Preface

This organization guide is the second in a series of six Training and Doctrine Command Pamphlets that documents the capabilities-based OPFOR model. The capabilities-based OPFOR model will become the basis for the forces and doctrine used by the OPFOR units at the Combat Training Centers (CTC) and in the TRADOC Common Teaching Scenario.

The proponent for this pamphlet is the TRADOC Deputy Chief of Staff for Intelligence. This pamphlet serves as the coordinating draft for the guide's final publication as a Department of the Army Information Pamphlet. Introduction

Concept

This Organization Guide is one of a series of six Training and Doctrine Command Pamphlets that document the capabilities-based Opposing Force (OPFOR) model. This model was developed to provide a flexible training threat that can be tailored to represent a wide range of potential threat capabilities and organizations. The model features a heavy and a light OPFOR package, each containing three documents: an organization guide, an operations handbook and a tactics handbook.

The capabilities-based OPFOR model represents a break from past practice in two principal respects. First, while the heavy and light packages are based on the doctrine and organization of foreign armies, they are not simply unclassified handbooks on the forces of a particular nation. The OPFOR packages are composites that were deliberately constructed to provide a wide range of capabilities. Second, the packages are not associated with a fixed order of battle but, rather, provide the building blocks from which a large number of potential orders of battle can be derived.

The capabilities-based OPFOR model will become the basis for the forces and doctrine used by the OPFOR units at the Combat Training Centers (CTC) and in the TRADOC Common Teaching Scenarios. The heavy and light packages were designed to accommodate the existing CTC OPFORs at the time of publication with relatively minor changes but have the flexibility to adapt to the changing training requirements of the force-projection Army.

Light OPFOR Package

The Light OPFOR is based on the military forces of a number of third-world countries. Although influenced by the forces of the Former Soviet Union (FSU), it is clearly unique. A certain degree of extrapolation is required since doctrine for most of these countries is so poorly documented. Since this is OPFOR doctrine, and therefore not tied dogmatically to a single source country, the doctrine can be more fully articulated than in the past. Organizationally, the Light OPFOR takes a "building block" approach, which provides a great deal of flexibility.

Light OPFOR Organization Guide

The Light OPFOR Organization Guide is the first of the Light OPFOR series of handbooks. Unlike previous OPFOR publications which provided a fixed structure, this guide provides the customer with an organizational menu from which to draw the forces needed to fulfill his training requirements. For principal customers, such as the CTCs and the TRADOC Centers and Schools, this is a collaborative process. For the concept to work successfully, both the Threat Support Division (TSD) and the individual customer must work together to tailor the most appropriate force structure and order of battle for

the training required. TSD is solely responsible for production of the guide; however, order of battle development is a joint responsibility between TSD and the user. This joint effort is expected between TSD and TRADOC trainers and instructors; however, CAC Threats stands ready to provide assistance to all customers in building their training products.

Equipment

Former Soviet systems provide the equipment baseline for the guide. This was done for two primary reasons. First, many potential threat countries are equipped predominantly with FSU systems, which are widely proliferated throughout the world. Second, the equipment listed within the organizations is intended to be representative of a unit's or organization's capability. Listing these familiar, well-documented systems paints an immediate, concrete picture, whereas listing generic descriptors such as Medium Tank or Antitank Guided Missile would not. Moreover, generic descriptors would not lead to the development of consistent equipment sets.

To achieve specific training objectives or merely to provide variety within the organizations, "gray" systems can be substituted for those within the equipment lists. Appendix A contains several substitution matrices for major systems, as well as general guidelines for the substitution process. The matrices are guides; they are not intended to be all-inclusive, listing every conceivable system. In constructing an order of battle, therefore, trainers may substitute systems not listed in the matrices. However, they should follow the same general philosophy and guidelines detailed in Appendix A. System substitution is another aspect covered during the joint order of battle development process.

Structure

The Light OPFOR Organization Guide depicts the forces of a country divided geographically into an unspecified number of military regions, each with a number of subordinate military districts. Most combat forces are stationed within the military districts, which can vary widely in their strengths and capabilities.

District strength could range from a single separate light infantry brigade to a mechanized infantry division. Well-equipped districts equate roughly to divisions, whereas a well-equipped region would equate roughly to an army. The guide allows for standing armies and divisions, but districts with separate brigades would be much more common and in keeping with the spirit of the Light OPFOR concept. If a trainer finds himself building multiple standing divisions and armies, it may be that the Heavy OPFOR Organization Guide better suits his training needs.

Subordinate to the Ministry of Defense, all arms of the armed forces are controlled by the General Staff/National Headquarters, which also controls the highly-centralized pool of national assets. These assets include a wide variety of combat support and combat

service support units which may be allocated to subordinate regions and districts, or held at the national level. Like the military regions and districts, most of these assets are not limited to a specific number. Their inclusion in this guide merely provides the option for, but does not mandate, their inclusion in any developed order of battle. From the single brigade within a district to the potentially vast pool of assets at the national level, the size of the force needed to facilitate training is the determining factor in sizing the OPFOR.

For example, if a training scenario called for an OPFOR force roughly equivalent to a division, Region A could have three subordinate districts, all of which border an international boundary with a traditional enemy. The northernmost and southernmost districts, predominantly mountainous, could contain one or two separate light infantry brigades, with a relatively small amount of organic combat support and combat service support at the district level. The central district, however, is predominantly rolling terrain and contains the best mechanized avenue of approach into the interior of the country. This district, therefore, could have two separate mechanized infantry brigades and one tank brigade; additional combat support and combat service support could either be organic at the district level, or allocated to the region by the General Staff/National Headquarters as hostilities increase.

Presentation of Information


The organization charts in this guide focus on maneuver units. They range from the lowest level (infantry and tank squad) up to the highest level (General Staff/National Headquarters). At each level, the guide breaks down subordinate combat support and combat service support units and subunits whenever feasible, for greater detail. To avoid extensive duplication, subunits common to several unit types are depicted once and cross-referenced thereafter. Subunits defined in greater detail have a page reference underneath their box in the organization chart; subunits with no page reference are not further defined. As a rule, equipment listings only account for individual weapons up to and including the maneuver battalion. Unless organic to the battalion, individual weapon totals for combat support and combat service support units are not listed.

The guide begins with the structure of military districts and divisions. Then the guide addresses the variety of maneuver brigades: light infantry, motorized infantry, mechanized infantry, and tank. Infantry brigades are subdivided into separate and divisional brigades. Separate brigades are those subordinate only to the district headquarters; they may operate independently, or in concert with other brigades within the district. A divisional brigade is organic to a standing division and always operates as part of the division. The guide then addresses the army and region structure, followed by the national structure and possible organizations within the pool of assets controlled by the General Staff/National Headquarters. The final set of charts addresses the Air Force, Navy, and Special Operations Command.






- 1. Forces subordinate to the district can vary widely, as shown in the two examples above. Unless the district contains a standing division, maneuver forces will be composed of separate brigades. A basically rural, mountainous district with no major population centers, for example, may have only a single separate light infantry brigade, with little or no additional combat support and combat service support. A district astraddle a major avenue of approach and which contains several major population/industrial centers, however, may contain the degree of forces in the first example, which is the "high end" of what a district may contain.
- 2. Districts may have separate brigades controlled by the district commander, which is the norm, or they may have standing divisions. Standing divisions could be found in districts along an international border, districts which contain historically-threatened avenues of approach, or around critical cities/facilities. Any district participating (as a whole) in large-scale offensive operations would form a division headquarters, or its equivalent.
- 3. The predominant type of brigade(s) in the district will determine whether supporting assets will be towed or self-propelled.

NOTES:

- 1. Infantry units within the divisions depicted above are light, motorized, or mechanized infantry brigades (divisional). These brigades differ structurally from their separate counterparts found within districts.
- 2. Normally, each division has three infantry brigades of the same type. Light and motorized infantry divisions may have a Tank Battalion; however, this is the exception to the rule.
- 3. Light and motorized infantry divisions are more common than mechanized infantry divisions.
- 4. When a division mobilizes, additional combat support and combat service support assets come from the pool of assets at the national level. Engineer and signal assets are notable examples.


Light Infantry Brigade (Militia)



- 1. Districts, depending on their population/population centers, may or may not be able to constitute a brigade-sized militia force; many districts will have, at most, a battalion. These forces may or may not act as an integrated force. Regardless of militia size, every village, farm cooperative, or factory has a militia formation, manned in wartime by the workers and peasants, over-age reservists, medically-retired soldiers, women, and young men not yet old enough for military service. The militia conducts point defense of its own villages and towns, air ambushes, and performs reconnaissance and small raids in support of the overall national resistance to invaders. They could receive additional combat support and combat service support assets from the district, but this would be extremely rare.
- 2. Although included in the above referenced light infantry battalion totals, militia forces will not have night vision sights or goggles.


NOTE: Most tank brigades are composed of the standard 22-tank battalion. However, in the Capital Defense Force, the tendency is toward 31-tank battalions with more modern equipment. These may be singular battalions, or within the brigade structure.



- 1. The General Staff/National Headquarters, subordinate to the Ministry of Defense, controls the armed forces. The ground component of the armed forces is the largest.
- 2. Most maneuver units are contained in military districts, which are subordinate to regions. These units, along with the pool of national assets depicted at the bottom of the chart, comprise the bulk of the ground component of the armed forces.
- 2. Since the number of regions, subordinate districts, and number of maneuver units is variable, the size of the Air Force, Air Defense Command, Navy, and the number and type of combat support and combat service support units at the national level varies, as well.




- 1. The number of civil defense brigades is not fixed. As a rule, they are separate light or motorized infantry brigades; they may be augmented by engineer assets, which they would receive from the General Staff/National Headquarters. Normal missions include emergency engineering, rescue, and similar disaster relief functions.
- 2. Structures for the Directorates of State Security and General Police are not depicted.
- 3. Guerrilla forces are controlled by the Ministry of the Interior, from whom they receive political guidance; their structure, which mirrors that of militia forces within the districts, is depicted on page 108.




- 1. There is no set number of military regions, or how many districts should be subordinate to each. At a minimum, the country should have at least two regions, each with two subordinate districts. Three regions, each with three subordinate districts, is the norm.
- 2. Region headquarters are joint commands, whether or not the region has a standing army. This is the integration point for ground, air, naval, and special operations forces.
- 3. Unless the region has a standing army and/or districts with standing divisions, the region does not have all the combat support and combat service support assets which will be required in wartime. Even then, standing forces may have additional assets allocated to them. Depending on the region's mission, it may receive few of the assets listed above (primarily defensive missions) or a full complement (large-scale offensive operations). All of this type support would come from the national pool of assets controlled by the General Staff/National Headquarters, which allocates resources based on the missions of subordinate regions and/or their subordinate districts. In the above example, all forces other than those contained within subordinate districts were allocated to the region by the General Staff/National Headquarters.
- 4. In primarily defense operations, region headquarters can exercise control over subordinate district's forces without the formation of an additional tactical headquarters. Likewise, district headquarters can exercise control over subordinate brigades and other organic assets without an

- additional tactical headquarters. Large-scale extraterritorial offensive operations, however, require one at both echelons.
- 5. The region may: have a standing army headquarters, with standing divisions in each/some of the subordinate districts; develop an army headquarters during the transition to war, mobilizing divisions in some/all subordinate districts; or, if districts have the sufficient forces organic to them, receive combat support and combat service support assets from the General Staff/National Headquarters, and develop army and division-level tactical headquarters solely for the purpose of controlling large-scale offensive operations. In any scenario, the country will only be capable of fielding one such army-level command, with no more than three subordinate division-level commands. In some scenarios, fielding this size force may mean pulling separate maneuver brigades from another region's districts.



- 1. This is the standard army structure, whether standing (during peacetime) or developed during wartime mobilization.
- 2. The army should be composed of a mix of infantry divisions, not to exceed four; three is the standard. Combat support assets can be towed or self-propelled, depending on the mix of light/motorized or mechanized divisions which they support.
- 3. Standing armies are the exception, rather than the rule.



1. Centralization of assets at the national level allows the country to tailor support to subordinate regions based on specific missions and the perceived threat.



- 2. With the exception of the Capital Defense Forces, which have a very specific mission (as a strategic reserve), the national level assets depicted above provide a ready pool of forces which enable regions to form army-level forces capable of conducting large-scale offensive operations. Regions are the primary recipients of these assets; they may remain under region control, or may be further allocated to subordinate districts, depending on the mission and the forces already stationed in the district.
- 3. Capital Defense Forces are typically the best-equipped in the country, and could be composed of a single division, a division augmented by other forces, such as MP or engineer units, or by separate brigades. Separate brigades would be augmented by the requisite artillery, engineer, air defense, and service support assets. An example structure could include: two separate tank and/or mechanized infantry brigades, an artillery regiment/brigade, a commando battalion, an air defense regiment, an engineer brigade, an MP brigade/battalion (light infantry), and a materiel support battalion. The structure of the Capital Defense Forces is not illustrated further in this guide.
- 4. Of the forces depicted above, only the airborne brigade and Directorate of Military Intelligence are limited in number (one).
- 4. Rear Services is not a fixed structure, but rather a loose grouping of materiel support and maintenance battalions and brigades; they may be allocated to subordinate regions, or may remain centralized under General Staff control.



- 1. Should airborne forces require more traditional combat service support, such as wheeled transportation for infantry, these assets are provided through Rear Services.
- 2. Night observation device totals include only those within the airborne infantry battalions.
- 3. The air defense battery, if present, consists of three platoons similarly equipped to those subordinate to the airborne infantry battalion.
- 4. Equipment totals for the brigade headquarters and subordinate battalion headquarters reflect only the totals for the command element.
- 5. Individual weapons for personnel are counted only at the battalion and below.


- 1. The above chart represents the portion of directorate assets which are allocated to subordinate forces in time of war. It is not intended to represent or define the intricate relationships between different national level intelligence structures and agencies.
- 2. The directorate has one Operations Battalion; however, the number of radio reconnaissance battalions and reconnaissance and radioelectronic combat battalions is not fixed.
- 3. The exact structure and number of subordinate units within the Operations Battalion is unknown. However, its functions include special information (propaganda), counterintelligence (both overt and covert collection), and interrogation. Elements from each of these disciplines are tailored into platoon and company-sized teams, which are then allocated to regions and districts based on their specific needs.
- 4. Radio reconnaissance battalions are normally retained under the control of the General Staff; however, they may be allocated to the regions.
- 5. Reconnaissance and radioelectronic combat battalions are identical to those organic to districts, standing divisions, and standing armies. These battalions are allocated to regions and their subordinate districts during mobilization for war (particularly to those preparing for division or army level offensive operations).

FOOTNOTE: * Some reconnaissance and radioelectronic combat battalions are now called reconnaissance and electronic warfare battalions. The REC company in these battalions, therefore, is now called the electronic warfare (EW) company.

Radio Reconnaissance Battalion, Directorate of Military Intelligence (National)



- 1. This battalion is also known as a radio and radar intercept and direction-finding battalion or as a radiotechnical reconnaissance battalion.
- 2. Exact composition and equipment strengths vary, however, equipment types are basically of the tactical support variety as shown in the reconnaissance and radioelectronic combat Battalions.
- 3. These battalions may be allocated as a whole to support a region or army, or individual companies may be allocated to support specific district or region operations. The latter case is more probable when the echelon requesting support has sufficient ground reconnaissance assets, but lacks the radioelectronic capabilities of the recon and REC battalion.

- 3. The upper line of the organization chart represents the baseline, even for a "brown water" force. More capable navies would include organizations on the lower line.




- 1. Air Force size and composition is dependent on both the size of the ground forces to be supported and the number and types of required specialized missions, such as support to airborne and special operations forces.

APPENDIX A: EQUIPMENT SUBSTITUTION MATRICES

The matrices contained in this appendix illustrate some of the different equipment options available to scenario and order of battle developers. Although FSU systems are used throughout this organization guide, the intent of the capabilities-based OPFOR is to allow users to tailor their orders of battle by substituting other foreign systems. Deviations from the baseline systems should be tied to specific training objectives. Examples include attempting to mirror the actual mix of equipment found in a particular region or to introduce a particular weapons capability or vulnerability.

The matrices list most of the major baseline systems contained in the organization guide and provide a number of potential substitutes for each. While the lists of substitutes are not all inclusive they contain most common "gray" systems that have roughly comparable capabilities.

Users substituting systems from the matrices or considering other foreign weapons systems for use in an OPFOR order of battle should evaluate candidate substitutes against the following criteria:

- Is the system available to potential adversaries? This criteria would be satisfied if the system was in service with the armed forces of countries traditionally hostile to the United States or if it were widely exported on the world market.
- Has the system been produced in large enough quantities to justify training against it? At a minimum, total system production should at least equal the numbers contained in a proposed order of battle. Moreover, developmental systems that have not reached initial operational capability (IOC) should not be played.
- Does the mix and variety of systems in an order of battle conform to some logical pattern? Some users constructing a large order of battle may want to pattern the mix of system types and generations on some actual country. Others may wish to standardize systems throughout the order of battle for simplicity or ease in modeling. In any case, systems should be portrayed in unit sets generally of regimental or battalion size. Considering the logistical and training challenges involved in supporting a weapon system, excessive variety should be avoided.

APPENDIX B: Cargo Truck, Trailer and Radio Substitution

Generic terminology has been used throughout the handbook to indicate truck and trailer capacity and radio capabilities. The following list, based on FSU equipment, provides a definition of terms. However, the reader may substitute any piece of equipment which falls within the range of capabilities for each system.

TRUCKS AND TRAILERS:

Utility Truck -- 4 x 4 drive vehicle with a 500 to 600 kg carrying capacity. Examples include the GAZ-69 (FSU) and the UAZ-469 (FSU), Land Rover Defender 130 (UK), and the IMR A-0.75 (YO).

Light Truck -- 4 x 4 drive vehicle with a 1 to 2.5 mt carrying capacity. Examples include the GAZ-66 (FSU), GAZ-3301 (FSU), TAM 110 T7 BV (YO) and the Renault TRM 2000 (FR).

Medium Truck -- 6 x 6 drive vehicle with a 2.5 to 7 mt carrying capacity. Examples include the ZIL-131/132 and the ZIL-157.

Heavy Truck -- 6 x 6 drive vehicle with a 7.5 mt or greater carrying capacity. Examples include the KrAZ-255B (FSU), KrAZ-260 (FSU), IVECO Magirus 160-23 ANWM (GM) or the AWD Bedford TM (UK).

Cargo Trailer, 1-Axle -- has a 0.5 mt carrying capacity. Examples include the GAZ-704 trailer used with the UAZ-469 (FSU), UAZ-8190 used with the UAZ-3151(FSU) and the GKN Defence 1t Special Purpose (UK).

Cargo Trailer, 2-Axle -- has a 3.0 to 4.0 mt carrying capacity. Examples include the IAPZ-759V trailer used with the URAL-375D(FSU) and the 782V trailer used with the URAL-4320(FSU) and the M104 Series (US).

RADIOS:

HF, Manpack, Low-Power -- An example is the R-104M, a transceiver operating in the 1.5 to 4.25 MHz frequency range with a 30 to 50 km range.

HF, Vehicle Mount, Medium-Power -- An example is the R-130, a transceiver/receiver operating in the 1.5 to 10.99 frequency range with a 50 to 70 km range.

VHF, Portable, Low-Power -- An example is the R-148, a transceiver operating in the 37.0 to 51.95 frequency range with range of 5 km.

VHF, Manpack, Low-Power -- An example is the R-107, a transceiver operating in the 20 to 52 MHz frequency range with a 6 to 25 km range.

VHF, Vehicle Mount, Medium-Power -- An example is the R-123, a transceiver operating in the 20 to 51.5 MHz frequency range with a 20 to 50 km range.

Warning Receiver -- An example is the R-311, a receiver operating in the 1 to 15 MHz band.

Radio Relay -- An example is the R-401, a VHF/FM transceiver operating in the 60 to 70 MHz band with a range of 40 to 50 km.
