FINAL REPORT OF MARROW DONOR RECRUITMENT OFFICE OF NAVAL RESEARCH GRANT NO: N00014-90-J-4097

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

A. Specific Aims

The goal of the National Marrow Donor Program (NMDP) in utilizing this Navy grant was to recruit and type at least 46,000 new unrelated potential marrow donors for inclusion in the National Marrow Donor Program's Registry. Specifically, it was anticipated that by use of these funds, at least 23,000 ethnic minorities would be added to the file; the file would experience rapid growth; and increasing numbers of completely HLA-AB,DR typed donors would be added to the Registry, thus making the donor search and transplant process more rapid and economical for all patients.

It was originally planned that all funds would be used for HLA typing and none for administrative purposes.

B. Original Budgeted Categories

From the beginning, it was the intention of Congress, the Navy Medical Research and Development Command, and the National Marrow Donor Program to utilize this grant funding as rapidly as possible. Progress of the grant spending was monitored by monthly evaluations of the recruitment activity. The original plan for recruitment was:

- 1) \$1,500,000 for HLA-AB typing Minority Donors to be used to type at least 23,000 volunteer donors.
- 2) \$1,500,000 for HLA-AB typing Random Donors
 - a. \$750,000 for Donor Center Quotas to be used to type at least 11,538 volunteer donors.
 - b. \$750,000 for Family Matching Funds to be used to type at least 24,000 volunteer donors.
- 3) \$1,500,000 for Retrospective HLA-DR typing to be used to type at least 15,700 volunteer donors selected via an algorithm developed by the NMDP Histocompatibility Committee based on frequency of HLA-AB types within the NMDP Registry.

Monthly monitoring quickly demonstrated very rapid utilization of the family matching funds and a slow start for minority typing and donor center quota typing. Retrospective HLA-DR typing, however, started later in the grant period and proceeded slower than expected. Reallocation of funds to accommodate the various levels of activity was requested and obtained several times from the Department of the Navy.

In the original plan, no funds for NMDP program administration were requested. As the file grew rapidly, the financial burden to support the growth necessitated requesting that \$500,000 be reallocated from tissue typing funds to support general Program needs. This request was granted by the Department of the Navy.

C. Actual Budgeted Categories

The following report describes the actual use of the grant funds which involved three main activities related to HLA typing. These are the final budgets resulting from requests approved for reallocation of funds into other grant categories based on need and growth of the file.

- 1) \$1,474,455 for HLA-AB typing Minority Donors
- 2) \$1,870,545 for HLA-AB typing Random Donors
 - a. \$670,000 for Donor Center Quotas
 - b. \$1,150,000 for Family Matching Funds
 - c. \$50,545 for Capitol Hill Testing
- 3) \$655,000 for Retrospective HLA-DR typing
- 4) \$500,000 for administrative costs

Though there was considerable redistribution of funds from the original planned expenditures, this report will demonstrate that the original recruitment goals were not only met, but exceeded in community and minority volunteer donor recruitment. Attachment 1 provides a summary of the categories of the grant spending including the readjusted budgeted dollar amounts, actual dollar amounts, budgeted number of tests and actual number of tests performed with grant funding.

II. RECRUITMENT PROCESS AND RESULTS BY CATEGORY

- A. \$1,474,455 for Minority Recruitment
 - 1) Nineteen Centers Implemented Minority Recruitment Proposals

Before receiving the funding in Fall 1990, the NMDP surveyed all of its participating Donor Centers to determine their interest or ability to undertake minority recruitment. Nineteen centers responded outlining active programs or plans for specific recruitment within their minority communities.

The minority recruitment efforts were targeted at four main minority groups: African American, Hispanic/Latino, Asian American and Native American. The reported number of minority donors recruited by the nineteen centers at the end of July was 16,619 (See Attachment 2). Attachment 3 provides the race breakdown for the minority donors recruited by the nineteen centers during the period of this grant, with the total number of donors recruited being 19,718. The difference between the total number of donors on Attachment 2 and Attachment 3 (3099 donors) is due to the fact that many of these nineteen donor centers continued minority recruitment, utilizing funds through the event funding request process described below.

2) Event Funding Request Forms Submitted by Any Donor Center

The available minority typing funds were spent slower than expected through the original nineteen centers. In addition, opportunities emerged in areas outside the nineteen Donor Centers' service areas.

In order to have flexibility to respond to minority recruitment opportunities anywhere in the country, in March, 1991, funding was made available to any donor center that submitted an event funding request form that was approved. Attachment 1 shows that the total number of minority donors recruited with Navy grant funding was 29,073. The volunteer donors recruited through the Donor Centers' submitted requests forms is the difference between 29,073 and 16,619, or 12,454.

B. \$1,870,545 for HLA-AB typing Random Donors

1) \$670,000 for Donor Center Quotas

At the time this grant was received, many of the existing Donor Centers had accumulated lists of individuals who wanted to be typed to become unrelated volunteer marrow donors, but who were unable to participate due to lack of funding to be tissue typed, or an inability to sign up through the existing mechanisms offered by a local Donor Center, such as joining a blood program. Waiting lists at some Donor Centers included several hundred names. It was thus anticipated that recruitment from these waiting lists could rapidly take place at most centers as soon as funds became available.

Each Donor Center received a "quota" allowing them to HLA-AB type up to 150 donors from among their waiting lists or through other local "grassroots" recruitment efforts. Eighty-one donor centers accessed this funding recruiting 10,706 donors as illustrated on Attachment 1.

2) \$1,150,000 for Family Matching Funds

The Program's history has demonstrated that as new potential bone marrow transplant patients are diagnosed, many families wish to initiate volunteer donor recruitment efforts from among their friends, neighbors and within their local communities. A portion of this grant was used to match funds patients and their families raised on behalf of donor recruitment. The goal of this grant money was to relieve part of the financial burden on the patient or family who, in addition, may be confronted with many other costs associated with an unrelated donor search and transplant.

The availability of family matching funds through this grant provided the greatest impetus for the tremendous growth of the file over the last year. This program was very successful and inspired mass community recruitment in areas of the country where it had not taken place before.

Matched funds were accessed through requests filled out by local Donor Centers. Grant funds were only used to match half of the actual cost of tissue typing, phlebotomy and shipping.

The original plan was to budget funds month by month. However, the volume of requests dictated reserving funds on a first-come-first served basis with a limit of \$25,000 per patient. A total of 123 families were assisted with the average grant per family being \$10,400. Each family worked directly with one or more of 45 Donor Centers to accomplish recruitment. Attachment 4 shows the total of 44,109 donors were recruited during the eight months of recruitment using these funds.

3) \$50,545 Capitol Hill Washington, D. C. Testing

In order to provide a very visible and public arena for the Program, two donor recruitment drives were held on Capitol Hill in September, 1990. The drives served as an official kick-off to the Navy grant funding. The total number of donors recruited from the two drives was 919.

C. \$655,000 for Retrospective HLA-DR typing

1) Selection of Volunteer Donors from the Registry

The Histocompatibility Committee developed a selection process to choose donors already HLA-A,B typed for HLA-DR typing from the Registry. The strategy was developed to increase the probability that the next patient who initiates a donor search will already have a compatible HLA-AB,DR typed donor at the time of the preliminary search, or fewer donors to HLA-DR type.

In the second week of January, 1991, Donor Centers received their list of donors to contact for HLA-DR typing. Progress in this area of the grant was slower than anticipated. In some cases, Donor Center coordinators felt potential donors were less likely to respond to a request for a HLA-DR sample draw when the request was not related to a specific patient's need. A total of 2,972 HLA-DR typings were performed.

2) Six Antigen Typing on Newly Recruited Minority Donors

All Donor Centers were notified that they could arrange full six antigen typing for newly recruited minority donors. Whenever it proved logistically possible and the contract laboratory assigned for the drive could handle the additional samples, HLA-DR typing was scheduled for minority volunteer donors. A total of 4,718 HLA-DR typings were performed on minority volunteer donors at the same time as the HLA-AB testing, as noted in the actual number of tests for HLA-DR typing of minorities on Attachment 1.

D. \$500,000 for Administrative Expenses

With approval from the granting agency, funds were used for administrative expenses that developed during the course of recruitment with this grant. In terms of public education, funds were used for a public service announcement and for reprinting the main recruitment brochure.

Related to typing activities, funds were used to support the \$5.00 per donor recruitment fee billed by donor centers and recruitment groups. In addition, funds were used in conjunction with the retrospective HLA-DR typing funds to support repeat HLA-AB testing whenever donors had unsplit antigens at either the A or B locus. Table 2 shows the specific items and charges to this category of the grant.

III. REGISTRY ACTIVITY AND STATUS

The increase in donor recruitment activity contributed to an increase in overall Registry activity. Table 2 below provides a comparison from the beginning of the grant period to the end of the grant period.

Attachment 5 also demonstrates a month-by-month increase in Registry Activity over time.

Specifically, the number of preliminary and formal searches by month are included in Attachment 5.

IV. SUMMARY

This grant provided the first federal funds available for tissue typing of the general public. The early history of this Program was marked with limited donor recruitment because of available funding, not available volunteers. Many Donor Centers were able to recruit tissue typed volunteers only through their blood programs. Donor Centers had substantial waiting lists of volunteers willing to be typed, but no available funding. Lack of funding was a monumental barrier to successful minority donor recruitment, even though the Program realized the importance of having an ethnically diverse file to better serve patients. In addition, families were faced with the often overwhelming task of raising all the funds necessary to sponsor a community donor recruitment drive.

The funding through this grant allowed NMDP to recruit donors from the general population and from specific targeted minority groups, to assist families, and to add to the number of complete HLA-AB,DR typed donors in the file. Several of the most significant accomplishments during the grant period include the following:

- The file increased in size by over 213,000 donors, with nearly 85,000 donors tested through the aid of the grant funding.
- The percentage of minority donors increased by 7.7% from 5.7% of the total file being minority donors in September 1990, to 13.4% in September, 1991.
- Though less quantifiable, many Donor Centers developed considerable expertise in minority and community recruitment.

- The awareness building took myriad forms and included significant press coverage in targeted areas and individual donor center and recruitment group related activities. The Program benefited from increased public awareness regarding the need for unrelated marrow donors.
- The recruitment activities set in motion through this \$4.5 million dollar grant will be sustained as the National Marrow Donor Program utilizes the \$6.5 million dollar grant from the Department of the Navy made available in August, 1991.
