What is FedCenter?

- **FedCenter** is a partnership between federal agencies pooling their resources and expertise to help meet their environmental compliance challenges
- **FedCenter** is an initiative of EPA's Federal Facilities Enforcement Office to provide compliance assistance to the federal sector to help agencies comply with the law and reduce enforcement actions
- **FedCenter's** mission is to help federal environmental managers better manage their environmental programs, meet their regulatory requirements, and help improve their environmental performance
- **FedCenter** provides environmental managers with a variety of **program area guidance**, **regulatory compliance** and **environmental stewardship** information, and **compliance assistance** tools



FedCenter Management

- Governed by multi-agency Advisory Board
 - 14 agencies currently represented (DHS, DOE, DOI, DOC, USACE, USDA, EPA, NASA, DVA, DHHS, TREAS, DOJ, State Dept. and OFEE)
 - Meets quarterly to discuss, prioritize and provide guidance on FedCenter matters
- Operated and managed by Army Corps of Engineers (CERL)
 - Extensive experience with environmental regulatory compliance issues and managing environmental information systems
- EPA coordinates effort
 - Facilitates Board meetings, agency funding efforts and contract/legal issues
 - Provides subject matter expertise
- Funding provided by various agencies

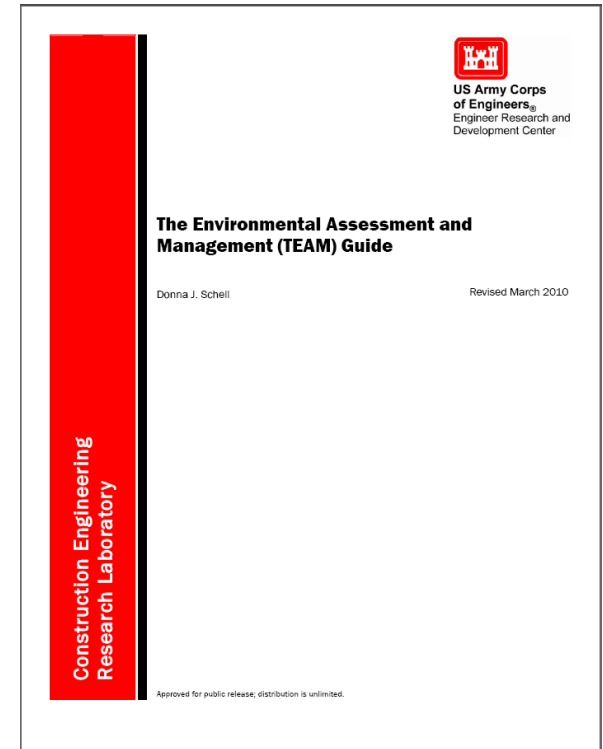

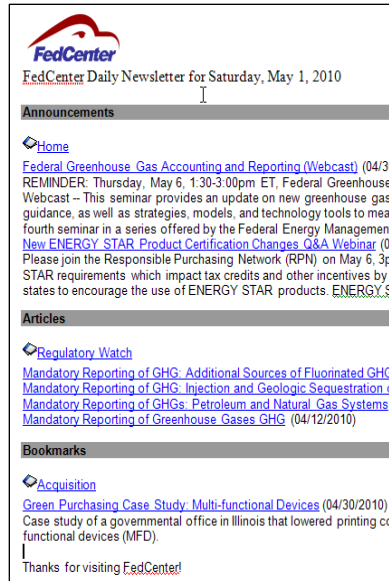

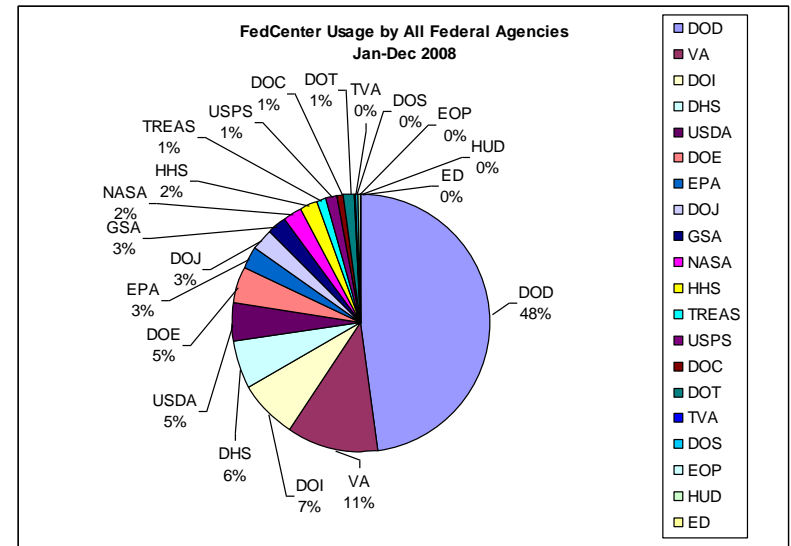

Executive Order 13423

Strengthening Federal Environmental, Energy, and Transportation Management

24 January 2007

Executive Order 13423 "Strengthening Federal Environmental, Energy, and Transportation Management", signed by President Bush on January 24, 2007. The order sets goals in the areas of energy efficiency, acquisition, renewable energy, toxics reductions, recycling, renewable energy, sustainable buildings, electronics stewardship, fleets, and water conservation. In addition the order requires more widespread use of Environmental Management Systems as the framework in which to manage and continually improve these sustainable practices.

Executive Order 13514

Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance

5 October 2009

This EO sets sustainability goals for Federal agencies and focuses on making improvements in their environmental, energy and economic performance. The Executive Order requires Federal agencies to set a 2020 greenhouse gas emissions reduction target within 90 days; increase energy efficiency; reduce fleet petroleum consumption; conserve water; reduce waste; support sustainable communities; and leverage Federal purchasing power to promote environmentally-responsible products and technologies.

Administration Guidance and Policies

Clarification of Declaration of Conformance Requirements in Instructions to Executive Order 13423 (DOC 48.13 KB)

This document, issued by OFEE, clarifies what is required in order to declare conformance with the EMS requirements of EO 13423.

Environmental Compliance Management Improvement Initiative, PMC Meeting Handout (DOC 73.73 KB)

This document, dated October 2004 describes what requirements must be followed if a facility/organization does not have an EMS.

Guidance on Implementing Environmental Management Systems "At All Appropriate Organizational Levels" of a Federal Agency pursuant to EO 13423 (PDF 120.84 KB)

This document, issued by the Office of the Federal Environmental Executive (OFEE) in October of 2008, provides an explanation of approaches for the development and implementation of an EMS at a variety of level across the Federal community.

Federal Agency's Guidance and Policies

Department of Defense (DoD) Instruction 4715.17, Environmental Management Systems

This DOD Instruction 4715.17, issued 15 April 2009, establishes policy, assigns responsibilities, and prescribes procedures for achieving conformance with Environmental Management Systems (EMS).

Department of Energy (DOE) Order 450.1, Environmental Protection Program

This DOE Order details the implementation of EMS at DOE Facilities.

Environmental Management Systems (EMS)

The **EMS Program Area** includes the latest guidance, examples, and resources for the development and implementation of processes and practices that enable an organization to reduce its environmental impacts and increase its operating efficiency.

In EO 13423, section 3(b) mandates that the heads of each agency implement within the agency environmental management systems (EMS) at all appropriate organizational levels to ensure:

- use of EMS as the primary management approach for addressing environmental aspects of internal agency operations and activities, including environmental aspects of energy and transportation functions,
- establishment of agency objectives and targets to ensure implementation of this order, and
- collection, analysis, and reporting of information to measure performance in the implementation of EO 13423.

EO 13423 further supports the use of EMS by encouraging the heads of agencies to establish within the agency programs for the following ISO 14001 components:

- environmental management training,
- environmental compliance review and audit, and
- leadership awards to recognize outstanding environmental, energy, or transportation management performance in the agency.

The EO is further supplemented by [implementing instructions](#) in which Section II provides details on how EMSs are to be developed and what a declaration of conformance involves. To clear up any potential confusion, the [Clarification of Conformance Requirements in Instructions to Executive Order 13423](#) was issued 15 January 2008.

[EO 13514](#), *Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance*, dated 5 October 2009 reaffirmed a commitment to EMS by requiring agencies to sustain environmental management by (EO 13524,
