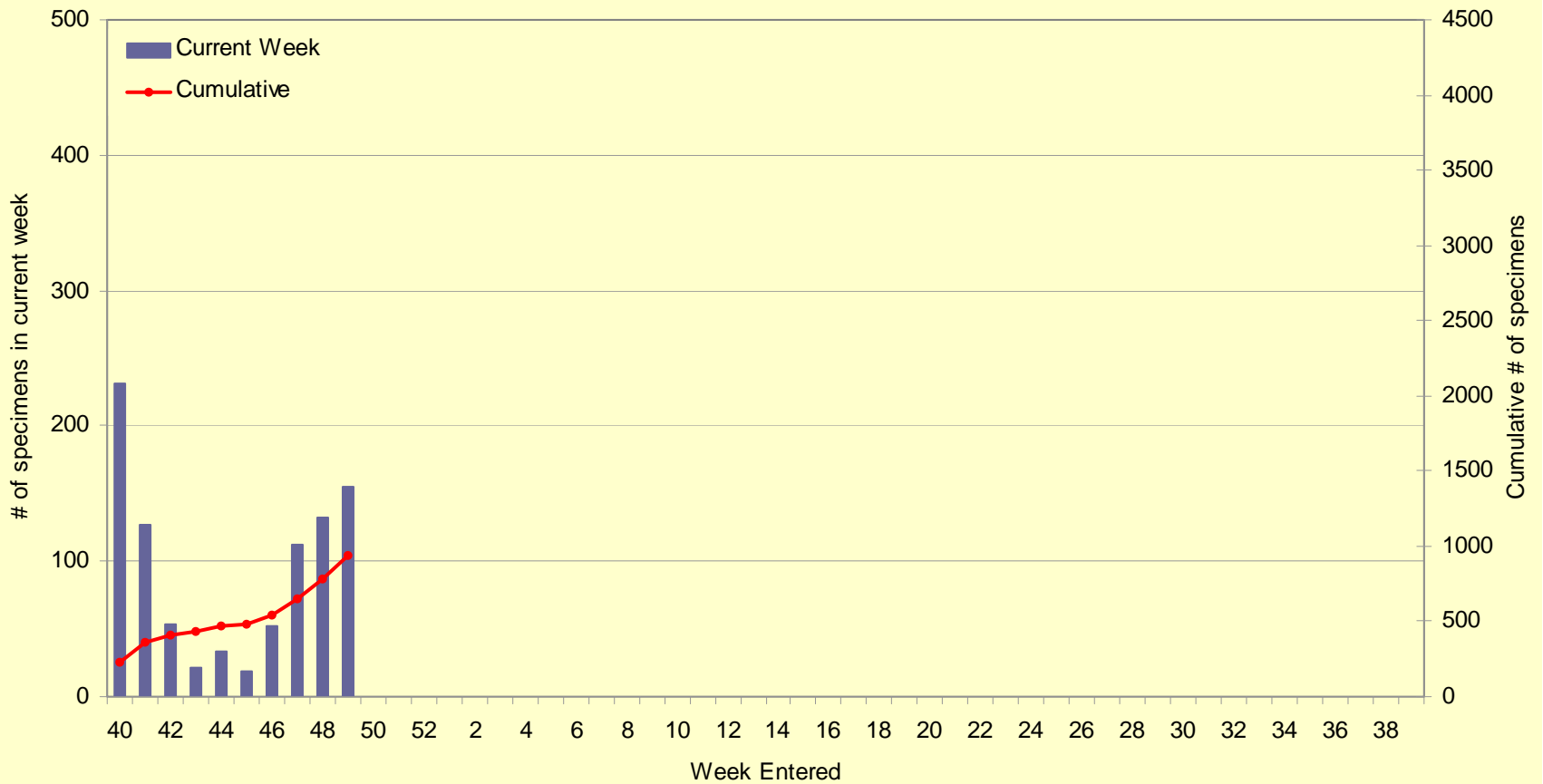

*2006-2007 Seasonal Year*



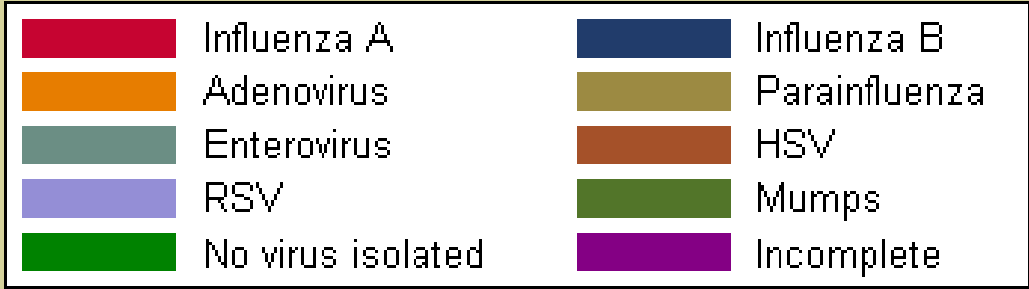

As Of 12 Dec 2006



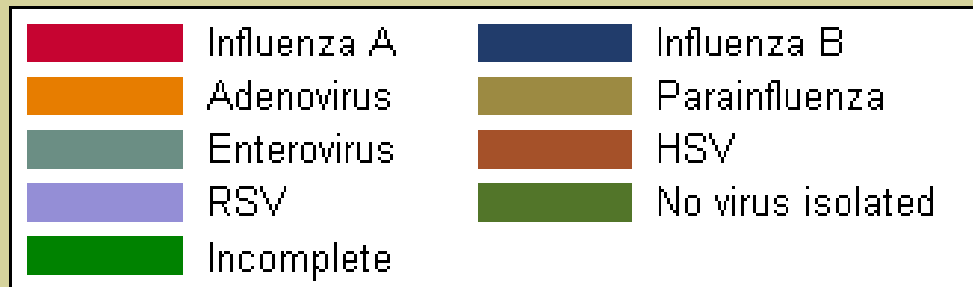
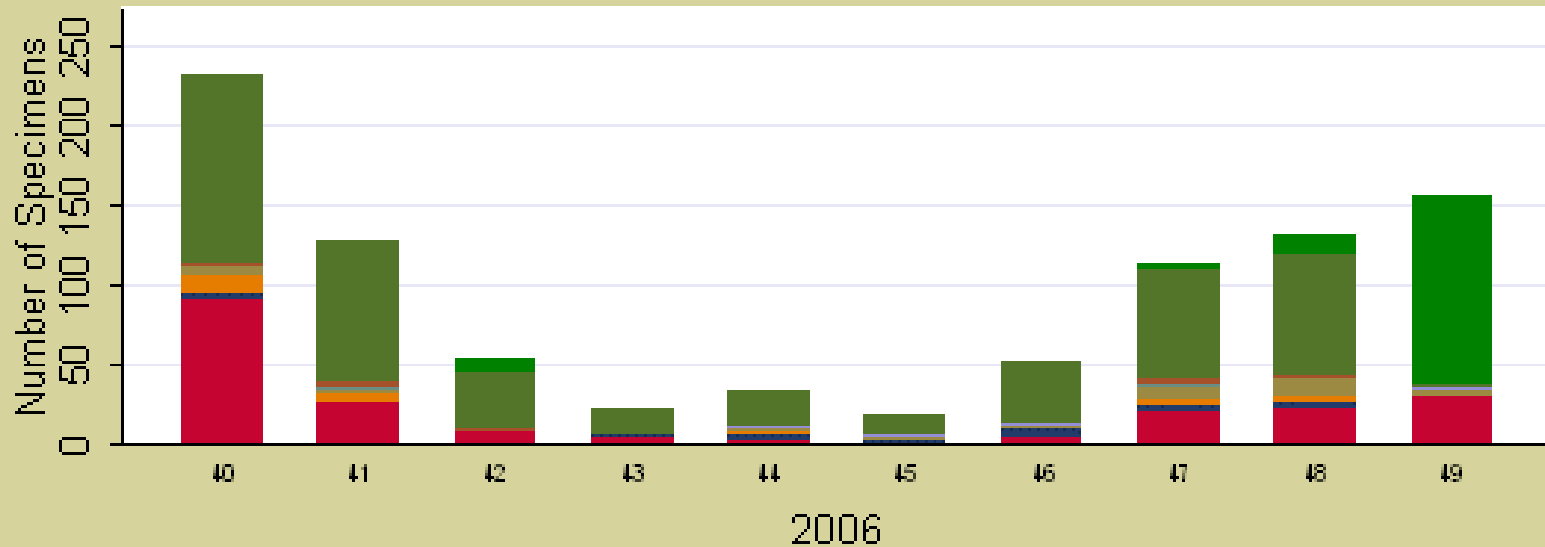

### Human Avian Influenza (H5N1) Update

In CY 2006, a total of 109 highly pathogenic human H5N1 cases (among non-DoD beneficiaries) have been WHO-confirmed in Azerbaijan, Cambodia, China, Djibouti, Egypt, Indonesia, Iraq, Thailand, and Turkey (data as of 31 Oct 2006, WHO).

### Influenza Outbreaks / News

- No outbreaks have been identified or made aware to AFIOH among surveillance sites this week.
- GEIS staff initiated efforts to expand respiratory surveillance in 8 regions in Brazil.
- EUCOM influenza surveillance initiative launched. LRMIC will serve as the forward-lab for military treatment facilities throughout Europe. AFIOH will continue to report the EUCOM surveillance data and maintain the DoD repository for respiratory specimens.
- AFIOH anticipates providing weekly updates on molecular characterization data analyzed from respiratory specimens submitted to the program.

### ATTENTION

Human cases of avian influenza (H5N1) were confirmed in Turkey. This is a concern not only because bird flu in humans spread to southeastern Europe, but because DoD installations are located in the region (see map of Turkey—left).

We are happy to welcome the 121st Army Hospital in South Korea as our 41st sentinel site.

Heads Up: The Influenza Surveillance Questionnaire Database was matched to the AFIOH Laboratory Database. This linked the laboratory and epidemiology data together. However, many questionnaires did not have a matching lab result. Errors in data entry may be the reason for this. Some sites will be contacted and asked to help us resolve the problem.
