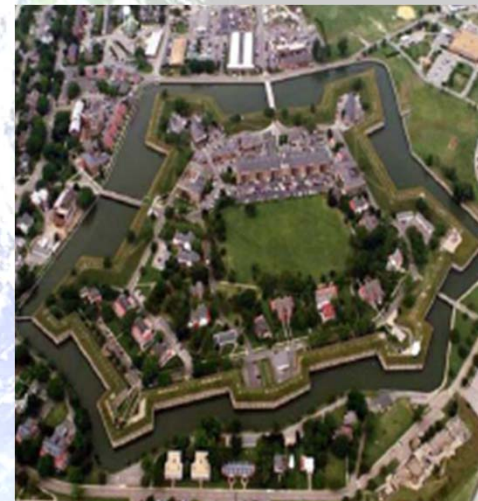

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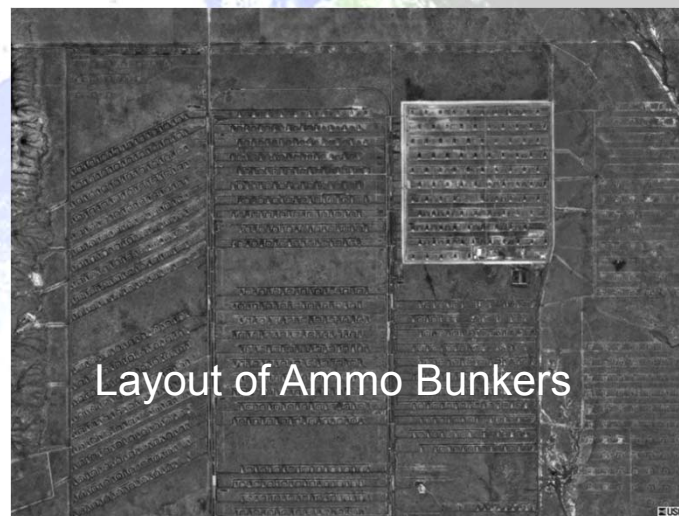
## Cultural Resources Trends – Installation Assistance

**Program Comments - Cover 54,000 buildings – ~1/3 of the Army inventory**

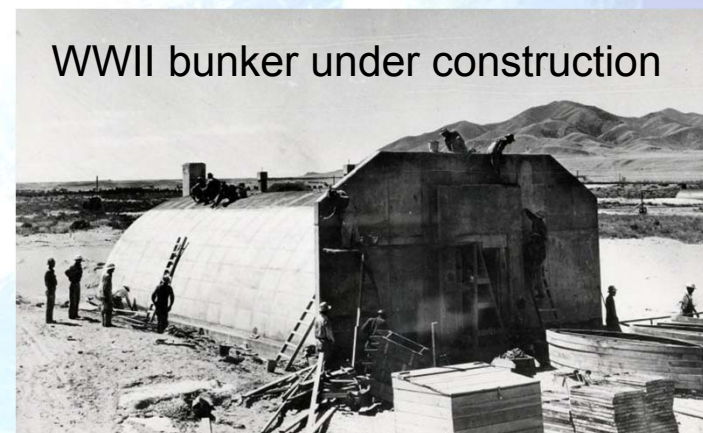

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## Cultural Resources – Changes

- **Cemeteries – Private v Post, Creation of Burial Grounds, Policies Expected**
- **AR 200-1 and Implementing Guidance**
- **IMCOM Review Process for Agreement Documents**
  - Installation → IMCOM Region → IMCOM G4 → AEC
- **AEC Primary Cultural Resources Roles and Responsibilities**
  - Installation Support Function
  - Technical Review – ICRMPs, Agreements, NRHP Eligibility
  - COR for Centralized Procurement
  - Serve SME function for EPAS Assessments and support to IMCOM, Installations, DAIM-ISE, DoD, NCSHPO and ACHP
