

FOREWORD

A knowledge of the geographical distribution, seasonal activity, and habitat characteristics of insects and related arthropods that directly affect troops is important in pest control during military operations. The magnitude and significance of insect problems have been emphasized during the past two decades by experiences in World War II and the Korean conflict. The continuing reports of insecticide resistance in insects and other arthropods stress the need for basic information to support the control programs.

Despite the number of military and civilian agencies working on insect problems, no world-wide consolidation of information on distribution and habitats of arthropod vectors into one source of reference has ever been accomplished. To furnish this information on those species that directly affect man, contracts were negotiated with Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, to search the world literature to: (1) classify and code useful data onto punch cards and (2) summarize the information pertaining to geographical distribution, seasonal occurrence, and habitats into reports for all world areas.

Before the actual assembling of this information, a 4-volume classification and coding system to this work was prepared by entomologists at Cornell University. The present report represents the amalgamation of these volumes. It is the key to the use of the information on the punch cards, now located at Cornell, and to the country summary reports, now in manuscript form in the Earth Sciences Division, this Center.

It is planned to complete the consolidation of information on insects for all countries of the world and it is hoped that arrangements can be made to publish summary reports so that these data will be available to all military entomologists and other interested scientists.

ABSTRACT

A system of classifying and coding entomological information from the world literature on arthropods which affect the health and comfort of man on punch cards has been developed to provide a method for readily recovering this information for immediate use.

More than 700 journals and other scientific publications from which data for coding may be drawn are listed. Titles are arranged alphabetically and are numbered for entry on punch cards, which also indicate the author and date of publication.

A geographic code for the world, based principally upon present political boundaries and listing major administrative subdivisions for most countries, indicates the geographical areas for recording entomological data on punch cards. A world map is inclosed to aid in the identification of the major geographical entries. World faunal areas, which are shown on the map, are assigned code numbers.

The classification for subject matter contains 9 categories of information for which space is assigned on the cards. Included are designations for genus, species, geographical range, seasonal activity, breeding habitat, and disease relationships.

The system has been used for recording information on more than 40,000 Keysort punch cards. These cards are filed at Cornell University where this work was performed under contract. From these cards summary reports for all countries in North America, South America, Africa, and Southeast Asia, and for Australia and islands in the Pacific Ocean have been prepared.




FIG. 1 General plan for coding data on arthropods on the punch cards

INTRODUCTION

1. Recording information on cards

a. Scope of this report

The past two decades have revealed the inadequate understanding of the worldwide distribution of arthropods that annoy man or are involved in the transmission of human diseases. Important operations of both military and civilian organizations have been handicapped because information on local pest and disease problems, especially for unfamiliar areas, was not readily available in a usable form. In trying to obtain pertinent information, much time has been lost in searching through the many publications and papers of the voluminous literature on insects and other arthropods.

To remedy this situation, the Office of The Quartermaster General in coordination with the Office of The Surgeon General and the Department of Agriculture, negotiated a contract with Cornell University, under which the Department of Entomology assembled information from the world literature and other sources on arthropods of medical importance. The scope of this work required a listing of these arthropods, classified by species and geographical areas, and including such information as geographical distribution, seasonal activity, habitat conditions, disease relationships, and other biological data.

Because of the enormous amount of literature to be reviewed and abstracted, it was decided to (1) place the information from the references on McBee Keysort cards and then to (2) prepare summary reports for each country of the world.

To date, information has been coded on more than 40,000 punch cards, and summary reports have been prepared for all countries in the Western Hemisphere, Africa, Australia, Southeast Asia and adjacent islands. In addition, the Keysort cards contain incomplete information for the rest of the world.

This report contains the classifying and coding system used for recording information onto the punch cards and from them into the country summary reports. It provides a valuable tool for the use of this information by military entomologists and other interested scientists.

b. Definition and list of "arthropods that affect the health and comfort of man"

"Arthropods that affect the health and comfort of man," as used in this work, are those species which are associated with human diseases or which annoy man by their presence or biting, or both. They are also often referred to as "arthropods of medical importance." For the purpose of this work, they have been grouped into the following categories:

mosquitoes	bugs
horse flies	biting flies
sand flies	non-biting flies
black flies	midges
fleas	urticating and vesicating arthropods
ticks	miscellaneous arthropods
mites	

Arthropods of known cosmopolitan distribution, such as house flies and human lice, are not listed unless a record has some unusual feature.

c. Use of scientific names

The scientific names which designate the species of arthropods included in this work are, for the most part, those which appear in the literature. In only a few cases has there been any attempt to straighten out the synonymy. For a few well-known species (e.g., *Aedes aegypti*), only the valid name is recorded, and information in the literature under any of the synonyms is entered under the valid name. In other cases where synonymy is given in comprehensive lists or in monographs, the data from all references are tabulated under the valid name. Occasionally such a list or monograph has been used for its treatment of synonymy in spite of its having no reference to the particular country. In such cases, the work will not be cited in the reference column of the country summary reports, but it will be listed in the bibliography with a note explaining its use. Appendix A contains a list of the principal references used for synonymy for this work.

In tabulating data for the summary reports one of the unsolved problems has been the necessity to include species names that are known to be invalid but which have not been removed from the literature. For instance, in the United States it is necessary to list the name *Anopheles maculipennis* with many states because this name is still included in the state lists. However, this species, without doubt, is in most cases *Anopheles earlei*. Similarly, most of the records for *Anopheles occidentalis* should be for *Anopheles earlei*. Since the names occur in the literature and have not been invalidated by publication of synonymy, it may even happen that all three names occur for certain states. Some of these name complications are known, but until the changes can be documented, it is necessary to list such names. There are undoubtedly many more similar cases, but the taxonomists who are specialists on the various arthropod groups must themselves correct these errors.

d. Source of references used on punch cards

Cards for the basic reference file have been prepared by photographing abstracts and reviews from the Review of Applied Entomology, Series B, and then fastening these prints to individual Keysort cards. Additional references have been obtained from the Tropical Disease Bulletin and data

have been used from the individual papers in the literature. Although the card file has not yet been checked against the Zoological Record to assure complete coverage of the literature, there are now approximately 40,000 reference cards in the file.

e. Arrangement of coded data on punch card

For coding purposes, the margins of the card are divided into sections, which are separated into fields with a double row of holes. As shown in Figure 1 (a through e), sections have been assigned for data on publication, date of reference, author, and for specific subject matter. The lettered sections have been assigned as follows:

- CC - punched when reference data have been included in a country summary report
- A - major geographic division or country designation
- B - subcountry or country subdivision
- C - faunal region
- D - seasonal activity
- E and F - disease(s) (two diseases may be entered: 1 in E and 1 in F, or 1 disease in E and data about the vector in F)
- G - genus
- H - species
- I - breeding habitat or arthropod group
- J, K, L - general subject matter
- M - century of publication; other special uses

The fields comprising the sections of the card are arranged as hundreds, tens, and units, making it possible to index information by code numbers according to the decimal system. With some exceptions, as can be seen on the sample card, Figure 1, there are six holes in a typical field. The three on the outer margin are assigned numbers 4, 2, and 1, and the hole under number 4 is assigned number 7. The two holes under numbers 2 and 1 are unnumbered. Each group of six field-holes thus allows the coding of any of the 9 digits. The digits 1, 2, 4, and 7 can be indexed directly, but digits 3, 5, 6, 8, and 9 require the use of two of the numbered holes. For instance, for digit 8, holes 7 and 1 are used; for digit 3, holes 1 and 2 are used. Note that no hole has been assigned the digit 0; thus, if no hole is punched, 0 is indicated.

A special hand punch is used to enter the code numbers on the card. The punch cuts a slot which extends from the edge of the card to the desired margin hole. For example, in the punched sample, Fig. 1c, the number 256 has been indexed in Section "A" (bottom of the card) by punching the number 2 in the hundreds field, 5 (that is, 4 plus 1) in the tens field, and 6 (that is, 4 plus 2) in the units field.

The unnumbered holes in the sections can be used for special coding. Their use for routine purposes, however, is avoided because extra steps are required in sorting the cards when these holes are punched. The hole under number 2 is called "drop 2," and the hole below number 1 is called "drop 1."

2. Recovering and using information on cards

a. Instructions for sorting cards to recover information

The Keysort card system is so designed that when a needle is inserted in any given hole in a pack of cards, all the numbers whose coding requires a punch through that hole will fall from the needle. For example, when the needle is inserted in the 4 hole, all the cards using hole 4 will fall from the needle. Since hole 4 is used to form other digits, when hole 4 is needled, all the cards punched for digits 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 will fall out. Thus, multiple needling may be necessary to separate an individual number from a pack of cards. For example, to separate just the number 4, three needlings are required. The steps are as follows:

Steps in separating #4 only

- a) Needle hole 7, and the 7, 8, and 9 digits will fall, leaving only 4, 5, and 6's on the needle.
- b) Needle hole 2 in the group that remains from step "a", and this will leave 4's and 5's on the needle.
- c) Needle hole 1 in the group that remains from step "b", and the 5's will drop, leaving only 4's on the needle.

Careful consideration of the above example will indicate the needling necessary to separate any digits in any field.

If a large stack of cards has to be sorted, an examination of the slotted edges will often show which hole should be needled first to eliminate as many cards as possible with one needling. That is, in the above example, if examination showed that most of the 1 holes had been punched, needling first through this hole would immediately drop off most of the cards in the stack which cannot be 4's.

In general, those who use the card file will be interested in two types of sorting: 1) Selective sorting and 2) Sequence sorting. The first type of sorting aims at separating all the cards in the file coded with a particular number in a particular section; the second type aims at arranging all or a selected part of the file in such a way that the index categories in a particular section are in numerical order. Since all the cards in the file cannot be needled at once, each type of sorting will involve two phases: 1) Breakdown sorting and 2) Fine sorting, as described below.

1) Selective sorting

Breakdown-sorting phase. The objective of this sorting is to separate the file into two parts: one, as large as possible, which can not contain the wanted code number; the other, as small as possible, which can contain this number. The following steps are suggested for performing the desired separation:

Steps in breakdown-sorting phase (selective)

- a) Determine which holes in the section involved would have been punched for the number desired.
- b) Take a stack of cards which will conveniently fit on the needle (a stack about 2 inches thick will usually be convenient).
- c) Examine the edge of the cards and needle a hole which will eliminate as many undesired cards as possible. According to the hole selected, the desired card(s) may either fall or remain on the needle.
- d) Repeat the needling procedure on successive stacks of cards, placing all cards which contain the desired number in one pile and those that cannot contain it in another pile.
- e) When all the cards involved have been handled, repeat the entire procedure on the pile of cards that can contain the desired number, using a different hole. Continue eliminating until the desired cards are obtained.

Fine-sorting phase. This sorting is only a continuation of breakdown sorting. When the stack is reduced to about 20 cards, it will save time to sort the cards manually.

2) Sequence sorting

Breakdown-sorting phase. The purpose of this sorting is to break the entire file, or a selected part of the file, into serial piles of cards small enough to be handled conveniently on the needle (i.e., stacks no more than 2 inches thick). These small stacks are then put into final order by fine sorting. The following steps are suggested:

Steps in breakdown-sorting phase (sequence)

- a) Take a stack of convenient size, and needle through the highest numbered hole in the highest field in the section

concerned. (For example, in Section "A" this will be hole 4 in the hundreds field; in Section "I" it will be hole 2 in the tens field; and in Section "C" it will be hole 7 in the units field.) Place the cards that fall in a pile to one side.

- b) Then needle through the next highest numbered hole in the field and each successively lower numbered hole, working from left to right.
- c) Continue in the next field, beginning with the highest numbered hole and working from left to right until all the fields in the section have been needled.
- d) Take additional stacks, needling each as above and putting the cards that fall on the appropriate piles.
- e) When all the cards have been handled as above, the first pile should contain those cards punched for the highest numbers, and those following should contain successively lower numbers.
- f) Any pile that is too large to put on the needle must be broken down further. To do this, follow the procedure as given in step "a" above, noting that the "highest numbered hole" is now the next below that which originally separated the pile. Be careful to keep the stacks resulting from this second needling in numerical order.
- g) Continue this procedure until all piles are less than 3 inches thick

Fine-sorting phase. The objective of this sorting is to arrange the cards in each stack so that the code numbers are in numerical order in the section with which one is working. If the numbers have been assigned to index categories in alphabetical order (as in the "Author," "Genus" and "Species" Sections, for example), then this procedure will arrange the cards in alphabetical order by index categories. Manual sorting may be used to arrange the cards in alphabetical order within the index categories. The needling procedure for this type of sorting is as follows:

Steps in fine-sorting phase (sequence)

- a) Start with the pile containing the lowest numbers derived from the breakdown sorting. Needle hole 1 in the units field. Be sure all cards punched for hole 1 fall off the needle.

- b) Place the cards that fall at the back of the stack and needle successively holes numbered 2, 4, and 7 in the units field, then hole 1 in the tens field, etc. Continue working from right to left and each time place the cards which fall at the back of the stack until all the holes have been needled. Be careful to keep the cards in order and to see that all the cards fall that should fall at each needling. The stack is now arranged so that the code numbers are in numerical order from front to rear.
- c) Take the pile with the next higher group of numbers derived from breakdown sorting and treat it in the same fashion. When you have it in order, place it behind the first stack, and all the numbers will be in sequence.
- d) Continue in numerical sequence to the highest-numbered stack provided by breakdown sorting and the entire file will be arranged in numerical order.

3) Locating references by subject matter coded in Sections "J", "K", and "L".

In searching for references by subject matter coded in these three Sections, one should apply the following techniques.

To obtain all the references dealing with some particular subject: (1) first needle the entire card file for the number of the most general heading in Section "K" which includes the subject; (2) since many references contain information about some more particular aspect of the subject, and do not fall out in this first needling, one should needle the cards again for each of the more specific headings in Section "K"; and (3) finally, if the subject is so specific that it might be mentioned in passing in a paper on a quite different subject, then, in the cards which have not fallen out, one should needle the headings in Sections "J" and "L" which include the subject.

All the cards separated by any of the above steps might have information on the subject and should be subdivided by needling in Section "J" and "L" the numbers of the headings applying specifically to the desired subject. For completeness, each reference should then be scanned individually.

To obtain a particular reference when only its subject matter is known, one should begin needling the number in Sections "J" and "L" which corresponds to the index category referring most specifically to the desired subject. Thus, one can usually obtain a particular reference rather quickly.

It is important to needle in both Sections "J" and "L" for all numbers from 50 to 99, since such numbers may be entered in either Section.

4) Suggestions for needling

The technique for needling is best learned by use, but a few general suggestions may be helpful for the beginner.

Suggestions for needling

- a) Before needling a stack of cards, be sure that their diagonal corners are aligned.
- b) Insert the needle in the desired digit hole until the handle of the needle is about 1 inch from the face of the stack.
- c) Keep the needle parallel to the table.
- d) Hold the cards loosely at one end and move the handle of the needle to the right or left. This will allow the cards to slip on each other.
- e) Bring the needle back to the starting position while holding the end of the stack tightly. By these procedures the cards will separate slightly on the needle.
- f) Lift the stack of cards a few inches from the table, then tap them sharply on the table top and at the same time lift the needle upward and release the cards. By this procedure the slotted cards will fall from the needle.
- g) It may be necessary to tap the stack several times on the table top to shake loose all the punched cards.
- h) Do not try to handle too many cards at one time. This is especially important in fine-sequence sorting.
- i) Sometimes a slotted card will not fall when a stack is being needled. Such a card can be detected by squeezing together the cards remaining on the needle, and inspecting the edge of the compressed stack. The needle will show in the slot of the card that should have fallen.
- j) Do not try to sort two sections into sequence simultaneously. Work with one section at a time.

b. Preparing a tabular summary for a country report

Figure 2, a sample page from the section on mosquitoes in the summary report for the United States, illustrates the type of information recorded in the country reports. These reports are composed of tables arranged by groups of arthropods in the order listed in paragraph 1b of this Introduction. Species in the various arthropod groups are arranged alphabetically.

Data for the country reports, in most cases, are obtained directly from the reference in the literature. The card file is used for locating these references.

An arthropod species is not listed in the "Species" column of the tables in the summary reports unless statements in the literature reference indicate explicitly that the species is present in the particular country or geographical area. In many cases, the species cannot be recorded for a given location because the statements are not definite.

Data on seasonal activity for the adult arthropod are seldom given in sufficient detail in the literature for use in the "Active period" column. Often the statements cannot be interpreted, and in most cases no entry is listed in the column. Where recorded in these columns, the "active period" is indicated by a solid line extending through the months active. A double line indicates the peaks of activity. A dotted line indicates that the species is believed to be present, but it is only rarely found during the months indicated. Where only isolated collection dates are available, a solid line through the months involved is followed by a question mark(?) to show that the species may also be found at other times of the year, but that no records of such are available.

Usable references to abundance or population are so scarce in the literature that no effort has been made to use them in the tables. It should be emphasized that the peaks of activity referred to above are comparable only to the situations at other seasons of the year for the same species, and only in the geographical area under consideration. No inferences about absolute or comparative abundance are justified. Occasionally an author's comments on rarity or unusual abundance are entered in the column for "Adult activity".

A brief statement is made on the "specific habitats of the larval stages" in the "Breeding habitats" column when such information is given in the literature. Hosts other than man, for the parasitic forms (such as ticks, mites, and fleas) are not given. If rather specific information is given on the habits of the adults, this is entered after the larval "Breeding habitats" as "Adult activity", separated by a slash ("/"). (For example; see Figure 2, second entry: Temporary pools / attacks during day in or near woods, at night in dwellings.) Special note is made for those species cited as biting man.

Beneath the "Breeding habitats / Adult activity" entries is a list of numerals which represent the subdivisions of the study country in which the species has been recorded. These numbers are assigned in the "Geographic Code," Part II of this report; they are also identified in the front of each country summary report.

In tabulating data, preference is given to authorities citing specific locality records, even though other references imply wider distribution for the species than can be documented. Entries with no subdivision numerals listed indicate that no specific locality records can be found in the literature. In many cases, the statements are too indefinite to use. For instance, a species said to occur "from Maine to Florida" may actually be recorded only in Maine and in Florida, and not in the intervening states. On the other hand, if the literature states "in all the New England states," then the species is recorded as present in each of these states.

It is often difficult to interpret statements about "Disease Transmission" and "Pest Status" in the literature. Consequently, entries in the country Summary concerning the relations of the species to disease are made as follows:

Entries on relation of species to disease

- a) Entered as "x" in the "Disease" column only if: (1) the author definitely states that species is a vector, unless the disease involved has never occurred in the area; (2) information proving disease transmission is given.
- b) Entered as "?" in the "Disease" column if: arthropod present, disease present, and arthropod a proven vector in other areas, though no proof is given for the particular locality.
- c) Entered under "Adult activity" if not stated to be a vector, even though: (1) found infected in nature; (2) found capable of being experimentally infected; (3) found capable of experimentally transmitting the disease.
- d) No entry on "disease" is made on the basis of statements containing words like "doubtful" "suspected," or "possible" vector, when no evidence is given to support or qualify the statement.

If an "x" is entered in the "Disease" column, the information on the disease is presented in more detail on a summary sheet for each insect group and is placed at the end of the list in the country report.

In many cases, the statements concerning the pestiferous nature of the species are only "bites man" or words equally indefinite. If the species is said to bite man more or less regularly, an "x" is usually placed in the "Pest" column for the species.

In the "Reference" or last two columns of the table, the name of the "Author" or senior author and the "Date" of publication which document each fact are recorded. The complete citations for these authors are given at the end of the tabulations for each insect group. Efforts are made to use as few citations as possible. For this reason, the references are more likely to be to monographic works and review papers, rather than references to original authority. The burden of accuracy is therefore on the author of the monograph.

The failure of authors to make definite statements has, unfortunately, made it necessary for the entomologists preparing the tabulations for these tables to do a certain amount of interpreting. Although an effort has been made to keep such interpretations to a minimum, errors are doubtless present, since it is impossible for even one person to maintain at all times the same point of view on the interpretation in a work of compilation. Errors are especially likely when such work extends, as this has, over a period of several years and involves many thousands of papers. It is hoped that the discrepancies are within the realm of human error, and that, as the lists are used and modified to keep them up-to-date, these can be found and corrected.

THE CODE

The following pages contain the code used for indexing information from the literature on arthropods. This code is composed of three parts: Part I, Publication and Author Index; Part II, The Geographic Index; and Part III, Subject Matter Index. Each of these Indexes is divided into Sections, which are designated or lettered according to the section on the punch cards with which they correspond. The first page of each code immediately preceding the code itself contains explanatory remarks and instructions.

THE CODE

The following pages contain the code used for indexing information from the literature on arthropods. This code is composed of three parts: Part I, Publication and Author Index; Part II, The Geographic Index; and Part III, Subject Matter Index. PART I

"PUBLICATION" AND "AUTHOR" INDEX

(See Figure 1a)

This part of the report is the index to the code numbers used for recording information on publication title, date of publication, and the name of the author on the punch card.

It also lists the Section of the card ("CC") that is punched when data from a particular reference have been included in the summary report.

"Publication" Section

"Publication" Section of the card (Alphabetical list of publications)

The names of serials and other publications most useful to research workers who publish papers concerning arthropods of medical importance are listed with their assigned code numbers on the following pages.

There are two parts to the publication list, as follows:

- a. Most-frequently-cited publications. These are listed alphabetically by abbreviations with individual code numbers (1-399).
- b. Less-frequently-cited publications. These are also listed alphabetically by abbreviations, but they are given code numbers according to geographical area of publication (400-500).

* * * * *

Special notes on the "b" list

On the 2 pages immediately preceding the "b" list there is an alphabetical list of geographical publication areas, for use with the publication list. (This is necessary since the geographical area of publication is not always indicated in the name of the publication.)

Books, symposia and theses are given special code numbers (492, 498, on the list of geographical areas preceding section "b"), regardless of where they were published.

* * * * *

Additions to the "Publication" sections

Publications not yet listed in this code and which contain many papers on arthropods of medical importance can be assigned to a vacant number in the "a" publication list. Less-important publications should be listed in the "b" publication list.

Authority for abbreviations and names of publications

The abbreviations and full names in the publication lists are, in most cases, those used in "A World List of Scientific Periodicals in the Years 1900-1950" and "Union List of Serials in Libraries of the United States and Canada, 1943; Supplement 1945."

NOTE: The century of the publication is coded in Section 'M' (See Part III, par. 7).

"Author" Section

"Author" Section of the card: Alphabetical subdivision list of authors

Authors are indexed by using a 299-subdivision alphabet code. If several authors contributed to the preparation of a paper, only the senior author is coded.

References without a cited author have been indexed in either of two ways: If the reference is the official publication of an organization, the main identifying word of the organization is used as author (a standard library procedure); if the reference is in a periodical and the author is not cited, then "anonymous" is used as the author. Our experience has been that the use of "anonymous" makes the reference easier to locate in the card files.

"CC" Space

"CC" Space on the card: Completed reference for a particular country's summary report

The hole in the corner of the Keysort card (see Figs. 1a and 1e) is punched when the reference and data have been included in a summary report for a particular country or geographical area listed in the geographic code. Thus, reference cards which are added to the file after the preparation of a summary report can be distinguished from those which have already been used in the summary report.

PART II

THE GEOGRAPHIC INDEX




Fig. 3 Conventional World Faunal Regions, after

(See Figure 1b and Map, Figure 3)

This part of the report is the index to the code numbers used for recording the country, subcountry and faunal area (Sections "A", "B", and "C" respectively of the card).

Sections "A" and "B" are considered together in the immediately following pages.

"A" and "B" Sections

"A" and "B" Sections of the card: country and sub-country

On Section "A" is entered the code number for the major geographical division, or country. On Section "B" is entered the code number for the subdivision, or administrative units, of the major division.

"A" Section:

While the "country" list in this index was prepared chiefly from a zoogeographical viewpoint, the countries were arranged alphabetically. Since the main function of this list is to indicate geographical distribution of arthropods, it was not found feasible to arrange all areas in the list strictly according to their political affiliations. In some cases, therefore, smaller adjacent areas, especially islands, may be grouped with countries of a different political entity. However, we have tried to follow current political boundaries, and adjustments were made in this index to reflect recent changes, especially in Africa.

Code numbers are assigned to the countries. An asterisk (*) rather than a numeral, preceding an entry, indicates that it is a cross reference.

Former names. In addition to the current designation used by the United States government for countries, former names are also listed because these were used at the time of the publication of the literature reference. For some areas several historical names may be included.

Supplementary list of inclusive titles. On the next page is a supplementary list used for coding arthropod distribution data on the cards. The list of "inclusive titles" is a special code (336-400) for use with Section "A", when information in the literature is not specific in indicating the locality from which the presence of a species has been reported.

"B" Section:

In most instances it has been possible to index the subdivisions of the countries. With a few exceptions, they are listed alphabetically. However, some later additions were necessary and these may not be in their proper alphabetical position. Former names for subdivisions may also appear, if these were used in the literature.

Supplementary list of arbitrary geographic subdivisions. On the second page after this is a supplementary list used for coding arthropod distribution on the cards. The list of "arbitrary geographic subdivisions" is a special code (80-99) for use with Section "B", when the information in the literature is not specific in indicating the locality.

Recommended atlases: To locate small areas, such as subdivisions of countries, the World Atlas by J. Paul Goode, published by Rand McNally and Company (1960) or The Times Atlas of the World, published at The Times office, London, and by Houghton Mifflin Company, Boston, in 5 volumes (1957), are very useful.

(The geographical area covered by the reference is indicated by Sections "A" and "B".) This Section may be left unpunched if range is not known.

"Months Activity" Stamp (See Figure 1e)

Where the information on seasonal activity is sufficiently specific in the reference, a stamp showing graphically the months of activity of the arthropod is placed on the punch card adjacent to Section "D".

The following symbols are used in the "Months Activity" stamp to show extent and degree of activity:

- Indicates presence, but only occasional activity
- Indicates continuous activity
- — Indicates a peak of activity
- ? (Placed at right end of stamp) indicates that the activity shown may be only part of the total activity period of the species, but that information about parts of the year other than those indicated is not given. In all such cases, number 70 is entered in Section "D".

"E" and "F" Sections

"E" and "F" Sections of the card: Disease organisms and disease vectors

These Sections are used to index information about diseases borne by, or involving arthropods and the disease vectors. The two Sections allow indexing of either: (1) two diseases (one coded in "E", the other coded in "F"), or (2) one disease (coded in "E") and some additional information about the relationship of the vector to that disease (coded in "F").

Numbers are assigned as follows:

- 1-5 General relationships of the arthropod to disease
- 6-69 Etiologic agents
- 70-79 Effects of arthropod on the vertebrate host
- 80-99 Type of evidence concerning disease transmission by the arthropod

"E" Section: This Section is never left blank. If the reference gives no information on disease, number 4 is punched. No other numbers with number 4 in the units are used: thus by needling for number 4 all references in which some information about disease is given may be separated. Any of the numbers from 1-99 may be punched in this Section, but numbers 80-99 are very rarely used in Section "E".

"F" Section: This Section may be left blank. Numbers 1-5 are very rarely used in this Section. Numbers 80-99, when applicable, are punched in "F".

If two diseases are indexed, the higher number is punched in "F" Section, the lower number in "E".

"G" and "H" Sections

"G" and "H" Sections of the card: Genus and Species (or Taxonomic Index)

These two Sections are used to index the genus and species respectively of the forms being considered.

More than one genus. If the reference mentions more than one genus or refers to the arthropods by a group name, Code I-2 in Section "I" should be used.

"G" Section: This Section is used to index alphabetically the genus referred to in the paper being indexed. If more than one genus is involved, or if there is no reference to a particular arthropod (i.e., only a group), this Section is left blank. The generic name is written in this Section of the card for ease of reference (see sample card, Figure 1e). A 299-subdivision alphabetical code is used to index the generic names.

"H" Section: This Section is used to index alphabetically the trivial name of the species, or to indicate that an arthropod group is indexed in Section "I".

If used to index a species, the trivial name indexed is written in this Section of the card (see sample card, Figure 1e) for ease of reference.

If the paper refers to more than one species, or if Section "G" has been left blank, "H" Section is also left blank.

If "H" Section is used to indicate that an arthropod group is indexed in Section "I", hole number 1 and the unnumbered hole below it are punched. The unnumbered hole (drop 1, units field) is never punched if a generic name has been entered in "G".

A 299-subdivision alphabetical code is used to index the species or trivial names.

Duplicate "species" cards. Duplicate cards are sometimes made for each species discussed in the reference if there is especially useful information about each one. For such references the abstract is usually placed on one card only, referred to as the "Master Card." The duplicate cards will then bear a cross reference note of the form "Master Card is Indexed as". Such duplicate cards are usually indexed by genus or species or arthropod group under which it is indexed taxonomically. If the master card may be more easily located by some other index numbers, the cross reference may be to a heading in some Section other than "G", "H", or "I".

"I" Section is assigned to the expansion of the coding of other Sections as follows:

Code "I-1," Breeding Habitat. Expands Section "L," subject matter.

Code "I-1" is used to index the breeding habitat of the arthropod as given in the reference. It can be used only when Section "G" is used for genus, and a number from 70-79 is entered in Section "L." "J," "K," "L" Sections

ARTHOPODS AND THEIR RELATIONS TO DISEASE ORGANISMS

Sections "J," "K," and "L" are used to index subject matter, with particular emphasis on the information applying directly to the arthropods and their relations to disease organisms.

"J" Section of the card. The special function of Section "J" is to separate easily all references having extended coverage of some phase of medical entomology, such as monographs, bibliographies, or distribution lists. For this purpose the numbers 1-9 are assigned to all references of a comprehensive type. All other references must be indexed in this Section by number 40, or numbers 50-99 inclusive. Thus, by needling 40, only the cards for comprehensive papers remain on the needle. The number 40 is used here if the subject matter cannot be broken down any further than that indicated in Section "K." The numbers 50-99 are used both here in "J" and in Section "L" to indicate the particular aspects of the subject about which the reference gives the most information.

Section "J" is never left blank.

"K" Section of the card. The special function of this Section is to separate the references into categories based on the general type of subject matter, such as genetics, taxonomy, etc. In part, these categories correspond to the major fields of biology. The numbers 10-49 have been assigned to these categories. In indexing this Section the most general of the headings which describes the content of the paper is given preference.

Section "K" is never left blank.

"L" Section of the card. As in Section "J," the numbers 50-99 are used in this Section to further cross-reference the subject matter. If the reference contains information on breeding habitat which is indexed in Section "I," then the most appropriate numbers between 70 and 99 must be used in Section "L."

If breeding habitat is not to be indexed in Section "I," the appropriate numbers 50-69 may be punched in Section "L." (See instructions for Code "I-1" in Section "I.")

Section "L" may be left blank.

In searching for references by subject matter coded in Sections "J," "K," and "L," instructions in the introduction to this report should be followed.
