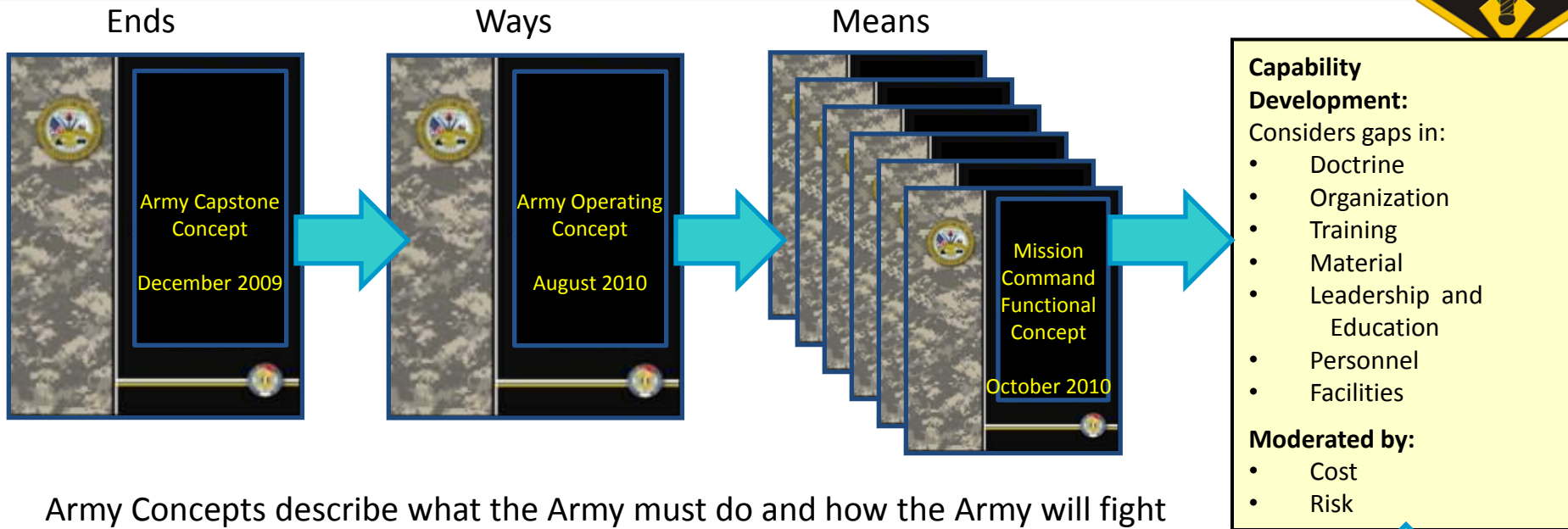

# Concept Process and Framework



- Army Concepts describe what the Army must do and how the Army will fight in the future (10-20 years out)
- Concepts are nested with strategic guidance from DOD and DA
- The Army determines its required capabilities starting with concepts
- The Army organizes its concepts through warfighting functions:
  - Mission Command
  - Intelligence
  - Movement and Maneuver
  - Fires
  - Protection
  - Sustainment
- Additional concepts address Learning, Training, Building Partner Capacity, and the Human Dimension

# Future Operational Environment



- The US will be confronted by a wide range of threats in the future
- Future adversaries will:
  - ❖ Possess advanced technologies
  - ❖ Be globally networked
  - ❖ Well resourced and resilient
  - ❖ Will work in collusion with one another
- Future conflicts will be complex and unpredictable:
  - ❖ Expect to confront multiple adversaries simultaneously
  - ❖ Future adversaries will operate amongst neutral and friendly parties
  - ❖ Homeland may become a front in future conflicts



**We can expect to be confronted by the range of threats and malicious actors simultaneously in future JOAs.**

**As experienced today, most Threats and Malicious Actors are globally networked and extending their influence and reach across the global; no longer confined by borders**

# Protection Warfighting Function



- Protection is a warfighting function which allows commanders to preserve vital assets, forces, partners, and civilian populations.
- Current concept strikes balance between supporting maneuver warfare and stability operations
- Identify, Prevent and Mitigate
  - ❖ Identify: Detect and Assess
  - ❖ Prevent: Warn, Defend and Defeat
  - ❖ Mitigate: Respond and Recover
- For next concept revision, examining adding Recover to Lexicon
- To be effective, Protection measures must be:
  - ❖ Comprehensive: Account for all types of hazards and threats unique to environment
  - ❖ Redundant: Each measure should be complimented by at least one other as a fail safe
  - ❖ Layered: Protection is most effective and strongest if in depth
  - ❖ Integrated: Achieve synergy with complimentary and reinforcing protection capabilities
  - ❖ Enduring: Constantly assessing and adjusting protection measures; on-going process
- Protection capabilities must be adaptable and versatile



# Army Doctrine and Army Doctrine Reference Publications 3-37, *Protection*



## Protection

The preservation of the effectiveness and survivability of mission-related military and nonmilitary personnel, equipment, facilities, information, and infrastructure deployed or located within or outside the boundaries of a given operational area.

The related tasks and systems that preserve the force so the commander can apply maximum combat power to accomplish the mission.

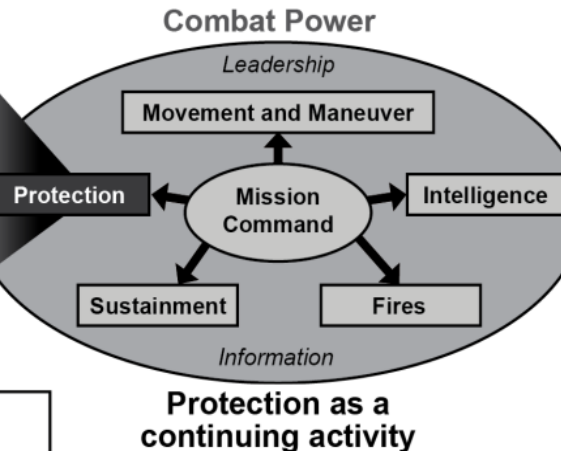

### Principles

Comprehensive  
Integrated

Enduring

- Fully integrated the Protection Framework within the operations process.
- Aligned the protection definition with JP 3-0.
- Replaced the protection principle of “**full dimension**” with “**comprehensive**.”
- Added **Implement Operational Security** to the Protection WFF.
- Added **Law and Order task** from Mission Command WFF to the Protection WFF.
- Added **Implement physical security procedures** to the Protection WFF.
- Moved **internment and resettlement** task from Sustainment WFF to the Protection WFF.
- Moved **Information protection** task from Protection WFF to the Mission Command WFF.
- ADRP expands the protection foundation discussion that is laid out in the ADP:
  - Chapter 1 – Protection Framework
  - Chapter 2 – Protection Planning
  - Chapter 3 – Protection in Preparation
  - Chapter 4 – Protection in Execution
  - Chapter 5 – Assessing Protection



# Base Camps



- MSCoE led development of Base Camp Concept and Capabilities Based Assessment for TRADOC and DA from 2008-2011
- Concept described requirement to plan, build, operate, manage, sustain, and close Base Camps in more efficient and cost effective means
- Capabilities Base Assessment identified over numerous gaps in Policy, Doctrine, Organization, Training, Materiel, Leader Development and Facilities
- MSCoE recommended following solutions to Joint Staff and Army Staff for resourcing:
  - Policy
  - Engineering
  - Sustainment
  - Management
